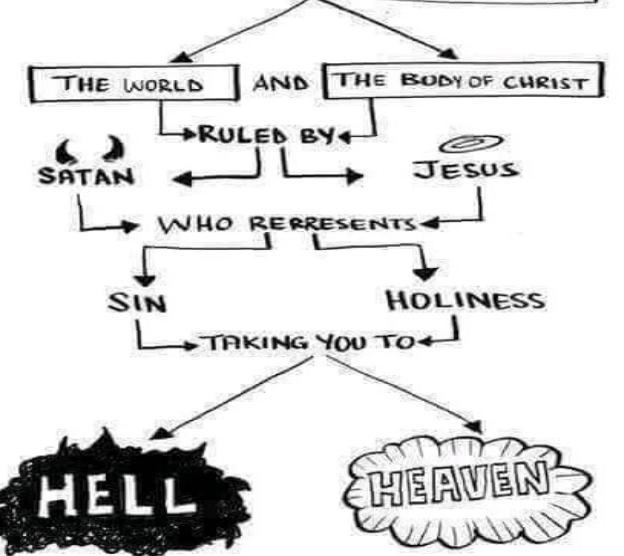

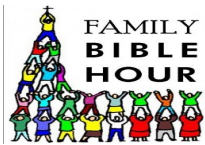




AUDITORIUM CLASS: Brother Zack Holmes has just begun a new class on Wednesdays on the Minor Prophets.

JACK'S CORNER



“ASSUMPTION”

In the Bible we see a man who has suffered the ultimate. His livestock, which were his means of livelihood, were all destroyed, his servants were killed, his seven sons and three daughters were all killed as they were eating together. His body was stricken with painful boils from the top of his head to the soles of his feet.

We know this man as Job, a man who was described as blameless, upright, who feared God, and shunned evil (Job 1:8).

Job's three friends came to comfort him. The first, Eliphaz, basically told Job he couldn't be innocent or he wouldn't be suffering (4:7). Bildad insinuated that he wasn't earnestly seeking God, and that he was a hypocrite (8:5, 13). The third friend, Zophar, accused Job of being deceitful and wicked (11:11).

How could these supposed “friends” have been so cruel and hurtful?! Could they not see the righteous life of Job?

These men incorrectly assumed something that was far from the truth. Are we ever guilty of assuming things about others? Do we think that bad things happen to our fellow Christians because they are ungodly? Do we assume they are not as “holy” as we, if they do not conduct themselves according to our standards?

Undoubtedly, there are those who claim to be Christians that are not faithful. Their lifestyle betrays them. But, let us be careful that we do not place ourselves up on a pedestal of pride and arrogance, assuming we are so much better than some of our fellow brothers and sisters.

Job called his friends “miserable comforters” (16:2). In the end, they were the ones at fault, and God told Job to pray for them. Let us be careful that we do not develop an attitude of assuming the worst in others.
