Sports betting goes live in NC

After several years of wrangling over

Rhode Island makes seven

Online-casino gambling launched recently in Rhode Island, making it the seventh state to offer igaming and the first to launch it since Connecticut in October 2021. Bally's is the sole provider of icasino games in the Ocean State; it also holds the monopoly for brick-and-mortar casinos, with one each in Lincoln and Tiverton. The proprietary igaming app features 170 slots and live-dealer blackjack and roulette; the company partnered with Stakelogic, a live-table-game supplier, for its blackjack and roulette software and the technology for its 4,000-square-foot live-game studio in Lincoln.

The governor signed the bill legalizing sports betting into law last June and the twelve licensees paid \$1 million each to partner with an existing Tar Heel State sports team, sporting venue, and/or Native American tribe; the must also "make efforts to" offer in-person betting. Eight of the twelve went live at press time: Bet365 with partner the Charlotte Hornets; BetMGM/Charlotte Motor Speedway; Caesars/Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians; DraftKings/NASCAR; ESPN BET/Quail Hollow Golf Club (PGA Tour); Fanatics\Carolina Hurricanes; FanDuel/Carolina Panthers; and Underdog/Sedgefield Country Club (PGA).

MGM may bail

MGM Resorts is looking at selling properties in Ohio and Massachusetts, Bloomberg recently reported. The Vegas-based gaming company took over management of MGM Northfield Park, a racino near Cleveland, from Hardrock International in 2019. MGM Springfield opened in August 2018 as the first traditional casino in Massachusetts. That venue, which generated \$278 million in sales in 2023, hasn't lived up to the operator's expectations. "Our original valuation of this market simply was off – full stop," said MGM CEO Bill Hornbuckle in a press briefing.

Spin and win

Those who complete a bingo card receive prizes, this year's included a reusable stainless-steel straw with a cleaning brush and pouch. Disposable plastic straws have a huge impact on the environment. In the U.S. alone, people throw away millions of straws daily, which can last 200 years, polluting waterways and sickening animals. In addition to the reusable straw, everyone who plays their bingo card also has a chance to win a free composting bin.

Horseracing Bingo debuts

In a bid to further catch bettors' imagination ahead of what is annually the biggest week of horseracing in the UK, Oddschecker (operated by FairPlay Media) and B2B iGaming provider Low6 has debuted a never-seen-before horseracing-themed bingo game. Prizes include two tickets to the Grand National, alongside a range of other race-related rewards. Adapted for horseracing, players receive a new bingo card filled with horses for each day of the festival. The aim is to reveal all the tiles, with some runners assigned higher values than others, as well as with points assigned to each runner depending on their likelihood of winning over the course of the week. Stuart Simms, Group GEO of FairPlay Sports Media, said: "This is the biggest week of the year for racing fans, and we're pleased to be working with Low-6 on Bet Bingo to give bettors an extra chance to win now and many more chances to land an edge in the future as a registered and engaged user. Small punishments for scammers

What always stands out, at least to me, are the low penalties for the criminals who steal from veterans and the Department of Veterans Affairs. The number of scams seems to grow, and one wonders if it's because thieves don't perceive there to be much punishment if they should be caught.

An example: A veteran threatened to blow up a VA medical facility. He verbally told the crisis line and even identified the person he specifically wanted to kill and when. He was found and arrested for making threats and even made additional threats after the arrest. Now, he hasn't gone to court yet, but the evidence is pretty strong. Why, one wonders, would he only be in line for five short years in the slammer? Yes, there could be a hefty fine, but it's the time behind bars that would keep society safe.

Another example: There was the VA employee who stole prescription drugs that were mailed to VA patients. He knew where they were going, of course, since the drugs were shipped from the VA pharmacy and he therefore had the addresses. He and his pals would break into the mailboxes to steal the drugs, which he would sell for big profits. I think about cancer patients when I learn of something like this, cancer patients who need their drugs on time, not to mention the likely pain medications. The main thief in this scam only received a sentence of 42 months in prison; his scammer pals got sentences of 12 and 35 months. Not long enough, not nearly long enough.

Then there was the guy who convinced everyone that he was blind and therefore 100% disabled and needed some benefits. Turned out he had both a drivers license and a gun carry permit and could see well enough for those activities. Not so blind after all, but his punishment was a few years of probation and some cash restitution.



- 1 pound ricotta cheese
- 1 pound cream cheese
- 1¹/₂ cups granulated sugar
- 4 eggs (beaten)
- 1/2 lemon

Add the lemon juice, vanilla, flour, corn starch, butter and cream to the mixture. Mix well together. Sprav a spring form pan (at least 9- to 10-inches wide) with non-stick cooking spray. Bake for one hour. Then turn off the oven and leave the cheesecake in the oven for two more hours. Remove and serve or refrigerate for later use. Garnish each piece with fresh fruit. Serves 10 to 12 people.

We're told to wash our hands with soap and water for 20 seconds to kill the COVID-19 virus. How long should we wash our hands to kill bacteria and other viruses? -C.C.

ANSWER: 20 seconds is the right amount of time for bacteria and viruses. An alternative is an alcohol-based handrub, which is fast and effective. Of course, you should wash your hands before and after eating — and after using the restroom. Bacterial spores cannot be easily killed, but they are effectively washed off with soap and water. In cases where spores are a concern (Clostridioides difficile is a big one), then handwashing is essential, as alcohol is ineffective.

• Have stubborn stains in the toilet? Put some teeth in your cleaning job by dropping in a denture-cleaning tablet and letting it sit overnight. In the morning, scrub and flush.


• "Lighten blemish spots on your skin with lemon juice. Just dab on several times per day." - O.M. in Georgia

• "Collect small bits of soap into a cup or jar. When you have several, add a tablespoon or two of water to the cup to soften the soap pieces. When they are moderately soft, pour out the contents on a washcloth, fold it over and press into a bar shape with your hands. Peel away the cloth to reveal what should be a reasonably solid new bar of soap." — C.T. in Pennsylvania

• Save power with this tip: Use cold water to wash towels and jeans. Then hang them to dry — preferably outside, but on an inside line is OK, too. When they are mostly dry, pop them in the dryer on air dry to fluff up. Towels and jeans take the longest to dry in the clothes dryer, and use a lot of electricity.

• Take soap scum right off your shower curtain — spray with vinegar and water mixture, then throw it in the washer. Hang it right back up, and those mildew stains are gone!

How to tap underutilized burial benefits for veterans

Dear Savvy Senior,

What types of funeral benefits are available to old veterans? My 83-yearold father, who has Alzheimer's disease, served during the Vietnam War in the 1960s. — *Planning Ahead*

Dear Planning,

Department of Veterans Affairs' (VA) National Cemetery Administration actually offers a variety of underutilized burial benefits to veterans as well as their spouses and dependents.

Most U.S. veterans (both combat and non-combat) who didn't receive a dishonorable discharge are eligible for burial benefits. To verify your dad's discharge, you'll need a copy of his DD Form 214 "Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty." If you don't have it, you can request online at <u>Archives.gov/veterans</u>.

Here's a rundown of some of the different benefits that are available to veterans that die a nonservice related death.

Military Cemetery Benefits

If your dad's eligible and would like to be buried in one of the 155 national or 119 state, territory or tribal-operated cemeteries (see <u>VA.gov/find-lo-</u> <u>cations</u>), the VA provides a number of benefits at no cost to the family, including: a gravesite; opening and closing of the grave and perpetual gravesite care; a government headstone or marker; a United States burial flag that can be used to drape the casket or accompany the urn; and a Presidential Memorial Certificate.

If your dad is cremated, his remains will be buried or inurned in the same manner as casketed remains.

But be aware that funeral or cremation arrangements and costs are not taken care of by the VA. They are the responsibility of the veteran's family, but some veteran's survivors may be eligible for burial allowances.

The VA also offers a memorial web page called the Veterans Legacy Memorial for any veteran buried in a national, state, territorial or tribal cemetery. This allows families to post pictures and stories of their loved one online as a way to remember and honor their service.

If you're interested in this option, the VA has a pre-need burial eligibility determination program to help you plan ahead before your dad passes. See <u>VA.gov/burials-memorials/</u> <u>pre-need-eligibility</u> or call the National Cemetery Scheduling Office at 800-535-1117.

Private Cemetery Benefits

The VA also provides benefits to veterans buried in private cemeteries. If your dad chooses this option, the VA benefits include a free government headstone or grave marker, or a medallion that can be affixed to an existing privately purchased headstone or marker; a burial flag; and a Presidential Memorial Certificate.

Funeral or cremation arrangements and costs are again the responsibility of the family, and there are no benefits offered to spouses and dependents that are buried in private cemeteries.

Military Funeral Honors

Another popular benefit available to all eligible veterans buried in either a national or private cemetery is a military funeral honors ceremony. This includes an honor guard detail of at least two uniformed military persons, folding and presenting the U.S. burial flag to the veteran's survivors, and the playing of Taps.

The funeral provider you choose will be able to assist you with all VA burial requests. Depending on what you want, certain forms may need to be completed which are always better to be done in advance.

For a complete rundown of burial and memorial benefits, eligibility details and required forms visit <u>Cem.</u> <u>va.gov</u>.

Burial Allowances

In addition to the burial benefits, some veteran's survivors may also qualify for a \$948 burial allowance and \$948 for a plot to those who choose to be buried in a private cemetery. And \$231 for a headstone or grave marker allowance. To find out if your dad is eligible or to apply, see <u>VA.gov/burials-memorials/veteransburial-allowance</u>.

DEAR PAWS: My little dog Barnsey is quite a barker for a terrier, but for the past several days his bark has been very hoarse. He sometimes snorts or sneezes, too. I make sure he has plenty of water, but I'm not sure what else to do. It doesn't seem to be getting better. — Faye H., Hartford

DEAR FAYE: Chronic hoarseness when barking can have several different causes, and the veterinarian can better evaluate him to see what's happening.

Laryngitis is a common diagnosis, but it's important to figure out the cause. A bacterial or viral infection may be the culprit, or gastroesophageal reflux.

Less common causes are masses or tumors growing on or near the dog's larynx, or other conditions affecting the larynx. These may require surgery.

The vet will evaluate Barnsey to see if he has an infection, acid reflux, or if the hoarse barking has another cause. They'll then be able to recommend an effective treatment.

If acid reflux is the suspected culprit, the vet may recommend changes to his feeding schedule and the amount of food at each meal. You can also try different varieties of dog food.



Playing poker out of position is difficult

I recently played a hand in a \$3,500 buy-in poker tournament that demonstrates a tricky situation that many players approach incorrectly.

Early on Day 2 with blinds at 1,500/3,000 with a 3,000 big blind ante, a somewhat tight, aggressive kid raised to 7,000 from second position. The player in fourth position and the button called, and I decided to call 4,000 more out of my 125,000-effective stack from the big blind with the 9s6s9. While it certainly was not a great hand, calling from the big blind with suited gappers when getting amazing pot odds is usually a good idea. If you fold too often from the big blind, you will be easily exploited by your aggressive opponents.

The flop came Qc7s2s giving me a flush draw. I checked because I will have no leading range on this board that should be good for the initial raiser. The initial raiser bet 18,000 into the 32,500 pot. Only the button called. At this point, I thought the initial raiser must have a reasonably strong hand to continuation-bet into three players, even on this somewhat dry board. I assumed the button would call with most of his one-pair hands as well as his flush draws. I had 118,000 left in my stack. So, what should I do?

Folding is out of the question unless both opponents are thought to be extremely tight because, even though I could be crushed by a better flush draw, most of the time my draw will be live.

When you have a draw and are getting decent immediate pot odds, call-

ing is rarely a mistake. If I was facing a larger bet, perhaps 26,000 into the 32,500 pot, calling would become a worse option. The main problem with calling is that if I hit my draw on the turn, I will have a difficult time extracting value because I am out of position and I will not have the nuts. Notice that if I improve to a flush and lead into my opponents and face a raise, my flush will shrivel into a bluff catcher. If I check and it checks through, I have to dodge another spade on the river. If someone bets the turn, I can only check-call, again having to dodge a spade. Playing draws from out of position is difficult!

Raising small, perhaps to 44,000, is not a good idea because it will frequently induce my opponents to call, which may induce them to call my small turn all-in shove with an overly wide range. When you have a junky draw and decide to play it aggressively, you want to ensure you can make your opponent's fold.

Going all in seems like a reasonable option, especially if I can make my opponents fold marginal top pairs and better flush draws. Going all in to some extent ensures that most of the time when I get called my outs will be live.

After some thought, I decided that going all in would lead to the best result for me. The initial raiser called with pocket sevens for the middle set, and I was out of the tournament when the Qs came on the turn, completing my flush, but also his full house. After discussing this situation with a few of my friends, I now think calling the flop bet is ideal, mainly because I am getting decent pot odds to see one more card and it decreases the odds I go broke. Minimizing the odds you go broke is a skill you must master if you want to succeed at poker tournaments. Although I gave myself the best chance to win this specific pot, I also opened the door to go broke, which lead to disaster this time.







