PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Question: Why doesn't our Easter Break match up with the Public Schools' Spring break schedule?

Years ago, when Catholic Schools were mostly taught by Religious Sisters, the week after Easter, known as the Easter Octave, is when all of the Nuns would go on a Silent Retreat. Pastors would often go on their Retreat at that time as well. Additionally, the Triduum is a sacred time. So that families could celebrate services together and fully enter into the Spirit of this solemn, holy time, it made sense to start the Break before Holy Thursday. Therefore, a religious Easter break (not a secular Spring Break) would be celebrated by the entire school

While none of the schools in Southern Maryland have Religious Sisters associated with their school anymore, several schools within the Archdiocese of Washington still do, so the Catholic Schools Office still traditionally sets that week after Easter as our Easter Break on our School Calendar.
