My name is Whit Sherrill and I live at 6590 Sullivantown Road. I would like to address issues with the Center Stage Shopping Center. I recently saw a negative social media post on the uncleanliness of the appearance of the shopping center. Does the council know if they have a property manager? The marque out front could look a lot better. The lights don't work. There is trash everywhere behind Food Lion. Shingles, mattresses thrown out. I won't shop there anymore because of this but I don't want the town to lose the store.
Doc: Yes, there is an out of town manager. Not local. Scott spoke with them last week. When Winn Dixie left I worked to bring the Food Lion to town. I don't think there is a danger of losing them. The store is very busy and a high performer.
Scott: The shopping center is privately owned and not maintained by the town. We can't force maintenance on them unless there is an issue with public safety, but they are liable for any conditions that are on their property. There is illegal dumping in the back but they need license tag numbers or other evidence to prosecute.

The marquee will go with the Old Hollow Road widening project.
Whit: Each store has the responsibility to keep their space clear.
Scott: The tenants have not been cooperative in addressing customer complaints about the shopping center, and the property manager rarely responds when contacted by issues. Tenants have called the town to complain about the property manager not responding to their calls, but that's a private matter and they should address that by looking at what options they have within their lease.
Doc: They do have a night time sweeper.
Whit: The front does look better.
Peggy: Our deputy writes tickets for illegal parking and fire lane violations.
