# THE PASTOR'S CORNER


#### "IT IS FINISHED" (John 19:30)

The bible tells us that just before Jesus died on the cross, He cried out, "It is finished." And we of course recognize this to be a statement of closure. Some people come to the end of their lives with a list of regrets. They look back in despair at a life of pursuits that in the end came to nothing. They exit life wishing they had it to do all over again. But this was not true of Christ. There was a deep sense of fulfillment and accomplishment in his dying words:

#### "IT IS FINISHED!"

Those who first heard His cry may've wondered just *what* was finished. Was he simply referring to the end of his life? Was His the cry of a frustrated criminal who met an untimely end? We do well to note that he did not say; "I am finished!" But what was the "it" that was finished?


Our theologians tell us that Jesus was calling our attention to His finished work on the cross. The task of securing our salvation was fully completed at the Death of Christ. This Lenten season, we hear the distinct echo of a promise that Christ made us from the cross. It assures us that we are fully forgiven for our sins. And it beckons us to move closer to God.



## Letter From Pastor Amy

Dear Chapel Hill,

Praise be to God! Our Savior has risen from the dead, leaving behind an empty tomb. And like the disciples, we are learning what it means to be Easter people. We are people of hope, who know that our Savior is the ultimate conqueror of death. And that is something that changes the basic nature of how we live. For our lives came at a price- the price of the cross. We are valued beyond measure and our lives and those of everyone that Jesus came to save matter. John tells is that when the disciples first encountered the Risen Christ, they were hiding behind locked doors.



The disciples had let fear take over their lives since the moment that Jesus was arrested. Yet Jesus appeared among them, shining light into their darkest moments.
