Monthly Program: Identifying Stemware

Some tips for identifying stemware include paying attention to stem shape, bowl shape, optics, tear drops flowing up/down, round base, flat base, and designs in base.

Noting all these things help relate to different manufacturers. Example: the golf ball shape in the stem would lead you to Morgantown.

Keely brought some wonderful examples including a Heisey "Duncan" Tangerine glass, very rare. She also brought fun stems with animals (giraffe), flowers (rose), and a Heisey "Pineapple" stem.
