

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

TOWN OF KREMMLING
REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING
March 7, 2018

The Board of Trustees, for the Town of Kremmling, met in the boardroom located at 200 Eagle Avenue. Mayor Thomas Clark called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Trustees present: Scott Crandall, Gina Schroeder, Jason Wikberg, Wes Howell, and Grace Bohall. Staff present: Town Manager Mark Campbell, Chief Scott Spade, Public Works Director Jason Bock, and Town Clerk Rhonda Shearer.

HOWELL MOVED TO APPROVE THE REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 21, 2018. BOHALL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

SCHROEDER MOVED TO APPROVE THE EXPEDITURES FROM FEBRUARY 22, 2018 THROUGH MARCH 7, 2018, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$96,449.35. CRANDALL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

Mayor Clark would like to move the Grand County IGA to the first agenda item.

WIKBERG MOVED TO APPROVE THE AGENDA AS AMENDED. SCHROEDER SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

There were no citizen comments.

Manager Campbell present the IGA with Grand County Housing Authority for a needs assessment. The board held a short discussion.

SCHROEDER MOVED TO ENTER INTO THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR RESEARCH ON AFFORDABLE HOUSING. WIKBERG SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

Chief Spade announced to the board that he will be retiring. He will remain employed while the town looks for a new police chief. He is proposing to give Officer Willson a \$1/hour raise, and Officer Sralla a \$2.25/hour raise, so that the starting pay for a new police officer can be raised.

Grand County Sheriff Brett Schroetlin presented the board with a proposal for the sheriff's department to take over the policing of the town, at the request of Mayor Clark. His proposal would save the town \$18,000 annually, but would not provide the same coverage the town has now with its own department. His proposal also includes a school resource officer. Dave Sammons voiced his concern that while the sheriff's proposal would save money, the lack of coverage wouldn't be worth the savings. Jeff Miller also asked questions of the sheriff. Trustees Schroeder and Wikberg felt that the public needed notice to discuss the issue, so it will be placed on the next agenda for further discussion.

HOWELL MOVED TO RAISE THE POLICE DEPARTMENTS PAY AS PRESENTED, EFFECTIVE STARTING NEXT PAY PERIOD. CRANDALL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

The Mayor reported:

- He and Manager Campbell attended a Northwest Transportation Planning Region meeting, a Mayor, Manager, Commissioner meeting, the Grand County Commissioner meeting to hear the annual Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) update.
- He and Chamber of Commerce Director Shelly McManus attended the Grand County Economic Development district meeting.
- The Gore pass is currently at 109% of average for snowpack.

The Police Chief had no report.

The Public works Director reported:


- They have begun patching potholes as weather has allowed them to.

- He and Doris will meet The Trash Company tomorrow. They have had some turnover in personnel, and have started billing the town different than they have for the past 6+ years. The trash contract will be put out for bid this summer, for 2019 and beyond.
