ADVENT SEASON

The season of Advent has a twofold nature: it is a time to prepare I for Christmas, when we "recall Christ's First Coming among us, and it is a time when we look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of the ages. In this way Advent is a period of devout and joyful expectation" (General Norms for the Liturgical Year, 39). During Advent, each Sunday's Gospel reading has a specific focus. The Old Testament readings, especially those taken from Isaiah, are prophecies about the Messiah and messianic times. The selections from the writings of the Apostles present exhortations and instructions on different themes of this season.

This is the first Sunday of Advent and the first Sunday ▲ of the new liturgical year (Year A). There are three aspects of anticipation to Jesus' coming in the Advent season: the celebration of his birth some 2000 years ago (past), receiving Jesus in our lives today (present), and his coming again at the end of time (future). Today's readings emphasize the third aspect when Jesus comes again in glory. In the Gospel Jesus speaks about the



signs that will occur at the end of time and says, "Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man". Let us take time during this Advent season to examine our lives to prepare for that final day when we will meet God face to face.

CATECHESIS RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

There will be Religious Education on Sunday. Dec. 8th from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., at the McCarthy Centre. The session is for children in Grades 1-6, including those preparing for First Communion and Reconciliation.

LIGHTING OF THE **ADVENT WREATH** The lighting of Advent

candles is a tradition that marks the progression of the four weeks of Advent toward the birth of Christ: A candle is lit each Sunday of

Advent. beginning on the first Sunday. Families or individuals wishing to light the advent wreath are asked to call the Parish Office at 256-3151.

DECEMBER 3 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT FRANCIS XAVIER, PRIEST: Francis was born in 1506 in Navarre, Spain. He was one of the first members of the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits) and spent many years working as a missionary with the peoples of Goa, South East Asia, and Japan. Francis died in 1552 while on his way from Goa to China. He was canonized in 1602 and is a patron of all foreign missions.

DECEMBER 6 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT NICHOLAS, BISHOP: In the early fourth century Nicholas was made Bishop of Myra in Lycia (now Turkey). He was famous for his charity and was so popular that he was chosen joint patron of Russia with Saint Andrew, he is also a patron of sailors and children. In many parts of the world, Saint Nicholas still plays a role as Santa Claus.

DECEMBER 7 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT AMBROSE, BISHOP AND DOCTOR: Ambrose was a catechumen who was later baptized and ordained, becoming Bishop of Milan. He became a remarkable preacher and teacher of the faith. His most famous student was Augustine of Hippo, whom he baptized. His literary works have been acclaimed as masterpieces of Latin eloguence, and his musical accomplishments are remembered in his hymns. In 1298, Ambrose was declared one of the four great Doctors of the Latin Church (with Jerome, Augustine and Gregory I).
