
Bernie Willette was born in Massachusetts, and grew up with six brothers and one sister in a Catholic family. Helived in Oregon for about 40 years. But it was in Vermont in 2005 that Bernie met and married his beautiful wife Therese. About ten years ago they moved to the Keys. Bernie is a skilled carpenter and cabinet maker, who enjoys hiking, fishing and outdoor activities. As the carpenter who crafted the rustic cabinand dockon set for the horror movie "The Presence" in August, 2010, he met Academy Award winning actress Mira Sorvino and Muse Watson on that set. Therese Willette is a life-long spiritual seeker of universal truth and mindful compassionate practice. She was born into a large French Catholic family in Houston and educated in Catholic

schools. Family life was centered around the Houston Ship Channel, its petroleum and railroad industries, as well as the Texas Medical Center which was founded to provide research and care to petroleum refinery workers. She worked 38 years as a medical transcriptionist for charity university teaching hospitals both in Houston and Portland, Oregon. For three years she studied Judaism at two different synagogues, one in Houston and the other in Portland where she volunteered as a memory care assistant at Robison Jewish Home for the Aged. She is also a Certified Professional Astrologer and served as Vice President of Marketing and Education Seminar Planning for the International Society of Astrological Research. In 1996, she was hired for three weeks as a private-duty spiritual healer and flown to London, St. Charles Hospital, to participate as a member of a hospice team of cancer care. In 1998, she began a ten-year course of study with the Magi Society, a Chinese astrological practice that originated in a Medieval Shaolin Temple in Hunan province. For two years, she sat ZaZen with a Zen Buddhist Priestess for spiritual consciousness training. Transcendental Meditation (TM) attunement occurred in 1996 along with the study and practice of Ayurvedic cooking. In 2003 she began a long course of spiritual health training using the ancient tools of TCM (Traditional Chinese Medicine), QiGong, TaiChi, ChiKung, and Taoist Healing Arts with an emphasis in Spiritual Nutrition, becoming a "raw fooder." It was in 2004 that she met her partner, Bernie, at a political activist meeting. In 2013, she returned to her native Houston to research her familial ancestry and create a large digital photographic archival database. Current local activities include preserving and archiving a 1500 -page collection of Magee family documents and working as a volunteer for FindAGrave company. Two months ago, she completed the photographic project for the Big Coppitt Cemetery and continues to do work at the Key West and Big Pine Cemeteries. (We're so glad to welcome you, Therese!)
