Strongholds

Does one prevailing problem stalk your life? Where does Satan have a hook in you?

Some are prone to cheat. Others quick to doubt. Maybe you worry. Yes, everyone worries some – but

you own the national distributorship of anxiety. Perhaps you are judgmental. Sure, everybody can be critical, but you pass more judgments than the Supreme Court.

What is that one weakness, bad habit, rotten attitude? Where does the devil have a stronghold on you? Ahh, there is the word that fits—stronghold—fortress, citadel, thick walls, tall gates. It's as if the devil has fenced in one negative attribute, one bad habit, one weakness and constructed a rampart around it. "You ain't touching this flaw," he defies to heaven and he places himself squarely between God's help and

your: –explosive temper –fragile self-image –voracious appetite –distrust for authority

Seasons come and go and this Loch Ness monster still lurks in the watery lake bottom of your soul. He won't go away. He lives up to both sides of his compound name: strong enough to grip like a vice and stubborn enough to hold on. He clings like a bear trap; the harder you shake, the more it hurts.

Strongholds: old, difficult, discouraging challenges.

The term stronghold appears at least fifty times in the Bible. It commonly referred to a fortress with a difficult access (see Judges 6:2; I Sam. 23:14). When King David first saw the city of Jerusalem, it was an old, ancient, cheerless fortress inhabited by enemies. No wonder it was twice called a stronghold (see II Sam. 5:7,9).

The Apostle Paul uses the term to describe a mindset or attitude. "For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh (for the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh, but mighty before God to the casting down of strongholds), casting down imaginations, and every high thing that is exalted against the knowledge of God, and bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ; and being in readiness to avenge all disobedience, when your obedience shall be made full." (2 Corinthians 10:3-6 ASV)

We do not grit our teeth and redouble our efforts. No, this is the way of the flesh. Our weapons are from God. They have divine power to demolish strongholds. Isn't that what we want? We long to see our strongholds turned into rubble, once and for all, forever and ever, kaboom!

Maybe it's time for a different strategy.

Have you asked others to help you? Everything inside you says: keep the struggle a secret. Wear a mask, hide the pain. God says just the opposite: "Make this your common practice: Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you can live together whole and healed" (James 5:16 MSG). Satan indwells the domain of shadows and secrets. God lives in the land of light and honesty. Bring your problem into the open.

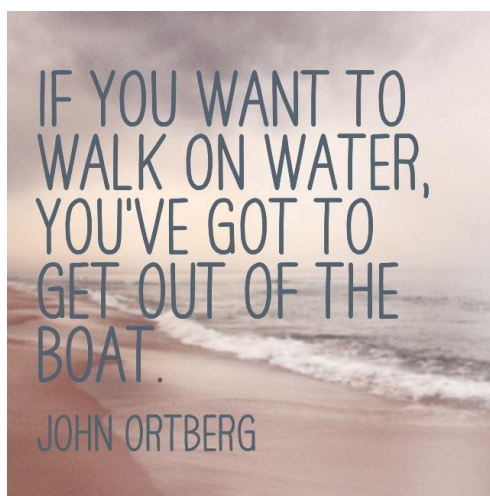
I know a young couple who battled the stronghold of sexual temptation. They wanted to save sex for the honeymoon, but didn't know if they could. So, they called for help. They enlisted the support of a mentoring, understanding married couple. They put the older couple's phone number on speed dial and asked their permission to call them, regardless of the hour, when the temptation was severe. When the wall was too tall, they took the tunnel.

Maybe it is time to get drastic. I had a friend who battled the stronghold of alcohol. He tried a fresh approach. If I ever saw him drinking, he gave me, and a few choice people, permission to slug him in the nose. The wall was too tall, so he tried the tunnel.

One woman counters her anxiety by memorizing long sections of Scripture. A traveling salesman asks the hotels to remove the TV from his room so he won't be tempted. Another man grew so weary of his prejudice toward non-whites, that he moved into an ethnically diverse neighborhood, made new friends and changed his attitude.

"God's power is very great for us who believe. That power is the same as the great strength God used to raise Christ from the dead and put him at his right side in the heavenly world." (Eph. 1:19, 20 NCV).

Ask for help. Get drastic. Try a fresh approach. Who knows, you may be a prayer away from a breakthrough.

Three late arriving boxes arrived for Operation Christmas Child making a total of 28 shoeboxes being returned. The tardy boxes

were delivered to the proper destination point. The shoebox is the first gift many children have ever received! The treasures and personal letters inside communicate that someone cares for them and give them an opportunity to experience the love of God.

No new requests for help have been received for the board to discuss.

To date, Deacons have received three names for Christmas food baskets. The baskets will contain donated food items supplemented with fresh fruit or vegetables. Deadline to receive names will be December 13th. The boxes will be packed on December 14th at 5:30 pm.

Every child on the Angel Tree will receive a gift from a member of our congregation. How wonderful to be part of a child's Christmas. Gifts will be delivered to Try Life and Mars Home for Youth. (We were informed that what we had been calling Tri-City Life is now known as Try Life.)

A flower chart for 2016 will soon be hanging in the hallway and members of the congregation can designate one of the beautiful flower arrangements for a memorial or in honor of someone or some occasion.

Christmas Eve service was discussed and ushers obtained for the 7 PM service. Kirk emphasized that lighting from the Christ candle should be done quickly and safely.

It was decided to support the "No Hungry Kids" program. The group seeks out grants and donations. As Deacons we decided to donate to their efforts. We feel this is a project worth supporting.

Receiving a mail solicitation from the American Bible Society seeking donations for Bibles for military members got the Deacons brainstorming of how to help local military. Two of our Deacons will contact the chaplain at the Armory located at the corner of Leechburg and Craigdell Roads to see how we might support personnel, perhaps an entire family. Until we get more information we don't really know how we will proceed with this venture, but we are hopeful that God is leading us into a new area of service.

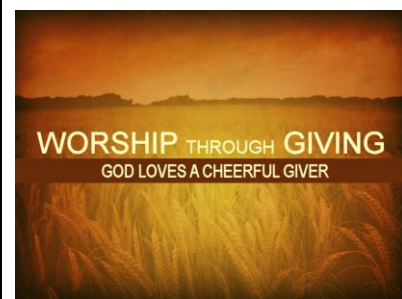

EXCITING OUTREACH NEWS!!



At the beginning of 2015, the Outreach Team held several meetings to generate ideas for reaching out into our community. Holy Spirit directed us to find a way to begin to connect with the local schools. About that same time, a gentleman named Mark Resetar happened to begin to make a connection with Puckety. Mark has a heart for outreach and has a way of connecting people. With his help and guidance, Puckety is beginning to work with other churches in our area on an exciting new outreach into our community. The **"No Kids Hungry"** weekend meals program for kids in Lower Burrell schools will be starting to feed elementary kids this next semester. This gives us an awesome way to serve others and helps us 'get our feet in the door' at our schools. We will earn the right to help in ways that will introduce families to Jesus.

The Choir Room in the downstairs of Puckety Church is the location for storing and packing the food items. Participants are needed to help with food storage, donations, packing, shopping, and prayer. Imagine shopping with others at Sam's Club for over 150 kids with money that has already been collected! Or, put yourself in the position to spend an hour on a Wednesday morning talking with kids from the high school who are packing food into bags for the young kids! This is only the beginning of ways to serve and begin to build our connection with the schools. This program has received support from the teachers all the way up through Burrell's superintendent.

At the Thanksgiving Worship Service and Food Drive at Burrell Community Church, the offering totaled \$1600 and over \$700 in food items was collected! This means that the 1st four weeks of the weekend meals have been provided for already. Eight area churches were present. Quite a few folks committed that night to volunteer their help while others committed to making monthly donations of food and monetary support.

Tax deductible monetary donations can be turned in using the Sunday offering plate or to the church office. Make your checks out to Puckety Church and put 'No Kids Hungry' in the memo and/or write 'No Kids Hungry' on the outside of an envelope. Our treasurer will insure that the money is sent to the fund for the program. Or, checks may be made payable to "PAPP" (Parnassus Area Preservation Partnership), a non-profit that will hold and disburse the funds. Please drop off any food donations between 9:00 AM and noon from Monday – Wednesday, or before or after the Sunday morning worship service. If you'd like to participate in a physical form, there is a sign-up sheet for all of the different tasks on the bulletin board outside the church office.

Most importantly, what is needed is your prayers. Please pray for those who are working to make this happen; for the kids who need this nourishment; for their parents to recognize God at work; for the teachers and administration; for all those involved to experience Holy Spirit moving among us.
