March Reflection

Genesis 17:1 "When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the Lord appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am God Almighty, walk before and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous."

In high school, I wanted to play football, but at six three and about 135 pounds soaking wet, football was not going to be my sport. The one day I attended the football summer practice the coaches wanted to end the practice with Oklahoma drills, and I got my bell rung in a way still to this day has not been replicated. After that first real good hit, I was out, but I still wanted to play sports, so I opted for soccer. Now it probably goes without saying, soccer in the mountains of Western North Carolina isn't a popular sport. But I really grew to love the game.

I think what hooked me more than anything was my coach, Dolphus Brown. Coach Brown, did not really know much about soccer, if you have ever seen Ted Lasso, he was remarkably similar to the main character. But what coach Brown understood was how to get the best out of each player. I will never forget, right before our first game my freshman year, coach Brown gave a speech to the team, that I probably heard him give more than 100 times in the course of four years. He said, "We aren't going to be the most talented team, look at us, most of you have never watched a soccer match before. We aren't going too win any style points, none of you are going to be drafted to play professional soccer. But if you will trust me, we will win a lot of games. If you will buy in, we will be the hardest working, best conditioned, and most mentally tough group of people to play the game."

Now the speech sounded good in theory, I made the commitment to be coached right then and there, I was ready to follow the man into war. What I didn't realize was just how much he meant that. Every single practice that followed over the next four years was hard, I don't recall a single practice that ever ended early, or even on time for that matter. I ran more miles than I could count, I was pushed further physically than I knew I could go. It was disparaging in the first year when we didn't win a single game. But the team for the most part stuck it out. My senior year, even though we were a small 2a school, we defeated the likes of Independence High School in Charlotte, TC Robinson in Asheville, and the reigning State Champion Cardinal Gibbions High in Raleigh, we finished the season ranked number four in the state.

I wouldn't have ever believed that we could get there during that first practice, after the first year of not winning a single game, I thought we were toast, but coach Brown had a vision, and all he asked was for the team to trust him in that.

At ninety-nine Abraham was given an impossible calling from God, God said to Abraham, "I will make you exceedingly numerous." But here was Abraham at ninety-nine years old, with no child to his name. His wife Sarah was also in her nineties, how can two people in their nineties have a child? Abraham knew the promise seemed too good to be true. He knew that there was no way on earth he and his wife would have a child, much less an heir, but he also knew to trust God.

So, Abraham said yes to God. Now he didn't know what that yes entailed, he didn't know that he and his family would be uprooted, didn't know that he would put in dangerous situations, or that he and his wife would be separated in Egypt. He didn't have a clue that he and his brother would separate, or that Sarah would pass away while their son was still young. He didn't know, how could he have known? He didn't know that it would be many years before this promise was fulfilled, or that he would have a child with an Egyptian maid servant, he didn't know. But what Abraham did know was that he would be faithful to the calling that God gave him. And through that initial *yes* to God, we standing here today can count him as a father.

I bring up Abraham's story while we are still very much in the season of Lent because this season is a season in which we too are urged to say yes to God. It is a season in which we confront the sin that resides within our hearts, and we humbly admit that we cannot free ourselves from its grip through our own volition. The only hope we have is to fully trust God. To let go of the agency that we may have and to throw ourselves before the throne of God. We may not know each step of the journey that we are on, but we know the destination and that is full communion with God. I hope this year as we inch closer and closer to the cross that you would open your heart, your mind, and your ears for where God is leading you. That in the everyday occurrences of life, you might listen to the prompting of God and be drawn deeper into his ways. Knowing that saying *yes* to God isn't the easy path, but it is the only path that leads to life.
