### "THERE IS NO NEED TO WORRY"

Really, Paul? You really mean I should "have no anxiety at all?" (Philippians 4:6). I should just make my requests known to God in everything by prayer and thanksgiving. You really believe that once I do that, my problems will be over, or at least manageable? And I'll have the peace that surpasses all understanding? (Philippians 4:7). Come on, dude, you must be joking or stretching the truth a bit. You didn't really mean to put it that way, did you? Luke, your secretary must have misunderstood you. But if you did really mean that, then you don't know what I and many others are going through today, in this fast and modern society. How in the world could we not be worried, I mean worried to death? Family issues, relationship issues, raising our beloved Generation Y and now iGeneration children, job and career issues, financial pressures, emotional problems, ever changing marriage and divorce cycles with their joys and sorrows, and don't dare get sick, especially if you have no insurance or not-so-good insurance, and we shall not forget death with its accompanying sorrow and grief. Come on, the list is endless. And I should not worry? At all?



Like Jesus, one thing we cannot accuse Paul of is speaking or writing off the top of his head. In other words, not possessing the experience. Scourged with lashes 39 times, beaten with rod 3 times, stoned once, suffered shipwreck 3 times (once would have done it for me), faced drowning adrift in the sea for a night and a full day. Like a hawk after its pray, the Jewish authorities hounded him for years from one end of the Roman empire to another. He was betrayed (2 Corinthians 11:24-28). In 2

Corinthians he speaks about weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities he endured (2 Cor 12:10). Ultimately, his suffering ended with martyrdom. So, he knew what he was talking about. He lived it. Our sufferings and traumas do not even begin to compare with his.

Now, let's get back to his encouragement and words of wisdom: have no anxieties at all. It's all about how we approach or handle our sufferings, no matter what they are and how numerous they are. He reminds us in 2 Corinthians 4:9 that "we're afflicted in everyway, but not crushed; perplexed, but not despairing; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed ..." The Psalmist lends his voice to Paul, saying "though he may stumble, he will not fall, for the Lord upholds him with His hand" (Psalm 37:24).

Paul's secret was his faith and trust in the Master he was serving. It was his unflinching confidence in the Master's love, care and power to take care of him. With that, like a sick child in its mother's arms, he rested secure and comforted. May we too rest secure in the arms of our Savior, knowing that, more than a mother, He will take of our situations. Then, and only then, will we have the peace that Paul is speaking of: the peace that surpasses all understanding.

Lord, may your grace be always with us in the trials and temptations that assail us. Amen.


