be in what is called "Holy Week." Some of you are familiar with "Holy Week" and others may be not as familiar. Take a look at the image below. This is what we mean when we say, "Holy Week." Share it with your family and friends. I have given you a few things to remember this week. You might remember pre-

vious experiences, or perhaps something you had forgotten. There may be some information that is new to you. See if you can identify each of the images below and remember more of the stories.

The first week of Holy Week includes Palm Sunday. That Sunday, you

will see our Sunday School children entering the sanctuary with palm branches. Palm Sunday is about Jesus' Entry into Jerusalem. We know from the stories that the disciples did what Jesus asked and they found a donkey and a colt. The crowds shouted, "Hosanna and Blessed is the one who comes in the Lord!" This was the beginning, yet Jesus knew that it was the ending on earth, for he would ultimately be with God.

During the Wednesday of Holy Week Jesus broke bread and said, "This is my body that is for you." Then Jesus took the cup and said "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this as often you drink it in remembrance of me." Jesus says, "For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes." Jesus knew he would soon go to his father. Jesus poured water into a bowl and washed the disciples' feet and wiped them.

The next day Jesus was sentenced to death, and he was crucified. The soldiers divided his clothing and cast lots. Jesus' side was pierced. He was dead. Joseph of Arimathea, a disciple of Jesus, took his body and wrapped it with spices in linen cloth. It was the Jewish day of

Preparation, and they laid Jesus in the nearby tomb.

At Community Presbyterian Church, we have a special worship service on Thursday, April 6, at 7:00 p.m.; it is called "Maundy Thursday." We also offer communion that evening. Good Friday, the next day, is when we remember that Jesus was crucified. We have another spe-

cial worship service that day at 7:00 p.m. This is an opportunity for you to ponder what Good Friday means for you.

Easter Sunday is a day to rejoice. The women went to see the tomb. Jesus was not there. Later they saw Jesus, and he told them to tell his brothers and sisters in Galilee.

Halleluiah! Jesus has risen! Join us on Easter Sunday at 10:00 a.m.! There are many more stories about Jesus and Holy Week. Open your Bible and find the stories between Palm Sunday and Easter. Let the ones you are drawn to be the ones you read.

The Personnel Committee's goal is to have the position filled by the end of the month but many factors go into this goal, mostly the quality of the candidates. We will be looking for congregational members to fill in case no candidate fills our needs. Meeting was closed by prayers.

Stewardship: The 2022 Audit Report was received, reviewed, and approved. It will be presented to the Session on March 15, 2023.

Goals for 2023 were further discussed. Our primary goal is to find a renter for the vacated preschool space. A meeting is scheduled with a real estate agent specializing in commercial properties for advice. An additional goal is to increase membership on the Stewardship Committee by at least one.

Reviewed the monthly financials. We received a large bill for snow removal for the season thus far, for over \$4,000. We have a YTD net operating loss as of the end of February of \$6,427.59.

We will begin presenting a quarterly snapshot of our financials, so the congregation will be informed of the financial needs of Community Presbyterian Church.

Discussed the open Treasurer position and the Office Assistant position. Interviews are being held for the Office Assistant. We will reach out to members of the congregation to see if anyone is interested in either the Office Assistant or the Treasurer position. We may need to consider paying a small stipend to a Treasurer, as well as a salary to the Office Assistant. Both were not in our 2023 budget, but we need to plan for an additional approximately \$16,000-plus in annual expense.

The current needs list includes the items above, as well as 1 pound bags of white or brown rice, canned tomatoes, beans, toothbrushes, deodorant, shampoo, conditioner, and body wash. You are welcome to donate those items as well.

There is also an on-going need for "Birthday Party in a bag." It's hard on parents to not be able to celebrate the birthday of their child, so if you wish, put a cake mix, can of frosting, and any additional decorations you wish in a plastic grocery bag, tie the handles, and label it "Birthday Cake." (No candles, please.)
