

Effective until further notice...

• All exterior doors of the Brewerton United Methodist Church are to remain <u>locked</u> at all times.

# Three Books by Marilyn Schaap

Three books that have made a difference in my life. The first book is the "Bible" that I read every day.

Last year I was in a library looking for a book to read and a book stood out to me. It was "Fearless" by Max Lucado. It told me to write out all my fears. Wow! I didn't realize how many fears there were in my life. I started working on them. It takes a long time but when you have determination and the Lord with you, you can do anything.

On January 16<sup>th</sup> this year I wrote on Facebook "I thought I knew everything. I have been stubborn, bullheaded and self-centered. I am asking Jesus to change my life". It takes a while to change a life of 81 years but with help from the Lord and the Bible I am working on it.

I belong to a book club and we were given the book "*The Same Sky*" by Amanda Ward. It is fiction and it tells about a 12 year old trying to get to America. She goes through horrific things to get here. I was very impressed and touched by this book.

I had wanted to visit Arizona and see my Great Grandchildren. I am not getting any younger. I had thought it was impossible to go because it would be expensive and my health was pretty good but it would be tough for me. On Thursday, I told a friend of my desire. She was planning a trip to Montana.

On the next day when I got up I felt this great nudge from the Lord to take this trip. It was Friday, March 22, 2019. I knew it would be getting hot there very soon and I am not getting any younger. I went to my son and told him and he gave me some money that would help me. My sister suggested that I should call AAA. I went home and called them. They worked out a flight to Arizona and back.

I went to the bank and worked things out so I could go. Then I called AAA and told them I wanted that trip. They set it up for Monday, March 25<sup>th</sup> to April 5<sup>th</sup> (11 days). One of the things that caused me to do this was the story in the book of the girl whose goal was to come to America. As I thought of these horrible things that she went through and how her faith brought her through her trip to America. I realized that nothing like this would happen to me but it would be tough. I thought of the airports and the flights and with the Lord, I could do it.

I couldn't get hold of anyone to stay with. My daughter Lisa helped me to get someone but after one night I couldn't stay there because of the dog. I had tried but circumstances had stopped me from reaching anyone and I had several people that I wanted to see. I finally found a place but again I thought of the girl with no place to sleep safely at night. She kept her faith in the Lord.

The terminals were tough but I thought of the girl in the book and remembered her goal and that the Lord was with me. I had a long way to walk and with COPD. It was tough but even though it was hard I just kept going.

There were many tough things I went through but I kept thinking of that girl and there was no comparison to what she went through, as many of the refugees are going through.

Basically I had a wonderful time and saw seven families that I had known in the 25 years that I lived there. They had a party for me at the end of my visit. The flight back home was easier as I asked for assistance. I knew the Lord was with me.

Thank you Jesus.
