Lk 6:27-38



"Jesus said to his disciples: "To you who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak, do not withhold even your tunic. Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back. Do to others as you would have them do to you. For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do the same. If you lend money to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, and get back the same amount. But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. "Stop judging and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven. Give, and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap. For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

7th Sunday Ordinary Year C Lk 6:27-38

Do good to those who hate you? Pray for those who mistreat you? Don't we want to say back, "But they hate me. They hurt me!" How many times as a kid did I go to my mother complaining about an actual slight or perceived hurt from another kid, and she would say back to me, "They may choose to be hateful, but that doesn't excuse you to be like them. I expect more from you. You be better!" Like a good parent, Jesus seems to be saying, "Even though they act hateful to you, I expect more out of you!" Yet it seems instinctive of us when offended, that some weak part of us wants to strike back, even thinking that vengeance is justified. But, NO, not according to Jesus. He is as clear as can be: If we are struck, we offer the other side (Luke 6:29). If we are stolen from, we offer them a little more (Luke 6:29). And if something is demanded of us, we give freely, not looking for a return (Luke 6:30). Likely, this teaching of Jesus made His disciples scratch their heads, 'Come again-I thought we were supposed to hit them back harder!" Peter even does as much later, when Jesus is arrested and the guards lay hands on Jesus. Peter strikes out in vengeance! And what does Jesus say about Peter? STOP! In John 18:10, Jesus tells Peter to put the sword away. (In Luke's account, Jesus even takes the time to touch the enemy guard, healing his injured ear Lk 22:51). So, Jesus embodies His teaching of nonviolence and considerate treatment even of one's enemy. Sometimes people preach insidiously that such Christ-like action of loving one's enemy is evil itself, claiming that it gives aid/comfort to the enemy, complicit with the enemy's evil. But, such teaching attributing evil to Jesus is Anti-Christian itself. Such an escalation of attack and counter attack, even if only with words, is precisely what Jesus is trying to avoid by being absolute: move on, don't get hung up on offenses. Jesus doesn't want followers dragged into a spitting or hitting contest with one's opponents. We see this when He strongly pulls James and John out of such a vindictive reaction when they want to 'call down lightning upon a Samaritan village who rejected them (Luke 9:54-55). Jesus had been clear in his mission instructions (Lk 9:5) that when they encountered rejection or persecution from any town, "Shake the dust, and move on!"

But isn't this 'supporting' one's enemy? Being good and kind oneself, and praying/ loving one's enemy is not giving their bad actions aid or comfort. It is actually introducing the good example they need to witness (to be taught themselves how to be otherwise). For example, for a moment, let's assume that they are all bad—Okay then, how are they ever going to get good? They have to see it, they have to be shown it. They need a stronger person to share such goodness with them. Our hope is that by receiving such good, they will internalize it and their hard heart be softened by such good return. The old way, when they get a fight out of us, it shows that they are on to something valuable that we are holding on to (our pride and ego), and so the fight continues. But if we release, knowing that our hearts are set on God and souls, not on scoring some verbal 'look good' points, then they are left holding on to what was nothing to begin with? Isn't our experience that often we can win a fight and still feel just as empty as before? What is gained by staying in a tussle with an opponent? Let them have the chance to face their own emptiness. Jesus offers a version of this wisdom, when He says in Matthew 16:26, "What if you gain the whole world but lose your soul?" Jesus suggests that some fights take the life (soul) out of us. This is what people mean when they say be careful how you fight because you easily become your own enemy (taking up their ignoble or unjust means). Kids mean the same thing when they say, "Forget it, I'm not going to let you drag me down into your gutter".

Overcome evil with good: when your enemy receives your good return, they are allowing 'good' into themselves. Let it work. On some deep level, they have let you 'get to them' and by a leavening grace effect, it will grow within them. Walk along with them a little to bring them along to better actions. Jesus invites us to go beyond what is expected with them. He asks us to bring Him to them. Romans 12:21 tells us, "Do not be conquered by evil but conquer evil with good. More detailed about how Jesus works, Hebrews 12:14-15 says, "Strive for peace with everyone, and for that holiness without which no one will see the Lord. See to it that no one be deprived of the grace of God, that no bitter root spring up and cause trouble, through which many may become defiled.." In my vengeance, I am depriving someone of God's grace-Not Good of me! I need to bring them Blessing. As 1 Peter 3:9 directs, "Do not return evil for evil, or insult for insult; but, on the contrary, return a blessing, because to this you were called, that you might inherit a blessing." Jesus blesses and gives life to all (yes, even our enemies-Matt 5:44-45), and wants us to do the same! Peace, Fr Brian
