

With continued walk-ins scheduled by Arizona teachers for Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of this week and the possibility of a walk-out scheduled for Thursday, April 26th, many of you have contacted us about the status of Stepping Stones Academy during this time. Additionally, many of you have shared your support for the school and our teachers on this issue and we want

you to know we truly appreciate this! This is not an easy time for Arizona schools or educators; however, we want to assure you this issue is not affecting the children or activities within the classroom.

Ms. Stewart-Alliger and Mrs. Panagopoulos met with staff members after school on Friday to discuss the possible walk-out and how it may affect Stepping Stones Academy. While it is true Stepping Stones Academy fully supports additional school funding and hopes Governor Ducey and Arizona lawmakers quickly find a resolution to this important issue, *Stepping Stones Academy will be in session as usual and activities will continue as scheduled.*


DINOSAUR PROJECTS BY SECOND GRADE





LUNCH PLANS – Everyone will be served a free hot dog lunch of grilled hot dogs, chips, and drink. Regular school lunch will not be served. Students not wanting the hot dog lunch need to bring lunch from home. Sno-cones will be available in the morning for free during the events.

STUDENT TEAMS – Students are divided into 14 teams with each group including a mixture of K-8th grade students. The team coaches selected team colors so t-shirts will be tie-dyed the colors of the teams. (Note – T-shirts will be tie-dyed at school.) Teams will be meeting in the afternoons of April 30th – May 3rd to select team names, decide team cheers, and make team posters. Teams will also be strategizing and practicing for some of the events during the team meetings.

WHAT TO WEAR FOR FIELD DAY?

SHIRTS - Students will bring home their tie dyed t-shirts before Field Day and are to wear their t-shirts to school on Field Day. If students do not wear the tie-dyed shirts, they are to wear a polo shirt or SSA t-shirt. Students are not allowed to wear a bathing suit under their shirts. They may wear a t-shirt or sleeveless top under their shirt, but must wear their Field Day t-shirt all day.

SHORTS/PANTS – Students are to wear khaki or blue jean shorts/pants. It is important shorts be long enough (no more than 3" above the knee). If shorts are not long enough, students will visit Mustang Exchange and find a pair of khaki shorts to wear. It is suggested students wear an older pair of shorts/pants, because sometimes the dye from the shirt runs on the shorts/pants.



SHOES – It is suggested students wear tennis shoes; however, students may wear any style of shoe that adheres to the uniform policy. Students must wear shoes all day, even if shoes become wet.

WATER BOTTLES – Students are encouraged to bring their own water bottles. Water bottles may only contain water and may be refilled throughout the day at the water fountains.

SUNSCREEN – Students are encouraged to come to school with sunscreen and sunscreen will be applied to all students throughout the day by team coaches. *Students not wanting sunscreen are to bring a note from their parents.*

AWARDS CEREMONY – At the end of the day, an awards ceremony will be held in the Multi-Purpose building. Teams will perform their cheers and receive ribbons for the events.
