

# **New Member Spotlight**



# **Evelyn Torzilli**

My name is Evelyn Torzilli, and I'm a new member of HLAA as I reached out to them to overcome the struggles of being hard of hearing.

Hearing loss is hereditary in my family with my father, myself and my identical twin sister. My father first struggled with it thinking it was from his job which was clearly not the case. He's now 85 yrs. of age and totally deaf. My twin sister opted for the cochlear implant and was in her 40's at that time. As for me, I'm using two hearing aids. I also have what they call tinnitus. Tinnitus is a common first sign that there is something wrong with the ears. While not always a sign of hearing loss, ringing in the ears is always something to get checked out. Everyone else in my family, is fine.

I truly believe I was undiagnosed in the early years of schooling. I struggled to hear in the classroom and had trouble hearing in a noisy environment. The school audiologist would give me hearing tests which I failed the first time around but it would be asserted that I did have normal hearing.

It didn't sink in that I had a hearing problem until I developed ringing in my ears that never stopped. At the age of 25, I started noticing that I'm not understanding what people are saying to me so I started to lip-reading in order to compensate for the loss. Due to the slow gradual loss you're really not aware of all the sounds that you are missing in the course of everyday life. Sounds that everyone takes for granted.

As years went on I have my stories of discrimination, because of my hearing loss. It takes its toll on you emotionally. I tried to hide the fact that I was hard of hearing in order fit in. Co-workers noticed something was wrong. However, they didn't quite get it since I was able lip-read and would tried to put their sentences together.

Finally, the time came to get fitted for my first pair of hearing aids. A whole new world opened up for me as well as a lot of new challenges. I marveled about all the new sounds that I had been missing out on.

Hearing loss impacts everyone, not just the person experiencing loss of hearing, but also family, friends, coworkers, neighbors, and everyone who you communicate with on a daily basis.

I was referred to HLAA to help me overcome my struggles with hearing loss. In that short period of time I have learned quickly lots of new ways to communicate. I'm not saying that I don't struggle on a daily basis as I'm considered profoundly deaf with moderate to severe hearing loss. But I try to overcome my fears by reaching out and letting people know that I'm hard of hearing. I try to look for all the latest technologies that are offered and see if it's right for me. HLAA is a vital source of great and wonderful information. I receive HLAA Magazines, which provides the latest information on products, services, research, and technology in the hearing health care field.

I'm very grateful for HLAA and all they are doing to promote awareness for all those who are struggling with hearing loss or deafness. HLAA is bringing the community of hard of hearing/deaf people together, to give us the resources and educate us in our daily struggles. It is a truly wonderful and great experience knowing that I'm not alone and reaching out to others who are just like myself.
