


Parish Breakfast This Sunday

QR codes are printed in the booklet for easy access to information for directions, Mass and Confession schedules. All the information is on the inside cover. The booklets will be stamped at the HOLY SITE churches as part of the gift opportunity. Pilgrim's Passports booklets are located at the entrances to the Church. Bishop Carroll Open House


