


sailing ships hung from the ceiling, usually above the alter. Erik has been there and taken pictures to prove it. He will tell us why they do such a thing at the meeting. MJ

# President's Thoughts

Ask most people what the biggest day on the Norwegian calendar is and they would probably say the first day of the ice fishing season. Or you might ask the same people what country has the oldest national constitution in Europe that is still in use today? Of course the correct answer to both questions is Grunnlovsdagen of Norway; The Constitution Day of Norway.

The day is more commonly referred to as the Seventeenth of May or Syttende Mai. On May 17<sup>th</sup> in the year 1814 the Constitution of Norway was signed in Eidsvoll declaring Norway to be an independent kingdom. Unfortu-



nately, Sweden was unimpressed and continued to rule Norway for another hundred years, finally granting independence in 1905.

But since when has a Norwegian ever listened to a Swede? Instead, we celebrate Syttende Mai with big parades, dances, and food, lots and lots of food. And what do Norwegians eat, you may ask? Well, back in the old country (Minnesota), we just cleaned out all of the leftovers in the refrigerator, mixed it all together, put it in a corning ware dish, and stuck it in the oven. And after some time, the dish came out of the oven hot.

A Hot-dish was born! You might be from "the old country" if you have a hot dish that can also be used to fix a crack in the ceiling.

The aspect of "thanksgiving" could easily have been forgotten in the long span of years from 1814 along with maybe the old values freedom, equality and brotherhood, and the ideological basis for the constitution recognizing the heritage and culture of Norway. The culture of Norway might even include the sharing of stories about our native couple; Ole and Lena.

Help us celebrate Syttende Mai at our Lodge on May 14<sup>th</sup>, and bring your friends, relatives, neighbors and acquaintances to enjoy an afternoon of fellowship, Norwegian humor, and hot dishes. So, while you're listening to what happens when Lena dies, sign-up some new members, and happy Grunnlovsdagen!
