We will join with others in **PRAYER** to give thanks to God for bringing us through trying times and to strengthen our relationships with one another. We will gather in **UNITY** with various churches and Christian organizations to see our city reconciled and united in Christ. #### **A Devotional for You** – *Read Galatians 5:1-6, 13-14*

The great German Reformer, Martin Luther, summarized the above verses in Gal. 5 this way: "A Christian is a perfectly free lord of all, subject to none. A Christian is a perfectly dutiful servant, subject to all." That sounds like a contradiction but read the context of the book of Galatians and you'll see there's no contradiction between our freedom in Christ and serving others in his spirit. This is particularly insightful in the wake of our 4<sup>th</sup> of July (Independence Day) observance, where we celebrate and tout our freedom. Richard Foster adds this insight when reflecting on Paul's teaching for today's world in contemporary America – "What freedom corresponds to submission or service? It's the ability to lay down the terrible burden of always needing to get our own way ... The obsession to demand our own way (e.g. immediate gratification) is one of the greatest bondages of our society. People may even spend years in a perpetual stew because some little thing did not go the way they wished" (R. Foster, Celebration of Discipline, 111). But with the freedom to serve, we can drop the matter (because we are focused on a different Audience). For example, most church fights and splits occur because people do not have the freedom (or use the freedom they have) to "give in" to each other. Most of the time, the issue is not as critical as we make it. The paradoxical truth is: there is freedom in submission – particularly because it enables us to distinguish between "genuine issues" and stubborn self-will. Again and again in Scripture (Jesus, Paul, James, John), the pattern for Christian relationships is not hierarchical (the opposite in fact) – we are to communicate an inner attitude (a default setting if you will) of mutual subordination. In the incarnation – in everything Jesus said and did – we discover that in submission, we are at last free to value other people. Their dreams and plans become important to us. We have entered into a new, wonderful, glorious freedom – the freedom to give up our own rights for the good of others. Only then can one love unconditionally. And only then do we no longer feel that we have to be treated in a certain way. And eventually, one glorious day, with the Spirit's help, we discover that it is far better to serve our neighbor than to have our own way. Because it is then that we become that "perfectly free lord" in the eyes of God. All of what Paul says is true: "For freedom Christ has set us free; therefore, do not submit again to a yoke of slavery [either to the impossible demands of the Law or to the yoke of sin's control] ... Do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love, serve one another." Happy *Independence Day*, my fellow "lord," and fellow servant.
