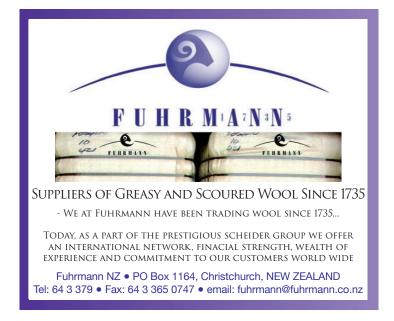

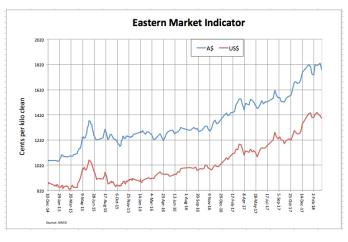


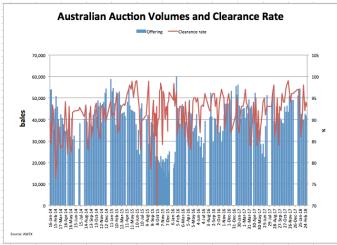

AUSTRALIA

EMI sees big correction as volatility returns





The Australian wool market suffered significant corrections this week following last week's record-breaking sales.

The Australian Wool Exchange (AWEX) Eastern Market Indicator (EMI) fell by 52 cents (2.8%) for the week to close on 1,778 cents per kilo clean on Thursday 8 March. In US dollar terms the EMI declined by 22 cents (1.6%) to close on 1,393 US cents.

Analysts noted that almost half of the fall in the EMI this week was associated with currency. The Australian dollar strengthened against the US dollar, finishing 0.99 cents (1.3%) higher to close at 78.30 cents on Thursday. This shift was attributed to uncertainty about the economic direction of the US, leading to a weaker US dollar.

The national offering was 45,536 bales, compared with 44,150 bales last week, resulting in a clearance rate of 90%. The relatively high pass-in rate was due largely to the Merino fleece types, which had a pass-in rate of 14.7%, including 22.1% on Thursday.

Sales were held in Melbourne on Tuesday 6 March, and at all three selling centres on Wednesday 7 March and Thursday 8 March. On Tuesday, the EMI dropped by 14 cents to 1,816 n cents, and in US dollar terms was down by 1 cent to 1,414 US cents. On Wednesday, the EMI lost 20 cents to 1,796 cents and in US dollar terms declined by 12 cents to 1,402 US cents. On Thursday the EMI lost a further 18 cents to 1,778 cents and in US dollar terms fell by 9 cents to 1,393 US cents.

AWEX reported that price reductions were felt from the outset and by the end of the sale, prices were generally reduced by 40 to 80 cents. It was the wools carrying impurities and those exhibiting poor length and strength results that were the hardest hit, in many cases over 100 cents cheaper. Inversely, wools with very low mid breaks were highly sought after and sold at levels very similar to the previous sale.

Wools at the fine end continue to perform best, with the smallest falls in the average AWEX Micron Price Guides (MPGs) occurring at 16.5 and 17 microns this week. The movements in the average MPGs were as follows: 16.5 microns declined by 26 cents (0.9%); 17 microns was down by 24 cents (0.9%); 17.5 microns fell by 45 cents (1.7%); 18 microns decreased by 21 cents (0.9%); 18.5 microns dropped by 62 cents (2.8%); 19 microns was down by 69 cents (3.2%); 19.5 microns lost 71 cents (3.5%); 20 microns decreased by 54 cents (2.7%); 21 microns fell by 50 cents (2.6%); and 22 microns was down by 51 cents (2.7%).

The crossbred sector defied the trend of the Merinos and generally managed to record rises for the week, with gains at the fine end and small losses at the coarse end. 25 to 28 microns posted solid gains of between 10 and 30 cents, with the better prepared lines enjoying the largest price increases. 25 microns increased by 10 cents (0.8%); 26 microns gained 30 cents (2.6%); 28 microns was up by 6 cents (0.7%); 30 microns fell by 5 cents (0.9%); and 32 microns decreased by 2 cents (0.5%).

The skirting market followed a similar trend to the fleece types. Losses were felt right across the board, generally between 30 and 70 cents. Wools with favourable length and strength results, or those carrying less than 3% vegetable matter, were least affected.

The oddment sector continued its downward trend. Locks, stains and crutchings experienced general reductions of 20 to 30 cents, which was reflected in the average AWEX Merino Cardings Price Guide dropping by an average of 23 cents. A limited selection of lambs was highly irregular but tending cheaper.

AWEX reported that the value of the wool sold was AU\$76.2m (AU\$1,876 per bale), taking the season total to AU\$2.4bn. Buyers for China were dominant, with support from buyers for Europe and India.

Looking ahead, the offering for next week (Week 37) is forecast to be lower, at 43,894 bales. The projected offering for Week 38 is 42,770 bales, and Week 39 43,816 bales.

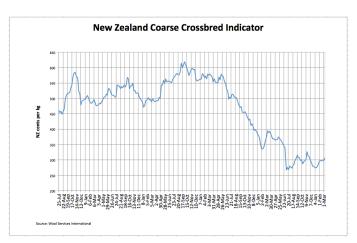
Strong rebound at South Island sale

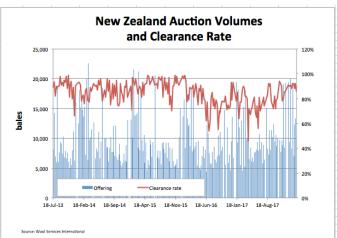
The New Zealand wool market rebounded strongly this week. At the South Island sale held on 8 March, the Coarse Crossbred Indicator gained 8 cents (2.7%) to close at 306 cents, and in US dollar terms also rose by 8 cents (3.7%) to 223 US cents.

The New Zealand dollar was stronger against the US dollar compared with last week, finishing 0.9% higher at 72.84 US cents.

The total offering was 10,738 bales, with a clearance rate of 86%.

Compared with the North Island sale on 1 March, prices moved as follows: fine crossbred early shorn of 32-34 microns – 2-5% dearer. Coarse crossbred fleece of 35-39 microns – good styles firm to 2% dearer, 35-36 microns 1.5% dearer, 37 microns and plus were firm,





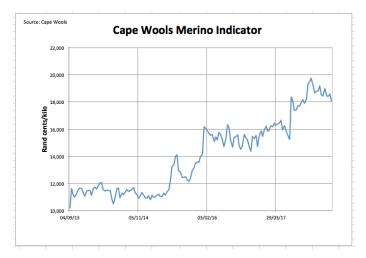
poorer styles 2-3% dearer. Among the coarse crossbred early shorn and second shear types of 36-39 microns, 3-5 inch were 1% dearer, 3-4 inch 1% dearer, 2-4 inch 3% dearer, 2-3 inch 2% dearer. Crossbred oddments – good style 2% dearer, poor style firm. Lambs – 28-28.5 microns, 2-3 inch 3-5% dearer, 29-31 microns, 2-4 inch 5% dearer, 29-31 microns, 2-3 inch 5% dearer.

SOUTH AFRICA

Market drops by 2.8% despite weaker rand

The South African wool market traded lower on 6-7 March, with the Cape Wools Merino Indicator decreasing by 517 points (2.8%) to close at a value of R180.43 (clean). The Cape Wools All Wool Indicator also fell by 2.8%.



The market experienced a correction and prices eased across all types. Demand for quality long and fine wool remains strong and they performed fairly whilst the medium length and coarser end declined sharply.

Competition between buyers was good with Modiano purchasing the most bales on offer. Buyers remain concerned about the decline in the offering of wool to the market.

This week saw the rand at R11.85 to the US dollar and R14.71 to the euro. The rand was 1.1% weaker against the US dollar and 2.7% weaker against the euro, compared with the average rate at the previous sale.

The offering comprised 12,017 bales of which 98.2% was sold. Major traders were Modiano (3,585 bales), Standard Wool SA (3,285), Tianyu SA (2,060), and Lempriere SA (1,376).

The average clean prices for the selection within the different micron categories for good top-making (MF5), long fleeces were as follows: 18 microns decreased 2% to close at R221.55/kg; 18.5 microns moved 2.9% down to close at R207.63/kg; 19 microns lost 3.5% to close at R195.63/kg; 19.5 microns weakened by 3.6% to close at R183.47/kg; 20 microns was 3.3% weaker to close at R178.47/kg; 20.5 microns lost 2.2% to close at R176.33/kg; 21 microns lost 2.6% to close at R170.63/kg; 21.5 microns decreased by 0.6% to close at R170.11/kg; 22 microns decreased by 2.2% to close at R166.06/kg; and 22.5 microns declined by 3.8% to close at R160.13/kg.

Mohair

Strong competition continues to push market up

The second sale of the 2018 summer season took place in Port Elizabeth on 6 March, with 144,242 kg on offer. The market gained a further 2% from the previous sale to close on R252.25 p/kg, despite the slight strengthening of the rand.

Nearly 100% of the offering was sold, with a highest price of R520.50 p/kg paid for a bale of 24 micron good style kid mohair. Buyers competed actively for the good quality mohair on offer, with individual clips achieving very good results.

Mohair South Africa now includes a 'clean price' for comparison purposes with other fibres. Compared to the previous sale, prices were as follows: Kids (summer) up 4%; Young Goats (summer) up 2.6%; Fine Adults up 4.7%; Strong Adults up 1.8%; Average up 2%.

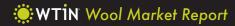
UNITED KINGDOM

Most prices rise with 95% clearance

At the British Wool sale held on 6 March, strong and sustained competition produced a 95% clearance with most prices rising.

The British Wool index was up 2.4% on the previous sale to £1.499 clean. The total weight offered was 1.802 million kg, with the total weight sold 1.715 million kg, resulting in a clearance of 95.2%.

The average clean price was 149.5p, and the average greasy price 100.5p. The price movements were as follows: Fine: 2-4% dearer. Medium: 2-5% dearer. Romney: Firm. Mule: 2-3% dearer. Cheviot: 2% dearer. Radnor: Fully firm. Welsh: No.2's fully firm, all others 2-7%



dearer. Swaledale: Fully firm. Blackface: Fully firm.

Meanwhile, an additional sale, taking place on 24 April, has been added to this season's roster. This sale is now BW53. All the other sales are still on the same dates.

Territory lamb wool: 60-70mm, 22 micron sold at US\$1.90/lb (US\$4.18/kg); 55-65mm, 24 micron at US\$1.72/lb (3.78/kg); and 60-70mm, 27 micron at US\$0.95/lb (US\$2.09/kg).
