Greetings all,

October was nationally recognized as DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH. As I was deciding on our service project for the diocese for this year, I had already decided we would be helping domestic violent shelters around our state with this sad, devastating problem. After seeing the article in CATHOLIC WOMAN magazine on this subject and researching the statistics in our state, I was even more determined to make us more aware of the needs of these women, children and even men.

Did you know that 1 in 3 women in this state will experience some form of domestic violence in her lifetime? The rate here in Utah is slightly higher than the national average. (32.4% vs. 28.8%). More than 40% of adult homicides in Utah since 2000 have been domestic violence related. The third leading cause of homelessness is domestic violence.

Here in Utah we have many shelters that serve these women and their families. The people that enter these shelters spend an average of 30 days there before being transitioned out on their own. Overall, approximately 3,000 men, women, and children stay in shelters each year, and Utah's DCFS receives more than 4,600 domestic violence related child abuse referrals annually. These statistics are alarming.

Helping these individuals while they are at the shelters will be our focus for the coming months. So let's kick off this worthwhile project.....

BRINGING JOY TO THOSE IN NEED

I have contacted many shelters across the state and I have chosen 8 of them that we will help. These range from Ogden to St. George. I feel this will keep our efforts in our local communities. From their input I have compiled a list of needed items. The lists they gave me were much more extensive than the one we will be using. I have tried to address the most needed items as well as giving us a variety of options in many areas and with varying costs. There should be something on the list for everyone's interests.

NEW bras. All sizes

NEW t-shirts for women and children. All sizes

NEW pillows

NEW pajamas for toddlers

NEW socks for women and children

Black Trash Bags 13 gallon or 33 gallon or larger

Lysol wipes

Notebooks or journals and pens Kids snacks and juice boxes Baby wipes and desitin
