Hutch High students will start classes with better facilities - without all the work zones

For the first time in more than two years, students won't have to zigzag through construction detours or walk down bare concrete hallways to attend classes in temporary quarters when school starts this week at Hutchinson High School.

A \$28 million makeover of the high school, the last piece of the \$78.8 million bond package approved by voters in 2006, is all but done.

Williams said the first building in the high school campus was built in 1952 as Plaza Junior High. When other buildings in the campus were completed, students at old Central High moved to the new campus and the junior high students moved to Central, which, along with the other junior highs in the 1950s, has since been replaced. But little had been done for the high school since the 1950s, Williams and Roehm said.

"It was still a good facility but hadn't been touched in a long time and many things were very dated, like our science rooms and the auditorium," Roehm said. "And things were crowded. We had a lot of teachers sharing space."

The bond project added 130,000 square feet of new space and renovated most of the existing space.

Century-old time capsule to be opened

The Hutchinson Landmarks Commission and Reno County Museum are planning to turn back time next month as they celebrate

the 100th anniversary of the construction of Convention Hall, known today as Memorial Hall.

Sometime before Sept. 26, the two will jointly remove the cornerstone at the northeast corner of Memorial Hall. Then, at 5 p.m. on Sept. 26 - 100 years ago to the hour that President William Howard Taft laid the cornerstone - a time capsule will be removed and opened in a public event.

Among the items believed to have been placed in the cornerstone a century ago were a Bible, U.S. and presidential flags, a program for the day's events, which coincided with the state semi centennial celebration at the fairgrounds, the rosters of several Reno County Masonic lodges, copies of a couple of local newspapers, a photo of city founder C.C. Hutchinson, and a brief history of the city and Reno County written by Sheridan Plouge.


