



THE SANCTITIY OF THE WOMB ... OR IS THAT NON-SANCTITY

When life begins at conception and mothers learn through medical testing that they are expecting their child, the fetus is protected inside the mother by her womb. The Roe V. Wade decision in 1973 removed these protections through the third trimester of pregnancy in that, if a mother wanted for many reasons to terminate her pregnancy, she will be allowed to enact the horrific abortion procedure. This procedure has made the sanctity of the womb, which many would have believed to be the safest place for a baby, become the most unsafe place for a baby by virtue of an abortionist invading the womb with a tool and performing dilation and extraction of the baby's body parts by a piece-by-piece destructive method. This is cruel and inhumane as there is no question as to the viability in regard to pain and anguish to not only the child but the mother as well.

There is no medical doubt that the fetus feels and absorbs much pain, as those who have worked in Planned Parenthood facilities will tell you that the pictures of abortions exhibit the baby trying to pull away in the mother's womb while the suction machine is tearing it apart limb from limb.

This country has much to be proud of but one of our generational scourges is that a mom who is with child has the right to allow a stranger, for a fee paid by either herself or through Medicaid funding, to terminate her pregnancy and make the sanctity of the womb unsafe by the immoral acts of vicious doctors profiteering by way of killing babies. The emotional scars left on the mother are immeasurable and many will tell you later on that they regret their abortions.

We can only hope as a society that the precious gift we call life will once again be given as much priority in the womb as it is outside the womb. The sanctity of life begins in the safe place of the mother's womb, but if laws allowing it to be invaded are kept on the books, the non-sanctity of this safe haven will continue to eliminate many future populations and those who could have been great contributors.

The United States is only one of seven countries worldwide that have legalized abortion and this distinction we bear is an embarrassment to our health system, our faith and our constitution which guarantees the right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

* * * ST. AUGUSTINE

Augustine of Canterbury (born first third of the 6th century – died 26 May 604) was a Catholic Benedictine monk who became the first Archbishop of Canterbury in the year 597. He is considered the "Apostle to the English" and a founder of the Catholic Church in England.


Augustine was the prior of the *Abbey of St Andrew's in Rome* when Pope Gregory the Great chose him in 595 to lead a mission, usually known as the Gregorian mission, to Britain to Christianize King Æthelberht and his Kingdom of Kent from Anglo-Saxon paganism. Kent was probably chosen because Æthelberht had married a Christian princess, Bertha, daughter of Charibert I the King of Paris. She was expected to be able to exert some influence over her husband. In 597 Augustine landed on the Isle of Thanet and proceeded to Æthelberht's main town of Canterbury.

King Æthelberht converted to Christianity and allowed the missionaries to preach freely, giving them land to found a monastery outside the city walls. Augustine was consecrated as a bishop and converted many of the king's subjects, including thousands during a mass baptism on Christmas Day in 597. Pope Gregory sent more missionaries in 601, along with encouraging letters and gifts for the churches, although attempts to persuade the native British bishops to submit to Augustine's authority failed. Roman bishops were established at London, and Rochester in 604, and a school was founded to train Anglo-Saxon priests and missionaries. Augustine also arranged the consecration of his successor, Laurence of Canterbury. The archbishop died in 604 and was soon revered as a saint.
