Message from the Council President

I am devoting my message here to interpreting some information shared at our "mid-year Trinity Report, held on Sunday, July 16, 2017. The big picture is complicated so let me attempt to be helpful.

Trinity's total General Fund income from all sources for January through June, was \$163,561.89. Our total outflow of dollars for the same period, was \$161,105.98. Great, you might say--we took in \$2,455.91 more than we spent in 6 months! What isn't shown in these numbers, is that Trinity received three large special gifts totaling \$25,000 of the \$163,561.89. What's the problem with that--nothing at all! But can we expect another \$25,000 in special gifts to help us make our budget for the remaining 6 months of 2017? God provided for us so far! Maybe God will continue to provide special gifts to keep us operating at our current level. But what if that doesn't happen?

In the absence of more large, unexpected gifts to Trinity between now and December 31, either we will have to cut expenses, which would be difficult, or we will need more people giving offerings, the same people giving more in offerings, or other sources of income to achieve our budget. Your Council is working on all three of those options: on outreach and evangelism to attract people to become a part of our Trinity family, encouraging those currently involved to be as generous as possible and as regular as possible in their giving, and also looking to outside sources of income, such as grants to make up the difference. We are already "borrowing" from Designated Funds to keep on top of things financially. But our Designated Funds are limited ..., and needed to fund items like the air conditioner for our office wing, which we have recently been informed is no longer repairable—the next time it fails, it's done (with a replacement cost of about \$15,000)!

For more than 75 years, God has provided for Trinity. We, the members and friends of this congregation, also need to do our part to keep Trinity financially sound. We encourage you to: give as generously as you are able; invite others to partner with us in Trinity's exciting mission; share your thoughts and ideas with your elected leaders; pray for Trinity and its valuable ministries that God will guide and show us the way into the future he has planned for Trinity, and to do whatever and all you can, to address the concerns expressed in this letter.

Trinity Launches Grant Fundraising Team

Thanks be to God! Trinity's first grant was submitted on July 5, 2017 to the Meijer store in Round Lake Beach. We asked them for the donation of hot dogs, buns and chips for our Rally Day festival on September 12, 2017. Grants are being written to other local grocery providers for additional Rally Day needs. The first grant proposal in support of the church structure is underway. The process starts with research to identify possible grant-funding providers which match the project or ministry. Next the funding source is investigated to learn about their history, qualifications, financials and application process. This information is summarized in a report to our Congregation Council who decides if the Grant/Fundraising Team should proceed with the proposal. Lots of data about Trinity and our community and the project or ministry is gathered and written into a narrative proposal, which along with the application are reviewed by Council for approval. Every grant proposal, big or small, is prayed over by Pastor Janet Breum and Jane Gemein before it is sent.

The Trumpet, Trinity's Newsletter Looks at Changes

We hope you enjoy reading *The Trumpet*, which has been published since 1951. The purpose of the newsletter is to provide information on Trinity's ministries and events, to keep you informed and encourage your interests. Copies of the newsletter are available in the narthex, through Trinity's website **www. trinityonthehill.org** and a link on the Mid-week Announcement email.

Trinity is looking for ways to ensure that the newsletter is available to visitors, the homebound, and those with and without electronic access. We also want to keep it relevant, save on cost, and reduce the work involved. As a start, after this August edition, there will be six issues published a year instead of the monthly (12) editions--September/October, November/December editions, and so on. Also, we will be looking at efficiencies first, which may affect the look and distribution, etc., then content, and may also do a survey.

The Trumpet staff is looking for volunteers to prepare, write, design, lay out, and proofread. Some templates have been created, and training would be provided where needed. However, there are unknown factors to be addressed once interest is established. (See details below.)

The newsletter staff basically consists now of 3 people—the Editor, Janet Peterson, and 2 people who alternately put copy in an appealing and easily readable format. Articles about church activities related to the mission and ministries of Trinity are provided to the Editor by the Pastor, Council, and Action Team members, who then compiles, edits, and provides an orderly document to the layout person. Proofreading is done more than once for various reasons. Printing and preparation for mailing is done in-house.

The newsletter is generally sent bulk mail to over 200 people, the minimum required for a permit to do so at a lower postage rate. When it is received at your house depends on multiple factors, some under our control and some controlled by the postal system. As with first class mail, you can get it in a day or two, or a week or more.

Outreach and Care Needs Help!

Do you have skills? Of course you do. Can you lend us 30-90 minutes once a month? If you are so moved and would like to know more about how and where we need help, please contact Ian Griffith in person, via phone/text at (224)343-1315 or via email at ianhgriffith@me.com

No experience is necessary for these positions other than a willingness to help your congregation. Positions include:

- Visitor Tracking (it sounds exotic) actually you do not need to be a hunter, or have a license (well actually you domore on that later) but you do need to be a gatherer/collector, and an ability to share information on who is visiting us each week. You would communicate with our church secretary, Rachel Emken, and the Outreach/Evangelism Team leader, and use a pre-formatted Microsoft Excel spreadsheet to collect, manage, and share the data. Sounds like a lot of work-- it isn't, but it is a very important role to our growth as a church. Skills and tools required: your PC, Microsoft Excel (or compatible (and knowledge of how to use it), email, phone, availability to communicate with Rachel and the Team, and a willingness to help your congregation by making sure visitors are acknowledged and properly followed up with on a consistent basis. This will take 30 minutes a week for the first 22 months and then should drop to 30-45 minutes per month with experience. Also a heart for God and his people would be very helpful.
- Liaison to several of the Trinity Action Teams that we serve: Member Care, the Prayer Chain, Community/Group Outreach, and Adopt-A-Highway. You can look at this as an opportunity to learn what these groups offer and to help (not manage or direct) the Action Team leaders. Some might take 30 seconds per week to check in with while others might take 15-30 minutes now and then if they are having an event or need some help. Skills and tools required: Some free time (days, weeknights, or possibly some weekends), good communication skills, and a heart for God and his people.

Entertainment Book 2018
