## Everyday Stewardship Give Yourself Completely


The early days of the first Christian community were not easy by any measurement. Jesus had been executed, and his disciples had to be discreet so as not to meet a similar fate. Jesus was now risen, but the truth of his resurrection was not accepted by all. However, the depiction of that early community in Acts 2:42-47 would lead someone to believe it was the opposite situation. We are told of community life where people lean on each other and share great joy. They were disciples living out their faith, and it was their strong sense of stewardship that made all this possible in the face of threatening Roman and Jewish powers.

Today, we find the Church in a new turmoil. Increasing secularism, abuse scandals, and a lack of true fidelity place us once again in a time that is not easy. We create our burdens by not using our gifts wisely and by turning inward selfishly.

Could we use the story in Acts of the early Church to help us today? If we begin with the decision to give of ourselves completely to God and His people, will we become agents of change? There is only one way to find out.



# **Homily**

# **Pastor's Homily: Divine Mercy Sunday**

"Peace be with you!" Jesus appears to the Eleven in the Upper Room and gives them this greeting. In Hebrew the word for peace is *Shalom*. "Shalom be with you."

The Apostles are gathered in this sanctuary of peace where the gift of peace rested upon them on Holy Thursday from the source of all peace, Jesus Prince of Peace.

John tells us why the doors were locked. Fear and anxiety fill the hearts of the Apostles. They are faced with their own suffering and death that may result if they "step into the light" and are identified as followers of Jesus.

Peace is more than the absence of conflict or the kind negotiated by peace treaties and terms. No, this kind of peace goes much deeper. This kind of peace can only come from Christ. As much peace as "shelter in place" behavior and creative homemade masks can provide, they fall short of the peace we all seek from Christ, the Divine Physician and deliverer from COV-ID 19.

The fear of suffering and death created by the Virus has reached fever pitch around the world and draws closer and closer to home each passing day. The worst part is the great unknown as to what is going to happen and to whom.

No one can deny the reality of death associated with the pandemic. It is impossible to silence it. It seems we are unable to dispel the fears associated with it. We cling on to our faith in troubled times. We are guided above all by the light and hope that shines forth from Christ who was victorious over sin and death.

"Do not be afraid!" That was the central message of the Risen Jesus. When Christ says "Peace be with you", he is in effect calming the fears of the Apostles. What he means is that perfect love casts out fear. (1 John 1:4:18) His Resurrection is the definitive proof that goodness how shown itself stronger than evil.

Therefore Christ can say, "Do not be afraid!" "Peace be with you!" He repeats these words to every person, family and nation burdened physically, by grief and mourning, mentally, and spiritually by the Coronavirus.

On this Divine Mercy Sunday we implore God's mercy upon a troubled world. We know God did not create the Virus. We know the Lord is good. We believe his mercy endures forever. Shalom, Peace be with you!



# Pope Francis has granted the gift of special Indulgences to the faithful in the current pandemic.

This includes those suffering from the coronavirus illness, those quarantined, health care workers, family members and others caring for those with coronavirus (exposing themselves to the risk of contagion). Do at least one: Mass through social media, Rosary, Way of the Cross (or other forms of devotion and ALL of the following as soon as possible (Confession, Eucharistic Communion and prayer for the Pope's intentions. The faithful not suffering from the coronavirus can also receive the Indulgence by following the conditions mentioned above and do at least one of the following: Visit the Blessed Sacrament, read Holy Scripture for at least half an hour, Rosary, Way of the Cross, Chaplet of Divine Mercy.
