LRG: Local Government Reorganisation

Following the publication of its White Paper before Christmas, the government asked upper tier authorities (the County Council in our case) to respond with their views on the nature and pace of change. With this in mind, their cabinet met on 9 January and along with the leaders of the other district councils, took the opportunity to set their views on the subject.

SODC leader empahised the need to act quickly in order to give residents and businesses confidence that we will continue to deliver excellent services, and; that there was a broad consensus that the footprint of the Strategic Authority should be guided by existing institutions such as the Thames Valley Police or the integrated care board area (Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire & Berkshire West) and that we should make this preference known to government.

A lot of detail about the Strategic Authority and indeed the unitary's still need to be worked out and agreed upon, but it is our view that we should be looking to work together in a Strategic Authority with those councils in Berkshire and Buckinghamshire who wish to join with us. This is because: these areas all have vibrant economies which will contribute to the sustainable growth which the government is looking for, we have a record of working together in the police and health authorities, we have a shared identity as part of the South East Region, and we have historical connections in that much of South Oxfordshire was in Berkshire prior to the previous local government reorganisation.

New Performing Arts grant

Our new £60,000 Performing Arts grant scheme will open for applications on **3 February 2025**. The scheme is open to town and parish councils and voluntary and community organisations in South Oxfordshire, who will be able to apply for a minimum of £500 and up to a maximum £5,000 in funding for projects that improve community wellbeing across the district.

The grant scheme closes at midday on 3 March 2025.

Warm spaces

Garden waste changes

We are introducing a new permit scheme for garden waste collections this year.

To receive garden waste collections from 1 April 2025, residents must purchase an annual permit. This will replace direct debits.

What residents need to do:

From late February, visit the council's website <u>www.southandvale.gov.uk/GardenWastePermit</u> to make a one-off, annual payment for garden waste collections. When customers get it in the post, they need to stick the permit to the lid of their brown bin.

Garden waste customers can also sign up for an online account on our website to make things easier when they purchase the next permit in 2026. Anyone who cannot easily signup for a permit online can call us on 01235 422422 for support.
