History

Since October 1988, the East Texas Food Bank, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, has provided food to over 200 partner agencies and food programs, in an effort to feed children, the working poor and seniors throughout 26 counties in East Texas. A member of Feeding America, The East Texas Food Bank is one of four food banks that serves the Gulf Coast Region who are pre-staged with food products from Feeding America, to respond to disasters.

Our food sources include a variety of national, regional and local food manufacturers, brokers, wholesalers, and retailers donate food to the East Texas Food Bank. Donated food includes overproduced or discontinued items, frozen foods, dairy products, mislabeled goods, dented cans, dayold breads and pastries, and odd-sized produce. Local farmers and gardeners provide fresh produce. Individuals, businesses and community organizations support the East Texas Food Bank through various canned food drives throughout the year.

Facts

Our Mission of the East Texas Food Bank is to fight hunger and feed hope in East Texas.

Our vision is a hunger-free East Texas.

By The Numbers

•24,650,000 – Meals provided to hungry East Texans in FY2020.

•7th – Texas ranks fifth in child food insecurity rate, according to the Feeding America Map The Meal Gap study

•1st – Texas ranks first in the number of children who are food insecure, according to the Feeding America Map The Meal Gap study

•26 – Number of counties in East Texas we serve.

•200 – Number of partners and feeding programs we provide food for.

•214,200 – East Texans who are "food insecure", according to the Feeding America Map The Meal Gap.

•1 in 4 East Texans, including 1 in 3 children, are hungry today.

•91,500 – Approximate households that are served by the East Texas Food Bank.

•76,840 – Hungry children in our 26 county service area, according to the Feeding America Map The Meal Gap.

The East Texas Food Bank was founded in 1988 and is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization with a mission to "fight hunger and feed hope in East Texas." To meet the needs of the over 80,000 households served, the East Texas Food Bank partners with agencies throughout its 26 county service area to distribute food. The East Texas Food Bank also has eight programs: BackPack Program, Kids Cafe/Afterschool Snack, Summer Food Program, Senior Box Program, Mobile Pantry, Fresh Produce Program, Nutrition Education and Benefits Outreach designed to meet the targets of children, adults and seniors. The East Texas Food Bank distributed over 21.3 million meals in FY2019.

The East Texas Food Bank receives food from a variety of sources: area food drives, growers, packers, manufacturers, distributors, wholesalers, restaurants, grocery store chains and USDA. Despite getting a large amount of products donated, approximately 20 percent of our inventory must be purchased to maintain a variety of items for our partner agencies and the specific needs of our programs.

The primary method of distributing food is through our network of over 200 partner agencies and feeding programs that work in cooperation with the East Texas Food Bank. Food is either picked up at our distribution center by the partner agency, or it is delivered by 18 wheelers to agencies on our delivery routes. From there, agencies distribute the food to clients. Food is also directly distributed through our hunger programs targeted towards children, adults or seniors.

The East Texas Food Bank does not sell any donated food or grocery products to our member agencies and programs. Partner agencies agree to share in the recovery cost as a shared maintenance fee.

\$1 provides up to 8 meals. We cannot make 8 meals out of a dollar! However, the East Texas Food Bank takes each dollar that is donated and combines it with other financial gifts, donated food products and time that volunteers give to stretch that one dollar to the maximum.


The East Texas Food Bank has the BBB Accredited Charity Seal. This means that the East Texas Food Bank has met the BBB's 20 Standards of Charity Accountability. The East Texas Food Bank also has a 4 star rating from Charity Navigator.

There are 21 food banks in Texas, each responsible for the counties in their designated service area. The 21 food banks are members of Feeding America and part of Feeding Texas, an organization that fosters and facilitates cooperation between the food banks through advocacy efforts and the coordination of member statewide resources such as produce and Texas Department of Agriculture commodity food.
