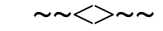
### Plans for the July 2019 Summer Social - Africian Safari are underway.

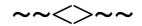

## Program: Toby Jugs by Marty Goldstein

Thank you Marty for sharing this interesting collection. As you can see from some of our meeting photos on the last page, everyone was enthralled with the presentation.

Toby Jugs were first made in 1750s in England. They were handmade and hand painted. They were well know in drinking establishments. Most of Marty's collection is by Royal Dalton and most are before 2005 except for his favorite John Wayne mug (2007) pictured above. The characters were from literature, politics, military, well know people, and many ordinary walks of life. Done as caricatures with notable features on their handles and base. Sizes range from 1 1/2"-2" mini mugs, 3" to 4" small mugs, 3 1/2" to 4 1/2" medium mugs, and 8" large mugs.

Notables for me were Alfred Hitchcock (1995), Hamlet (1982-1999), WC Fields (1983-1986), Santa Claus (1981 version), Touchstone Jester (1936-1960), Captain Bligh (1995 Jug of the Year), Mae West (1983-86), Annie Oakley and Geronimo (1984).
