

AT&T/DIRECTV satellite dish equipment

To receive DIRECTV programming, your home simply needs a clear view of the southern sky, unblocked by trees or buildings.

Where do you install the satellite dish?

To receive TV programming, your home needs a clear view of the southern sky, unblocked by trees or buildings. Most dishes are installed on a roof or balcony, but other arrangements can be made to accommodate your structure and preferences as long as the dish is installed outside.

If you live in an apartment **or are part of a homeowners' association**, check with your landlord or management company about regulations for installing television service. You may need to fill out a Landlord/**H.O.A. Permission Form**.

Information about the installation of your satellite dish

The DIRECTV installation may require structural modifications that **may be limited** or restricted by the terms of your lease, rental agreement, or **covenants, conditions and restrictions (CC&Rs)**. To avoid delays in your installation, **please obtain written or verbal permission** from your landlord, **homeowners' association**, or **property manager** (or, alternatively, review your lease/rental agreement/**HOA CC&Rs to confirm permission is not required**) prior to scheduling your installation.
