## **Hours of Operation**

Monday - Friday 1:00 – 6:30 PM Saturday 1:00 – 6:00 PM Sunday 10 am – 4:00 PM The Corvallis Men's Shelter is operating as a Hygiene Center during the COVID 19/Coronavirus emergency, providing service to both men and women in need. Services includes showers, laundry, drinking water, sack lunches daily, hot dinner on Monday and Tuesday (5:30-6:30pm), and a hot lunch on Wednesday and Friday (11:30 am - 12:30 PM). Additionally, help is available to persons seeking access to CARES Act support, health care assistance and social service connections. The Men's Shelter is grateful for support from local governmental, nonprofit and community partners in sustaining efforts to provide these services for those in need during the COVID pandemic.






**How can the public help?** Material donations of supplies to support our operations: paper cups towels, napkins, and lunch bags, snacks bottled water and juice, plus hygiene supplies can be dropped at the Shelter during open hours or at the Corvallis Daytime Drop-in Center where they will be distributed. As always, donations of socks, **underwear**, and seasonally appropriate clothing are appreciated. Remember to follow COVID 19 safeguards (list below) for donation drop-offs: and plan your drop-off while you are out on essential errands.

- \* Schedule a drop-off location and time.
- \* Wear protective mask and gloves.

- \* Wash and sanitize your hands.
- \* Keep a safe distance from others.
- \* Sanitize hard surfaces before sharing contents.



## How can I donate to the Shelter?

**Room at the Inn Women's Shelter,** hosted by First United Methodist Church is located at 12th & Jackson in Corvallis. The shelter is open to women 18 and older (no children or pets) 24 hours a day - seven days a week. In response to the COVID 19 pandemic our capacity has increased to 25 guests; this was achieved by moving beds into the main gym. Guests are provided three meals a day. Shelter staff hours have increased, and health and hygiene guidelines have changed to protect staff, guests and volunteers.

**Volunteers**: All volunteers must practice appropriate social distancing (physical, actually) with anyone outside of their own household members. Volunteers must be under 60 with no chronic health issues. Our most <u>urgent</u> need is for people to help with meals and overnight shifts, where you can have no close contact with anyone else. Both settings are carefully sanitized and we will provide a clean sanitized cloth mask for you to use while at the shelter, or you can bring your own. 

## **Corvallis Housing First & SORT Street Outreach Team**

Corvallis Housing First is a small but growing organization dedicated to providing support and housing to individuals experiencing homelessness in Corvallis. We currently operate three facilities that provide housing and support, and work with local agencies and shelters to provide

outreach and case management services. Following the philosophy of Housing First, we work to provide low-barrier, behavior-based housing without preconditions and barriers to entry, such as sobriety or treatment participation requirements. Our mission is to provide solutions for ending homelessness and achieving self-sufficiency. PHONE 541-230-1297

Volunteers: In partnership with the SORT team, CHF staff conduct outreach to people on the street and camping every Friday from 9-11am. We welcome volunteers to join us and provide training. Volunteers should be able to walk at least a mile with a 10-LB backpack. During the COVID crisis volunteers are needed to will help to build, place and maintain hand-cleaning stations to ensure access for proper and safe hygiene practices. People with tools and skill to design and construct hand-washing stations are needed. Training: Volunteers will receive on-the-job skills training and be accompanied by a SORT team leader while in the field. We also ask that volunteers complete Adult Mental Health First Aid training offered through Samaritan Health Service samhealth.org/healthservices/classes-and-events/m/e/mental-health-first-aid) and Trauma-Informed Care offered by the Benton County Health Department (Contact Kelly Locey for more information). 



The **Corvallis Daytime Drop-in Center** (CDDC) The is a vital service organization for people who are vulnerable, homeless, or in need. The CDDC's motto is "Where Needs Are Met," and the organization is a crucial resource hub for information, referral, and direct services for individuals experiencing poverty in our community. Beyond just meeting people's basic needs, the CDDC provides dignified assistance and advocacy, offers

opportunities for building community and social networks, and supports individuals' welfare and rehabilitation across emergency, transitional, and ongoing life circumstances. Among other things, we provide mental and behavioral health support; physical health support; food security; employment support; and social community. We are deeply committed to culturally responsive services that enable health and social equity for people who are chronically marginalized due to systemic poverty.

A new Corvallis program, Unity Shelter, will serve as an umbrella organization for three local programs that serve the area's unhoused population. Current programs such as the Men's Shelter, SafePlace and Room at the Inn will fit under the Unity Shelter banner. Each of those programs will continue to have its own leadership team and staff, while Unity Shelter will provide the overarching fiscal and operational leadership and management. Shawn Collins, program manager of the Men's Shelter in Corvallis, has been named the executive director of Unity

Shelter; Collins will continue his work at the Men's Shelter. The Rev. Jill McAllister, senior minister at the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship in Corvallis, is the president of the board of directors. "Unity Shelter represents a unique opportunity to have a comprehensive approach to low-barrier shelter and transitional housing, to address the needs of men, women and families," said Collins. "Unity Shelter is being built on a foundation of partnerships," McAllister said. "Each of the programs forming Unity Shelter has a history of partnership and collaboration. Each has a history of community support, and each has committed and talented advisory groups of their own. While each is a bit different in their program operations, they have a shared commitment to ensuring their services are trauma-informed, and provide a safe environment for their guests, volunteers, staff and the community." Mike Moore, a member of the Unity Shelter board of directors, said: "The arch over 'us' in our logo is representative of the umbrella nature of our organization. It is also a symbol of our unity and inclusiveness. The corporate name, Unity Shelter, and the logo most succinctly communicate our

mission and emphasize our desire to put unity in community."
