SEASIDE CHARACTER GUIDELINE – A CONCEPT:

OCNA is preparing a concept guideline to present to City Planners for incorporation into the general plan for the Seaside area (Michigan north, Horne east, Wisconsin south, and Freeman west).

With this guideline we hope to provide ideas on Scale, Street Mass, Roofs, Building Heights, Street Trees, ADU's, and Floor Area Ratios (FAR's). A sub-team of resident volunteers will meet and define details on these basic criteria and report back to the membership their summary sometime in early 2019 for membership review and approval.

If the guideline and concept are adopted by the City, then other areas of our downtown neighborhood may follow. Stay tuned - more to come!

DID YOU KNOW?

Oceanside's local fiesta
Dia de los Muertos
honors the dead with
music, food, and lively
dances, and good fun at

the Mission San Luis Rey Oct 28, 2018.

This Latin American custom combines indigenous Aztec rituals with Catholicism, brought to the region by Spanish Conquistadores. (Dia de los Muertos is celebrated on All Saints Day in the Catholic calendar).

Tradition implies that the dead would be insulted by mourning or sadness, so the holiday celebrates the lives of the deceased with food, drink, parties, and activities the dead enjoyed in life. It recognizes death as a natural part of the human experience, a continuum with birth, childhood, and growing up to become a contributing member of the community. On Dia de los Muertos, the dead are also a part of the community, awakened from their eternal sleep to share celebrations with their loved ones.

The most familiar symbol of Dia de los Muertos are the Calaveras (skeletons and skulls), which appear as candied sweets, parade masks and face paintings, and decorative dolls. www.nationalgeographic.org

LOCAL HAPPENINGS -NOV 6TH ELECTION:

- **District Elections** Oceanside now has 4 voting districts and District 1 (NW Area) and District 2 (NE Area) are up for reelection with multiple candidates. District 3 (below 78) and District 4 (Mid Oside/RDO) have elections in 2020. When each district has an elected a Council member, the City Council will be comprised 4 District representatives who live in one of the four districts, and a Mayor, who will be elected at-large.
- Sales Tax Measure X proposes a one-half cent sales tax increase to provide local funding to meet the needs of the Fire and Police for the City of Oceanside
- SOAR Measure Y requires a vote of citizens if zoning in our General Plan would change to rezone open space (El Corazon) and/or farmland for development.
