MINUTES OF THE FEBRUARY 14, 2017 REGULAR MEETING

President Terry Sampson opened the regular meeting of The Hesperia Garden Club at 1:07 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Ginny Kight gave the Inspiration. Our guests stood and introduced themselves. The Minutes of the January 10, 2017 meeting were approved as read. Our Treasurer, Gail LaPointe, said that we have \$4,365.95 in our treasury and \$163.75 in Penny Pines. The Treasurer's report was approved and filed for audit. Our members planted 19 trees since our last meeting.

Ted Benson, Chairman of the Bylaws Committee, said that his team is actively working on making the bylaws easy to read and understand. Colleen Ferguson has been working with Lime Street School and would appreciate help. Colleen also said that the San Bernardino Regional Seed Library will be opening this spring. Linda West is substituting for Debra Ann Peterson, Chairman of the Nominating Committee. Please see Linda West if you wish to make a nomination.

Terry thanked the February Hospitality crew, Sharon Bartley, Claudia Marsh, Mary Ann Norton, Ginny Kight, June Clinkenbeard and Marilyn Reed, The crew for March consists of Dennis Vogel, Rose Baker, Colleen Ferguson, and the Chavez family. Terry said that volunteers are still needed for April and May. Linda Smeltzer and Linda West volunteered for April and Renee Hahn volunteered for May.

Under Old Business, Terry said that some members still have not picked up their membership packets. Clara Petrosky said that she has a book on Casa Romantica should anyone want to look through it. Clara reminded us that checks for the April 13 trip should be made out to The Hesperia Garden Club, \$30 for members and \$35 for non-members. Clara said we can either choose our own restaurant or bring lunch from home.

Last October's Hospitality crew donated the proceeds from the sale of their centerpieces to our Beautification Projects. Terry had a plaque made up at a cost of \$54 which will be mounted on a treated lumber post at Juniper Elementary School. Pictures taken during the delivery of the donated coats and blankets for the victims of the Blue Cut Fire have been posted on our Facebook page. Dennis Vogel said that the gardening class he is taking at Victor Valley College needs 5 more students or they will have to cancel the class. The class meets Monday nights between 4:00 and 8:30 p.m. although Dennis said it does not usually run that long. The Watershed Group is looking for two people to come out and speak with teachers and staff about how to get parents and teachers involved in teaching children about gardening. Donna Davis said she thought she would be able to do it. Terry said that we could obtain 100 packets of seeds for \$25. Linda West made a motion that the Club make this purchase. S/c.

Terry explained how the Seed Exchange works and said packets for putting seeds in were available at the round table in the front of the room. Pat Kriske will be in charge of the Home & Garden Show. About 110 empty pots were handed out to our members so we expect 110 plants to be donated for sale at the Show. The Hesperia Garden Club will make up a basket to be auctioned from the Roadrunner District table at the Home & Garden Show. Linda West volunteered to make up this basket as well as Debra Ann Peterson, Joanie Pierce, Linda Smetzer and Roberta Lisiecki. Shirley Brogdon volunteered to bring a suitable empty basket to our March meeting.

The trip to deliver our collected pull tabs to the Ronald McDonald House will take place on February 28. We will meet at the Percy Bakker Center at 8:30 a.m.

The date for the District meeting has been set for May 23. There is a \$5 charge from which \$1 goes to the District and the remaining \$4 comes to The Hesperia Garden Club. The proceeds from all other fund raisers come to our Club. There was discussion on what time we should meet and Clara Petrosky made a motion that the social begin at 9:30 and the meeting start at 10:00 a.m. with lunch at the end of the meeting. S/c. Ted Benson said that nominations for District officers are still open. The election of new officers will be held at the May 23 District meeting.

We need to order a new supply of Club aprons. Donna Davis asked how many people would order aprons and eight hands went up. Pat Kriske made a motion that the aprons be ordered. S/c.

Claudia said that the people who found a red heart on the underside of their placemat could take the vase of flowers on their table home.

We broke for refreshments, the Opportunity was held and we adjourned at 2:50 p.m.
