DIRECTIONS: Rendezvous site is located in Elkton, Oregon, on OR Hwy 38, just west of town.


From I-5 south, take exit #136 onto Hwy 138. Go 24 miles and turn left on Hwy 38. Go through Elkton to site on left.

From I-5 north, take exit #162 onto Hwy 99/Hwy38. Go 6 miles to Drain. Go through town, following signs to Hwy. 38 and the coast, 14 more miles to Elkton. Go through Elkton, to site on left.

From Hwy 101, at Reedsport take OR Hwy 38 east about 35 miles to Elkton. Just before town, site is on right.
