pdating the tired look of a kitchen and sunken family room, Sujaya Reddy transformed a compartmentalized floor plan into an open, free-flowing space offering additional storage. Reddy removed an existing bannister and installed cabinets between two sets of stairs. The modified dining room steps that lead to the living room and foyer now run the length of the opening, creating a dual-purpose space that also functions as a yoga studio.

In the kitchen, tumbled marble flooring and contemporary white cabinetry contrasted with black granite countertops create a crisp look, while honey-colored wood flooring and custom stair rails warm the adjoining areas. The kitchen also features recessed LED lighting and under-cabinet task lighting, along with a pair of chrome globe chandeliers above the dining peninsula.
