- Sunday Reflection: Friends, in our gospel today, Jesus tells a very unnerving, disturbing, and confounding parable. He said a landowner went out to hire workers for his field; he did so by hiring some, first thing in the morning and then others at different times during the day. Then he pays each the same wage. This parable offers us a lot to reflect on. First and foremost, one may question, why does the vineyard owner have to make multiple trips to hire these laborers? Couldn't he have done it just in one trip in the morning? Why should those who have worked only an hour be paid the same as those who have slaved in the hot sun all day? Is the landowner really being fair? The multiple trips that the vineyard owner makes point us to the importance of the harvest. The workers that were hired first thing in the morning must not have been enough to finish the harvest. The owner needed more people to bring in the ripe harvest so as to avoid moving from a bumper crop to a lost crop. This is a reminder to all of us disciples of Christ that the harvest of ministry is just as time sensitive. The Lord requires all our hands on deck to bring more people to him. The multiple trips of hiring workers is also an indicator of how much the Lord desires that everyone be given a place in the Kingdom. This second interpretation thus shifts from the importance of the harvest to the necessity of inclusion and involvement in the work of the Gospel. It should be a cause for greater joy that no matter who we are, out of his immense love and mercy, the Lord invites us all to work in his vineyard. It is the greatest privilege imaginable to participate in the Lord's work of saving the world. Therefore, it is not our place to be fussing about rewards, or spending our lifetime spying and worrying and comparing ourselves to others on who is better qualified. We are all laborers in God's vineyard; the church, the family or society and we are all called to do work for his kingdom. Only that some get the calling early in life and some get the calling at their end stage in life. The one thing, which really matters, is that we heed to that call. Our God is merciful, very compassionate and all loving. As the First reading indicated, His thoughts are not our thoughts, and neither are his ways our ways. He is willing to receive those who will come to him at any time. "Those who call upon him in truth". Early in their lives or even at the 11th hour. Let us pray for God's grace not to complain or to grumble about what God does and how He does things in our lives or for others. And also, to imitate him in being generous, merciful, and compassionate to those we encounter.

<u>Y</u> Catechism Corner - Conditions for receiving Confirmation: 1) Proper preparation: Preparation for Confirmation should aim at leading the Christian toward a more intimate union with Christ and a more lively familiarity with the Holy Spirit - His actions, His gifts, and His biddings - in order to be more capable of assuming the apostolic responsibilities of Christian life. To this end, catechesis for Confirmation should strive to awaken a sense of belonging to the Church of Jesus Christ, the universal Church as well as the parish community. The latter bears special responsibility for the preparation of confirmands (CCC #1309). 2) To receive Confirmation, one must be in a state of grace. One should receive the sacrament of Penance in order to be cleansed for the gift of the Holy Spirit. More intense prayer should prepare one to receive the strength and graces of the Holy Spirit with docility and readiness to act (CCC #1310). 3) Candidates for Confirmation, as for Baptism, fittingly seek the spiritual help of a sponsor. To emphasize the unity of Baptism and Confirmation, it is appropriate that the Confirmation sponsor be one of the Baptismal godparents (CCC #1311).
