No. 4 Ohio St rallied from a 26-14 fourth quarter deficit to defeat No. 9 Penn St 27-26 last Saturday night. The Buckeyes failed to cover as 3.5-point favorites but were +300 underdogs in live in-game wagering during the 4Q.

ATS Notables

Washington St is 5-0 ATS this year while Appalachian St, Georgia Southern, Utah St and West Virginia are all 4-0 ATS. On the other side, Florida Atlantic and Bowling Green are 0-5 ATS while Nebraska is 0-4 ATS.

Missouri, South Alabama, New Mexico, Ohio, Toledo, Rice and Wake Forest have all seen the OVER go 4-0 in their games this year. Meanwhile the UNDER is 4-0 in Washington, North Texas, BYU and Georgia Southern games.

Misleading Finals

North Carolina had a 24-14 first down edge but had 6 TO's in a 47-10 blowout loss at Miami last Thursday. The Hurricanes scored 3 defensive TD's becoming the first ACC team to do it in a game since 2006. Miami actually had more points (47) than offensive plays (46).

California was one of the rare losers on these pages last week (6-2 on best bets) as they fell at home to Oregon 42-24. However, Cal had a 25-21 FD edge but coughed the football up five times and Oregon scored 2 defensive TD's.

East Carolina had 25-18 FD and 492-271 yard edges but only beat Old Dominion 37-35 needing a last minute FG for the win.

Louisville had 24-16 FD and 421-370 yard edges but also had 3 TO's in a 28-24 loss to Florida State. The Noles were down 24-14 with less than 10 minutes left and a 58-yard TD pass with 1:13 left was their first lead of the game.

Boston College RB A.J. Dillon (ankle) is ? for this week's game at NC State. Dillon already has 652 yards rushing this season.

Clemson QB Trevor Lawrence (head) was KO'd in the second quarter from last week's game vs Syracuse and didn't return. He has been upgraded to probable for this week's game at Wake Forest.

New Mexico QB Tevaka Tuioti (collarbone) is out for the season.

North Texas QB Mason Fine (leg) is ? for this week's game at UTEP.

Stanford RB Bryce Love (ankle) left last week's game vs Notre Dame and is ? this week vs Utah.

Toledo QB Mitchell Guadagni (head) was KO'd from last week's game vs Fresno St and is ? for this week's game vs Bowling Green.

In a shocking announcement on Monday, **UNLV QB Armani Rogers (foot)** is out for 6-8 weeks. Max Gilliam will start for the Rebels.

UTEP QB Kai Locksley (ankle) has been downgraded to doubtful for this week's game vs North Texas.

Bad Beats From Last Week

There weren't many glaring bad beats last weekend in College Football. However, one notable one came in the **USC/Arizona game**. While the Trojans dominated for most of the game and led 24-0 in the second half, the Wildcats stormed back in the fourth quarter. After a TD with 1:40 left, all Arizona (+3.5) backers needed was for the Wildcats to make the extra point. They missed and came up a 0.5-point short.

The **West Virginia/Texas Tech** game looked like it was going UNDER the 75.5 total. With under 3 minutes left, West Virginia led 35-27 but the Mountaineers got a 51-yard interception return TD. Then on the ensuing drive, the Red Raiders would score a TD with :38 left to put the game OVER.

Be careful backing **Alabama** with huge point-spreads. Last week the Crimson Tide led 49-0 at halftime over UL-Lafayette and were already covering the 48.5-point spread. However, the Tide only managed 7 points in the second half as head coach Nick Saban usually goes ultra-conservative with big leads.

Recapping Week Three Best Bets

It was another winning week for our best bets on these pages (that's 4 in a row!) as they went 6-2. The Colleges did go 3-2 with a couple of bad losers on BYU and Cal. However, we did pick up three easy wins on Fresno St, LSU and the UNDER in the Ohio St/Penn St game. The NFL continued their unbelievable start to the season with another 3-0 week. **The Patriots ended up being our 5★ Game of the Month in a 24.5-point blowout cover over the Dolphins.** The Bengals were outright winners and we were extremely fortunate to win with the Raiders. We're now 11-1 on the season in the NFL and remarkably now 118-75-3 (61%) all-time on these pages in the pros. Please remember gambling is a marathon, not a sprint. And while there's plenty of football left, we do find the last four weeks somewhat fitting considering we wrote dozens of full-season refund checks after the colleges had an 0-5 start to the season in week one. Games in Rotation Order
Thursday, October 4th

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

HOUSTON 41 Tulsa 26. Both teams come in off byes. Houston is playing with revenge from a 45-17 (-13.5) loss from a year ago. However, in Tulsa's last game, the Golden Hurricane had 32-16 first down and 403-300 yard edges vs Temple but lost 31-17. Tulsa had 5 TO's and two of them were returned for touchdowns. We feel that gives them some slight value here. Lean Tulsa.

TROY 35 Georgia St 17. Last week Georgia St had a 487-262 yard edge in their 46-14 (+5.5) upset of ULM including a school-record 308 yards on the ground. Meanwhile Troy got a 45-21 win over Coastal Carolina. Troy got a 96-yard KR TD on the first play and didn't look back. We're leaning with the home team here as it's a short travel week for the Panthers.

Friday, October 5th
MARSHALL 30 Middle Tennessee 23. Last week Marshall escaped with a 20-17 win at WKU. The Herd got a TD with 1:44 left while WKU fumbled at the Marshall 10-yard line in the final seconds. On the other side, Middle Tennessee rallied from a 21-3 deficit to beat FAU. Marshall did dominate this game last year on the road (38-10, -1.5) but we're passing.

Georgia Tech 27 LOUISVILLE 26. Last week Georgia Tech crushed Bowling Green 63-17 as the Yellow Jackets had a 9.5-4.5 yards per play advantage. On the other side, Louisville had 24-16 FD and 421-370 yard edges but also had 3 TO's in a 28-24 loss to Florida State. The Noles were down 24-14 with less than 10 minutes left and a 58-yard TD pass with 1:13 left was their first lead of the game. While it's tough prepping for the option on a short week, new Louisville DC Brian VanGorder saw the option plenty of times while DC at Notre Dame (2014-2016). Also Georgia Tech is not only 0-8 ATS in their last 8 games as a road favorite, they've lost all 8 games straight up including 4 by double-digits. We like the home team.

BYU 28 Utah St 24. BYU has revenge from a 40-24 loss (-1) last year. The Aggies do come in fresh off a bye at 4-0 ATS while BYU is hurting after a 35-7 blowout loss at Washington last week. We dropped a 2★ on these pages as it was total domination by Washington with 26-7 FD and 464-194 yard edges. Slight lean on BYU.

Saturday, October 6th

GEORGIA SOUTHERN 34 South Alabama 21. South Alabama was crushed by Appalachian St last week as the Mountaineers had a 348-83 rush yard edge. Allowing that kind of a rushing total prior to facing the option is not a good sign. On the other side, Georgia Southern is off a 28-21 upset win over Arkansas St as the Eagles got a dramatic 47-yard TD run with :19 left! Do note that Arkansas St had 28-15 FD and 493-409 yard edges. We're passing.

South Florida 41 MASSACHUSETTS 27. UMass is playing their 7th straight game while USF is coming off a bye. The Minutemen have been a big disappointment this year and last week fell at Ohio 58-42 as their defense allowed 664 yards and Ohio had a 394-41 rush yard edge. UMass QB Ford did return from injury and threw for 355. After the game, head coach Mark Whipple made an insensitive comment and is suspended for this game. D.C. Ed Pinkham will serve as interim head coach for the game. This is a unique trip for USF. We're passing.

Clemson 38 WAKE FOREST 20. Obviously, the main question here is the health status of Clemson QB Trevor Lawrence. He is probable here but will Clemson be cautious and conservative now with QB runs after he took that vicious hit last week? Last week the Tigers would have lost to 24-point underdog Syracuse if not for a late 4th&6 conversion. Clemson did have a 293-61 rush yard edge and a 28-12 FD edge but had 3 TO's. Lawrence's replacement Chase Brice was 7 of 13 for 83 yards with an 0-1 ratio. On the other side, Wake crushed Rice 56-24 but Wake only had 20-19 FD and 414-370 yard edges. The Demon Deacons got 2 defensive TD's after firing their DC last week while WR Dortch had 4 TD receptions. We're passing as Wake is 4-0 ATS recently in the series.

TEMPLE 37 East Carolina 23. Last week Temple surprised us again. They had a 452-423 yard edge vs Boston College but had 3 TO's in the 10-point loss (Temple covered). The Owls QB's continue to struggle but money poured in on Temple all week as the line dropped. On the other side, East Carolina had 25-18 FD and 492-271 yard edges but only beat Old Dominion 37-35 needing a last minute FG for the win. We like the Owls here but we haven't had a great pulse on them this year.

2★ Northern Illinois 28 BALL ST 21. NIU has won 9 straight meetings over Ball St going 7-2 ATS. The Huskies are also on a 28-5 SU and 25-8 ATS run on the road in MAC play. Last week NIU had a 356-242 yard edge (but 3 TO's) in a triple OT win at Eastern Michigan. Meanwhile Ball St had 606 yards in a 52-24 win over Kent St as QB Neal threw for 402 yards. We like Northern Illinois here.

Syracuse 31 PITTSBURGH 28. Last week Syracuse nearly pulled off another huge upset over Clemson as they blew a 23-13 4Q lead. Clemson did have a 293-61 rush yard edge and a 28-12 FD edge but had 3 TO's. On the other side, Pitt head coach Pat Narduzzi has to be feeling some heat as they were crushed by UCF 45-14. Rare road favorite role for Syracuse however since 2005, Syracuse is 7-0 SU/6-1 ATS as a road favorite. We're passing.

CENTRAL FLORIDA 48 Smu 24. UCF has now won 17 straight games after a 45-14 blowout win over Pitt last week. The Knights were dominant with 31-16 FD and 568-272 yard edges. QB Milton had 6 more total TD's! On the other side, SMU had a 653-301 yard edge in a 63-27 win over Houston Baptist. The Knights need style points if they are going to get into the playoff discussion but SMU has played well with Michigan and TCU this year. Pass.

FLORIDA ATLANTIC 41 Old Dominion 24. Last week FAU blew a 21-3 lead at Middle Tennessee as the Owls are now 0-5 ATS this year! That shouldn't come as a big surprise as head coach Lane Kiffin has not handled high expectations well in the past. On the other side, ODU got their second straight cover in last minute loss at East Carolina. However, East Carolina had 25-18 FD and 492-271 yard edges. We think FAU gets their first cover of the season.

OHIO ST 42 Indiana 21. Indiana is 6-1 ATS vs Ohio St the last 7 years with an average cover by 10 ppg. The Hoosiers are catching the Buckeyes off an emotional come-from-behind win at Penn St last week. OSU had only 228 yards on their first 15 drives and 14 points. Their last 2 drives, they had 171 yards and 13 points! The Buckeyes defense is banged up and susceptible vs the QB run. Indiana

QB Ramsey is mobile and the Hoosiers had a somewhat misleading final last week vs Rutgers as they led 24-7 at halftime. We like the Hoosiers in this one.
NC STATE 31 Boston College 27. Last week, NC State got a 35-21 win vs Virginia. QB Finley is averaging 328 pass ypg (69%) with a 8-1 ratio this year. On the other side, Boston College had a 45-35 non-covering win vs Temple. BC All-American RB Dillon hurt his ankle in the game and didn't return. He is questionable here. Until his status clears, we're passing.

FLORIDA 21 Lsu 20. Last week we cashed on these pages with LSU as the Tigers crushed Ole Miss 45-16. LSU had a 573-328 yd edge and were up 28-3 early and never looked back. LSU QB Burrow had his best game with 292 yards passing and 96 yards rushing. On the other side, Florida had a 357-202 yard edge in a 13-6 upset win at Mississippi St. New Florida head coach Dan Mullen knows LSU well from Miss St days. He's on a 4-0 ATS run vs them with an average cover of 16 ppg. We like the Gators here but obviously got it at a much better number. In fact, Florida +3.5 was one of our stronger plays in this week's Sunday Night Owl issue (College Plays 65% this year!!!).

SOUTH CAROLINA 31 Missouri 30. Missouri comes in off a bye here. Last year the Tigers won the stats vs South Carolina (423-359 yard edge) but the Gamecocks got a 31-13 win. Last week, South Carolina lost 24-10 at Kentucky. UK controlled the game but SC did have 4 TO's. Even though both teams like to run a lot of tempo, we feel that's built into the number and we lean UNDER.

MICHIGAN 36 Maryland 16. Last week Michigan pulled the biggest come-back for a Harbaugh coached college team. Down 17-0, they rallied for a 20-17 win as the Wolverines had a 180-28 rush yard edge. The Wolverines are a good bully as they are 3-0 ATS vs the Terps with an average cover by 16 ppg. We though we would really like Michigan here however, the situation favors the Terps off a bye. Meanwhile, Wolverines off a tough game vs Northwestern with games against Wisconsin and Michigan St on deck. Slight lean on Michigan.

CINCINNATI 29 Tulane 23. Last week Cincinnati had a 659-266 yard edge in a 49-7 pasting of Connecticut. At 5-0, the Bearcats have already topped their opening season win total at South Point! On the other side, Tulane got the biggest upset of the weekend last week beating Memphis 40-24 as 2-TD underdogs. Remarkably, Tulane had a 318-31 rushing yard edge. Keep in mind, Memphis had the No. 1 rusher (Henderson) in the country and the Tulane D was allowing 492 ypg coming in. We want to play on both teams. Pass.

Ohio 43 KENT ST 30. Ohio comes in off a 58-42 win over UMass last week as the Bobcats' offense put up 664 yards including a 394-41 rush yard edge. Meanwhile, Kent St was crushed by Ball St 52-24 as the Golden Flashes allowed 606 yards. They were also sloppy with 3 TO's and 17 penalties. The scoreboard operator should be busy here but we can't lay 2 TD's on the road with that Ohio defense. Pass.

WESTERN MICHIGAN 30 Eastern Michigan 26. Eastern Michigan is on a 12-1 ATS run as a road dog. It will be interesting to see how the Eagles respond after yet another close loss last weekend. This time vs Northern Illinois in 3 OT's as EMU missed 2 FG's! On the other side, Western Michigan got a close win at Miami, OH. The Broncos had 31-20 FD and 562-349 yard edges but WMU was -2 TO's, allowed a 99-yard KR TD and were SOD at the Miami 2. Slight lean on the UNDER.

Buffalo 30 CENTRAL MICHIGAN 21. Last week Buffalo was crushed at home by Army 42-13 as the Bulls were actually TD favorites. Buffalo WR Anthony Johnson only played a few snaps. On the other side, Central Michigan had a respectable effort vs Michigan St last week. However, note that the Chips were down 31-3 late 3Q. Pass.

AKRON 27 Miami, OH 24. Akron is coming off a bye here while Miami, OH is off yet another close loss, this time to Western Michigan 40-39. The Redhawks are now 5-20 straight up under head coach Chuck Martin in games decided by 9 points or less and he needs to be feeling some heat in Oxford as they haven't gotten over the hump. The trend will continue this week.

Notre Dame 26 VIRGINIA TECH 27. Last week Notre Dame crushed Stanford 38-17. It was total domination by ND as they had 29-10 FD and 550-229 yard edges. QB Ian Book was 24 of 33 for 278 yards and 4 TD's and they got back RB Dexter Williams (161 rush yds). On the other side, Virginia Tech rebounded nicely after the upset loss to Old Dominion as they pulled the upset at Duke 31-14. QB Ryan Wills in his 1st start was 17 of 27 for 332 yards and 3 TD's! He may actually be an upgrade over Josh Jackson especially as a passer.

Notre Dame is just 3-15 SU on the road vs ranked teams since 2006. This should be one of the most hostile environments in CFB this year as the Hokies are unveiling a Frank Beamer statue. We even bet Va Tech here at a bad number but clearly like the Hokies.

Illinois 26 RUTGERS 25. Illinois comes in off a bye. In their last game, the Fighting Illini actually led Penn St 24-21 in the 3Q but allowed a 42-0 run in the final 20 minutes. On the other side, Rutgers got a cover last week vs Indiana as they only lost by 7 as near 17-point home dogs. Illinois is 8-38 SU on the road and 3-7 ATS as a road favorite the last 11 years. Lean Rutgers.

BOISE ST 30 San Diego St 16. San Diego St does come in off a much-needed bye as they will be without both QB Chapman and RB Washington in this game. On the other side, Boise St had 29-11 FD and 506-295 yard edges in a win and cover at Wyoming last week. However note that since 2011, Boise St is just 14-31 ATS as a home favorite. We're passing on the side and lean UNDER. **COLORADO 31 Arizona St 28.** Arizona St has owned this series with an 8-1 SU/7-2 ATS mark. Both teams come in off blowout wins last week. The Sun Devils got a 52-24 win over Oregon St as RB Eno Benjamin had a school-record 312 rushing yards. Meanwhile, Colorado got a 38-16 win over UCLA as the Buffs had a 477-289 yard edge. They are now 4-0 first time since 1998! However, who have the Buffs played? We lean with the UNDER.

Liberty 33 NEW MEXICO ST 28. This is the first of two meetings between these two as Liberty hosts New Mexico St on November 24. Liberty has been an extremely high variance team this year at 2-2 SU/ATS. Their final scores have been off the point spread by an average of 27 ppg! Last week the Flames pulled the outright upset at New Mexico as they led 42-10 at halftime. On the other side, New Mexico St is coming off a bye after a win at UTEP. We're stunned that Liberty didn't decide to stay in New Mexico for the week as they are flying back and forth.

North Texas 38 UTEP 13. Last week, North Texas had a 427-359 yard edge but had 2 TO's and also missed two FG's in the 4Q of a home upset loss to Louisiana Tech. QB Mason Fine was banged up but he is probable here. The same can't be said for UTEP QB Kai Locksley who is doubtful here. Last week UTEP had a 297-278 yard edge but still dropped their 17th consecutive game (30-21 at UTSA). North Texas is a 26.5-point favorite in this one. That's the largest away favorite role for the Mean Green in school history! We're passing.

Washington 36 UCLA 16. Last week Washington finally got margin over a team as they crushed BYU 35-7. Washington had 26-7 FD and 464-194 yard edges and QB Browning was 23 of 25 for 277 yards. On the other side, UCLA dropped their 13th straight road game falling at Colorado 38-16. This is the 3rd largest home underdog role ever for UCLA and they were 2-0 ATS in other big dog roles. That keeps us from backing UW here.

STANFORD 27 Utah 21. We feel Stanford is a little overrated. The Cardinal were dominated worse than the final last week vs Notre Dame (ND 29-10 FD and 550-229 yard edges) and had a fortunate comeback vs Oregon. Obviously, the No. 1 question here is the health status of Stanford RB Bryce Love. His ankle was rolled up last week at ND. They've been very cautious with him so far this season. On the other side Utah's defense was ranked No. 1 heading into the Washington St game last week. However, their pass defense was torched for 445 yards in a 28-24 loss (allowed the game-winner, an 89-yarder with 4:14 left). Until Love's status clears. We're passing here.

Fresno St 35 NEVADA 26. Last week we cashed with Fresno on these pages but then upgraded them to our strongest CFB side play of the month for VIP customers in their 49-27 win over Toledo. Fresno had 554 yards and led 49-13 entering the 4Q. QB McMaryion was 24 of 31 for 368 yards with a 4-1 ratio. Keep in mind that was the same Toledo team that beat Nevada 63-44 the week prior albeit it was misleading. On the other side, money poured in on Nevada all last week and that proved correct as the Wolf Pack got the road upset win at Air Force. Nevada had a 436-250 yard edge and led 28-10 with AF getting an interception return TD. We lean with the home team here.

Washington St 40 OREGON ST 24. Last week Washington St got a 28-24 come-from-behind win over Utah getting an 89-yard TD with 4:14 left. Wazzu had a 445-322 yard edge but it was a disparate box score with Utah having a 204-0 rushing edge and Washington St having a 445-118 pass edge. That's now 10 straight home wins for the Cougs, their longest streak since World War II. On the other side, Oregon St was run over by Arizona St 52-24. The Beavers run defense has allowed 838 yards and 8.5 ypc the last two weeks but Wazzu is a pass-happy team that won't take advantage. On the positive side for Oregon St is that frosh RB Jermar Jefferson had 254 rush yards. We're passing.

California 28 ARIZONA 27. The early money has been on Cal as they opened +1.5 and are now 2-point road favorites. Last week California was one of the rare losers on these pages (6-2 on best bets) as they fell at home to Oregon 42-24. However, Cal had a 25-21 FD edge but coughed the football up five times and Oregon scored 2 defensive TD's. On the other side, Arizona trailed USC 24-0 in the second half only to make a big rally. However, on the Wildcats final TD, they missed the ensuing extra point, leaving Arizona (+3.5) backers with a bad beat. This goes down to the wire.

UNLV 36 New Mexico 26. UNLV comes in off a bye while New Mexico suffered a 52-43 upset loss to Liberty last week (actually trailed 42-10 at half-time). Both teams are dealing with QB injuries. New Mexico QB Tevaka Tuioiti (collarbone) is out for the season while in a shocking announcement on Monday, UNLV QB Armani Rogers (foot) is out for 6-8 weeks. Max Gilliam will start for the Rebels. We're passing.

2★ Northwestern (plus the points) MICHIGAN ST 24 Northwestern 17. Last week Northwestern gave a great effort in a 20-17 loss vs Michigan. Northwestern had 145 yards in their 1st 3 drives and were up 17-0. However, in their last 9 drives, they only had 77 yards. Michigan controlled last 40 minutes On the other side, Michigan St was up 31-3 late 3Q over Central Michigan but only won 31-20. MSU QB Lewerke has a 5-5 ratio this year after having a 20-7 ratio a year ago. He's been forcing throws since the opener. Northwestern is 24-9 ATS as a road underdog the last 11 years. We like the Cats.

WEST VIRGINIA 45 Kansas 17. Last week West Virginia improved to 4-0 SU/ATS on the season as they beat Texas Tech 42-34. The Mountaineers actually led 35-10 at halftime but had to hang on in the second half. QB Will Grier was 27 for 41 with 370 yards and 3 TD's. On the other side, Kansas fell at Oklahoma St 48-28 as OSU had a 568-368 yard edge. Can't recommend laying the 4 TD's here but the Mountaineers can name their score and pad QB Grier's Heisman campaign.

Alabama 48 ARKANSAS 13. Last week, Alabama led UL-Lafayette 49-0 at halftime before they took the foot off the gas pedal in the second half allowing ULL to get the back door cover. Alabama in the first half this year is outscoring their opponents 197-20 so far (39-4 average!). The second half has been a different story at only 74-45 (15-9 average). On the other side, it's been a dreadful start to the Chad Morris era but the Hogs played a solid game last week in a 7-point loss to A&M. While Arkansas was going to be known for offense under new head coach Chad Morris, they shockingly have held their last 3 opponents to season-lows in yards. This is the largest home underdog role ever for Arkansas. We're passing.

LOUISIANA TECH 31 Uab 26. Last week, UAB won their 9th consecutive home game (school-record) as they handled Charlotte 28-7. Meanwhile, Louisiana Tech got a 29-27 road upset at North Texas. NT had a 427-359 yard edge but 2 TO's and two missed FG's in the 4Q really helped the Bulldogs. While LT has revenge for a loss against UAB last year, we like the road dog.

3★ TEXAS A&M 30 Kentucky 20. A&M head coach Jimbo Fisher was upset after last week's win. "Probably played our worst football game of the year by far." A&M has a 24-11 FD edge but QB Mond only had an 0-2 ratio. We expect the Aggies to have a bounce back effort here. Meanwhile Kentucky is off to their best SEC start since 1977 is in a bit of a let-down spot here after two big home games. This is their 1st ever trip here to Kyle Field and the "12th Man" should be rocking Saturday Night. Look for the Aggies to make KY one-dimensional on offense. We even bet this game at a bad number thinking the line would go to -7.

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BRAD POWERS' ATS STAT OF THE WEEK:
Dating back to his days as OC at Iowa St. Tom Herman coached teams are 22-1 ATS as underdogs. Herman is 11-1 ATS as a head coach in the underdog role with 8 outright upsets. This week Tom Herman coached Texas is +8 vs Oklahoma.

GEORGIA 43 Vanderbilt 13. Last week Vandy nearly lost outright as a 4-TD favorite to Tennessee St. Vandy had a 256-104 rush yard edge but 2 TO's and 2 missed FG's. On the other side, Georgia thumped Tennessee 38-12 as the Bulldogs had a 251-66 rush yard edge. We're leaning with the Bulldogs here.

3★ Iowa 27 MINNESOTA 16. Iowa is 12-2-1 ATS as a road favorite should be angry off a bye after blowing the Wisconsin game in the final minute two weeks ago. Meanwhile, the last we saw of Minnesota they were getting their doors blown off at Maryland. The Hawkeyes have the No. 3 total defense in country and we're not sure how Minnesota scores with a walk-on true frosh QB. Also Minnesota is a depth-shy with cluster injuries at RB and DB playing a lot of underclassmen. We like the Hawkeyes.

TOLEDO 45 Bowling Green 24. Toledo has beat arch rival Bowling Green in 8 straight meetings (5-2-1 ATS). Last week we cashed our strongest CFB side play of September against the Rockets as they fell behind Fresno St 49-13. UT QB Guadagni was hurt (? here) and his replacement Eli Peters was 10 of 21 for 179 yards with a 2-1 ratio. On the other side, Bowling Green was crushed by Georgia Tech last week, 63-17. BG is now 0-5 ATS this season and head coach Mike Jinks is 7-22-1 ATS in his career! Pass.

Auburn 21 MISSISSIPPI ST 19. Both teams have really been struggling on offense as of late. The Mississippi St offense has only managed 13 combined points and 403 yards in the last couple of weeks (both losses) as they are having trouble protecting QB Fitzgerald. Meanwhile, Auburn has cluster injuries on the offensive line and in their last two games, they've had less than 100 yards rushing against the likes of Arkansas and Southern Miss. We lean UNDER.

Navy 24 AIR FORCE 23. Navy does come in off a bye. On the other side, Air Force lost at home to Nevada last week as the Wolf Pack had a 436-250 yard edge and the Falcons made the final look more respectable (trailed 28-10). We like the home dog here who is on a 5-1 ATS run in that role. Also the home team has won 5 straight in the series.

OLE MISS 48 UL-Monroe 24. Last week we cashed on these pages fading the Rebels as they were stomped at LSU 45-16. LSU had a 573-328 yd edge and were up 28-3 early. On the other side, ULM was stunned on the road at Georgia St as the WarHawks were near TD favorites but lost 46-14. Georgia St had a 487-262 yard edge including a school-record 308 on the ground. Meanwhile, ULM had 4 TO's and allowed a PR TD. We lean UNDER.

† **Oklahoma 33 Texas 27.** @Cotton Bowl in Dallas, TX. Texas is 5-0 ATS vs Oklahoma the last 5 years with an average cover by 15 ppg. Each of the last 4 meetings have all been decided by 7 points or less. Last week Texas had a 339-217 yard edge vs Kansas St but failed to cover in a 19-14 win. The Horns were up 19-0 at halftime and that included a 90-yard PR TD. On the other side, OU QB Murray was 17 of 21 for 432 yards and 6 TD's in the Sooners 66-33 win and cover over Baylor. We feel the Texas defense is underrated. Everyone watches the Maryland game in the season opener and sees them get run over. Reality is the last 2 years excluding games vs the Terps (allow 42.5 ppg), the Horns are allowing just 18 ppg. Tom Herman coached teams are on a 22-1 ATS run as a dog dating back to 2011. He is 11-1 ATS as a head coach in the underdog role with 8 outright upsets.

MEMPHIS 52 Connecticut 17. UConn might have one of the worst defenses we've ever seen as last week the Huskies allowed 59 yards to Cincinnati. They are now allowing 663 ypg for the season (120 ypg worse than Oregon St who is No. 129 in the country). It doesn't get any easy this week for the Huskies D as they face an angry Memphis team off an upset loss to Tulane last week. This one will get ugly.

UL-LAFAYETTE 31 Texas St 28. Last week UL-Lafayette got the back door cover at Alabama after trailing 49-0 at halftime. Texas St comes in off a bye. The Bobcats are 0-5 all-time vs the Ragin' Cajuns with an average loss by 22 ppg. This one will be closer but ULL gets another SU win.

RICE 27 Utsa 26. Last week UTSA was out-gained by lowly UTEP 297-278 but the Roadrunners still got the 30-21 win. On the other side, Rice was destroyed by Wake Forest 56-24. However, Wake only had 20-19 FD and 414-370 yard edges as Rice allowed a pair of defensive scores. Sounds like a good opportunity for an "Inside-Out" handicap, but we actually lean with the dog.

BAYLOR 30 Kansas St 26. Last week Kansas St got the cover vs Texas but the Wildcats were outgained 339-217 and trailed 19-0 at halftime. Meanwhile, Baylor was crushed by Oklahoma 66-33. Kansas St is on a 22-7 ATS run as a road dog but this year's team looks like a far cry from past editions. Pass.

MIAMI, FL 30 Florida St 20. This one usually goes down to the wire including last year when Miami broke a 7-game losing streak with a last second TD pass. The Hurricanes had a misleading final last week vs North Carolina as they scored 3 defensive TD's off 6 TO's. No team in the ACC had done that since Boston College in 2006! Miami actually had more points (47) than plays (46). On the other side, did the Noles finally have a break-through in a come-from-behind win at Louisville last week? They were out-played for the first 50 minutes (down by 10 and outgained 421-370). This is the largest favorite role for Miami in this series since 2002 and while we like the Noles, we can't back them as a best bet on these pages because of a mismatch at the line of scrimmage. Florida St is near the bottom in the country giving up 43 TFL's this year. Meanwhile, Miami is No. 1 in country with 60 TFL's already!

WISCONSIN 38 Nebraska 17. Wisconsin comes in fresh off a bye while Nebraska continues to struggle. Last week the Huskers had a 582-516 yard edge but fell at home to Purdue 42-28. Nebraska first-year head coach Scott Frost said after the game, "In my opinion, we looked like one of the most undisciplined teams in the country, and it kills me." Nebraska now has a school-record 8 straight losses (2nd longest losing streak in country). That streak goes to 9.

Colorado St 33 SAN JOSE STATE 30. Colorado St comes in fresh off a bye. It's hard making the Rams a road favorite considering they are just 1-11 ATS in their last 12 games. However, how much does San Jose St have left in the tank after losing a 5 OT thriller at home to Hawaii last week. The Spartans could have won the game multiple times but missed 3 FG's. We're passing.

2★ Wyoming 31 HAWAII 30. Wyoming has won 7 of the last 8 meetings. Last week off a bye, Wyoming was thumped at home to Boise St 34-14. Boise had 29-11 FD and 506-295 yard edges. Meanwhile, how much does Hawaii have left in the tank here? This is their 7th straight game and they are off a 5 OT thriller at San Jose last week. Hawaii is incredibly 1-15 ATS in their last 16 games as a favorite. That's enough for us to take the road dog here especially getting the hook.

Week 6 Computer Projected Lines for Every CFB Game

For the past couple of seasons we have posted computer projected lines at pregame.com. Games where there was of difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 155-129-7 (55%) clip the last two years. That's pretty solid and actually better than our own handicapping (much to our dismay). So far this year's plays are 23-21. Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 14 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be **Air Force +3.5**.

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.

NEW ENGLAND 30 Indianapolis 20. Last week we won our 5★ NFL Game of Month on the Patriots in their easy win over the Dolphins 38-7. Now New England gets back Julian Edelman here and the panic has quieted after the 1-2 start. Meanwhile, Colts head coach Frank Reich's decision to go for it on 4th Down in OT vs Houston last week backfired as the Colts ended up losing a game they probably would've tied. Baltimore has basically had one bad quarter of football (1Q at Cincinnati) all year. Meanwhile, we were extremely fortunate to get a cover against the Browns last week in their OT loss to the Raiders. QB Baker Mayfield's 4 TO's were very costly and there was some "home-cooking" from the officiating on a couple calls. Jimmy Smith is back for Baltimore after his suspension and will be licking his chops against the rookie QB. Slight lean on the Ravens.

KANSAS CITY 24 Jacksonville 23. Patrick Mahomes passed another big test last Monday with a come-from-behind 4th quarter win at Denver. Obviously his left-handed pass on 3rd and long with pressure is one of the plays of the year so far in the NFL. KC is now the only 4-0 ATS team in the NFL as Andy Reid continues to thrive in the regular season. Meanwhile, the Jags come in off a blowout win over the Jets (Our sympathies to those that had the UNDER in that game). We lean with the road team here.

2★ BUFFALO 21 Tennessee 20. Tennessee is 3-1 this year and are remarkably coming off 3 straight outright upset wins. Last week the Titans rallied from 14-points in the 2H to take out the defending champs in OT. According to Marc Lawrence's Playbook, since 1992 away teams are just 13-41 SU and 16-38 ATS after upsetting the Super Bowl Champs. This is a bad spot for the Titans traveling to take on the Bills laying more than FG. Buffalo games have had high variance this year. Last week, they were thumped by the Packers but this is a good spot for them considering it's their only home game in a 5 week stretch. Upset!

CAROLINA 27 N.Y. Giants 17. Panthers come in off a bye and are 15-6 ATS as a home favorite. Meanwhile the Giants are off a lousy effort vs the Saints last week. The Giants have a below average run defense and their offensive woes continue despite the change at head coach. We don't like laying a TD in the NFL but Carolina is the only way to look here.

N.Y. JETS 23 Denver 20. We were hoping we would be catching the Broncos off a big Monday Night win but Denver blew a 10-point 4Q lead to Kansas City. It would have been ideal considering the short week and long travel and the fact the Broncos are just 1-10 SU/ATS on the road in their last 11 games. Obviously, since Week 1, rookie QB Sam Darnold has come back to earth. Still we lean with the Jets who have covered 8 of their last 10 home games.

PITTSBURGH 31 Atlanta 26. Right now, the Steelers are a mess after a 26-14 home loss to the Ravens on Sunday Night. At 1-2-1, they are about as "Jekyll and Hyde" as it gets in the NFL with several disparate first and second halves. Meanwhile Atlanta comes in off back-to-back last second home losses. The Falcons defense is extremely banged up and this isn't a great match-up for them. We lean with the Steelers.

Green Bay 27 DETROIT 24. Last year Detroit got their first season sweep of Green Bay since 1991 but note that Brett Hundley was QB'ing each game for the Packers. Even after a 22-0 win over Buffalo last week, Green Bay QB Aaron Rodgers again was calling out some of the play calls. This marriage between Rodgers and McCarthy seems a bit rocky these days. On the other side, the Lions are off a last-second loss to the Cowboys. Slight lean on the visitor.

CINCINNATI 26 Miami 23. Simple handicap for us here. On one side, you have a team coming off a thrilling last second win on the road. On the other, you have a team that was embarrassed by 30-points last week (we did cash our 5★ GOM on New England). The look ahead line on this game saw Cincinnati favored by only 4 last week so we've seen a 2.5-point adjustment after just one week. That seems a bit rich. We like the Dolphins.

3★ Oakland 27 L.A. CHARGERS 26. This will be a very pro Oakland crowd here at the Stub Hub Center. While the Raiders were extremely fortunate to get the win last week over the Browns, the monkey is now off the back of new head coach Jon Gruden as the Raiders had wilted in the fourth quarter in each of the first three weeks. They are clearly better than their 1-3 record. Meanwhile, the Chargers are allowing 30 ppg on defense this year and were nearly upset by a 0-3 ATS San Francisco team playing with a backup QB. The underdog is on a 15-3 ATS run in the series.

2★ Arizona (plus the points) SAN FRANCISCO 21 Arizona 20. This is the first road start for rookie QB Josh Rosen. The Cardinals who are the only 0-4 SU team in the NFL (first 0-4 start for them since 1986) have showed some life in each of the last two weeks in close losses to Chicago and Seattle. Meanwhile, the 49ers nearly pulled off a huge upset at the Chargers last week. Usually you get a one-game bump post a major QB injury (Beathard nearly 300 yards passing) and that was the case. However, it's tough laying more than a FG here with a San Fran team that is 0-6 SU vs the Cardinals the last 3 years. We're taking the ugly road dog here.

PHILADELPHIA 23 Minnesota 21. Rematch of last year's NFC Championship game where the Eagles manhandled the Vikings. We were hoping we would get the Eagles coming off an OT win last week. The Vikings were in a good spot off back-to-back losses with extra time to prepare. Head coach Mike Zimmer is on a 18-9-1 ATS run as an underdog while the Eagles look like they are in a Super Bowl hangover. However, at "3" this number seems about right.

L.A. Rams 27 SEATTLE 23. This is the largest home underdog role for Seattle since Pete Carroll's first season (2010) and it was the epic "Beast Mode" playoff game where the Seahawks won outright over the Saints as 10-point dogs. Last year the Rams embarrassed the Seahawks on this field 42-7 in Carroll's worst loss in 9 years. The Rams do have extra time to prep after last Thursday's win over Minnesota. Meanwhile, Seattle is off a last-second win at Arizona. Yes, the injury to Earl Thomas hurts, but we're leaning the home dog here.

HOUSTON 24 Dallas 20. Battle of the Lone star state here. The Cowboys are off a last-second win over Detroit last week as RB Elliott had 240 all-purpose yards. We lean with the Texans here who finally got off the mat (had lost 9 straight dating back to last year) with an OT win in Indianapolis last week. Slight lean on the home team.

Monday, October 8th

NEW ORLEANS 28 Washington 24. The Redskins do come in off a bye week after crushing the Packers. Meanwhile, the Saints have to be feeling good about themselves after notching back-to-back road wins. In last year's meeting the big underdog (+9.5) Redskins nearly won outright as they led 31-16 with 5:58 left. The Saints would score a couple of late TD's and got a game-winning FG in OT. Remarkably Washington is just 10-31 SU/11-30 aTS on Monday Night since 1987 but they have covered 5 straight in the Super Dome. Slight lean on the road team.
