## FROM THE RABBI.....

Shalom Haverim,

It's probably no surprise to any of you reading this that we are quickly approaching our New Year holidays: Rosh Hashana, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, and Sh'mini Atzeret/Simchat Torah. If there is anything different about this year, it would have to be how late the holidays are beginning. This, of course is due to the extra month of 5776, a leap year.

Perhaps this "extra time" can be thought of as an additional opportunity to prepare ourselves for 5777. What do I mean by this? You see there are two distinctly different conceptions of time itself. For many people and cultures time was thought of cyclical – that things never change over time. We just keep repeating what we do over and over, year after year. For the Jews time was cyclical, but it was also moving in a linear direction into the future at the same time.

The Jewish people thought this way because we believed in the possibility of change. We believed that we could affect our destiny by our taking responsibility for our own behavior. We are not predestined to repeat our mistakes; we make our life-choices.

So while time seems cyclical in that every year the seasons repeat, there is always life and death, there is always the same work to be done. However, we believe that we can change, improve, cast off bad habits, and think in more constructive ways. The future can be an improvement over the past. This is the blessing of being human, but it is up to us to create our futures.

One of the ways we do this as Jews is to begin the process of "teshuva", "repentance," during these days before Rosh Hashana and continuing through Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement.

This is especially relevant this year at Temple Bnai Emet. For over 7 years we were in an ongoing contract with Grace Baptist Church to sell our property to them with the right to remain and continue to use the sanctuary, chapel, office, kitchen etc. Over the summer, the church let us know that they would not be able to complete the purchase. Therefore, we are retaking ownership of the property.

This is certainly welcome news on the one hand, but also presents us with the challenge to preserve the building and facilities with a reduced number of members. We do have to be thankful to many people for helping us thrive over the last 7+ years.

## FROM THE RABBI CONT.....

First, we want to thank our dedicated board of directors who managed the ongoing sale of the building and our relationship with the church through this period. Special thanks go to Sandy and Jon Olesen who while not officially “board presidents,” were instrumental in board leadership and work during this period. At this time, Lou Danoff has taken over much of their work, and is doing a fine job. We thank him for stepping up. In fact, our whole board seems to be re-energized to work on behalf of the Bnai Emet community.

Shortly after the High Holidays, I will complete the 24<sup>th</sup> year of my service at Bnai Emet. It has been an honor to serve, and yet, I believe that only with everyone’s support will we be able to continue to have a true Jewish community here in what was once one of the true centers of Judaism in Southern California. We are prepared to welcome new young Jewish families looking for an affordable place to live with a synagogue close by.

We have a core of members who truly want to preserve a vibrant, “learning” Jewish community. Won’t you join with us and support this important endeavor.

I wish you a very Happy New Year, and look forward to seeing you in shul.

## FROM YOUR BOARD

Last Clarion we informed everyone that Grace Baptist Church defaulted on their promissory note. In the meantime they abandoned the building and it has taken us two months to get our property back. We now own the temple again and are faced with a similar situation that we faced in 2009. Our income does not cover our expenses. We are going to be working on a solution over the next few months. We will continue to keep functioning as your temple with all services provided as usual. We are looking for ideas as to how to accomplish this for the long term. If we are unable to continue maintaining the building and providing all services as usual we may have to consider another sale/lease proposition or downsizing to another smaller location in Montebello. Our preference and goal is to stay in the building. Either way, our goal is to continue as a temple that provides services for our congregation.

We are open to ideas from our congregation on how we can move successfully forward. We are asking for anyone who can provide legal or financial expertise, should we need to enter into a contract with a buyer, to assist us by contacting the board and letting us know you are willing to help.

As time goes on we will keep you updated on our situation. We are in no danger of closing as we were able to build up a cash reserve after the last sale/lease arrangement. Unfortunately it is not enough to continue forever without a sound plan for the future.

Summer is over and time to begin thinking about the High Holidays. As previously mentioned our expenses are now larger than ever and your help is needed. We ask you to pay your dues, and think of our situation when you pay for your seats, high holiday greetings, aliyas and of course your pledges.

We want to invite all who attend Rosh Hashana services to join us for a kosher luncheon immediately after the service. This is a nice time to visit with family and your temple friends.

We look forward to seeing you during the High Holidays.
