PROGRAM COORDINATOR'S CORNER by Nettie A. Kauffman

A new year begins in the Program Coordinator/Lecturer area and encouragement is made for the Berks County Subordinate Granges to consider doing a project/contest for the 2018 contest year.

Berks County has so many Grangers that like to tell stories, some may be truth and some may be made-up of truths and untruths. It would be great to see each Subordinate Grange have some type of creative writing with either a poem or short story telling program. Then gather these writings and use them for entries in the PEN IN HAND contest on the State level. Yes, there are specific requirements – 300 words maximum for a poem and 1,500 word maximum for the Short Story. Now it does not indicate in the rules any MIMIMUM number of words, but you would at least want to make it a good poem or story! Specific rules are required when it is submitted for a state entry, but this can be done after the program.

An area within the PC/Lecturer's department where everyone has a talent and can be creative is with the "MY FAVORITE ANY-THING" contest. You may not like performing in front of a crowd by singing or playing a musical instrument, but you can do something! If you like tinkering with wood, plastic, material, yarn, etc., you can be creative and make "My Favorite Anything." The item must not exceed 2' x 2' x 2' and cannot be an item that is eligible for any other State Grange contest (Family Activities, Youth and Program Coordinator). I encourage all members to try their talent with something in the MY FAVORITE ANYTHING contest.

Why am I encouraging you on these contests now? When the cold winds blow and the snow gets too high to go anywhere, than this would be the time to create something in any of the contests featured in the PC/Lecturer's department, or, in any of the other departments. If you don't have the contests you can always contact your PC/Lecturer or any other department chair in your Grange for the information. Another way is to go on the PA State Grange web-site (www.pagrange.org) and download the information. I, too, would also be willing to provide information to you.

Here's hoping that we have entries in the forthcoming year of 2018 at the annual 2018 State Session since you can start preparing NOW!

One can also be creative making a Set of 4 Coasters (cork, tile, wood, or other material). Clocks are another creative item that may be made (wooden or other with two different sizes).

CONSIGNMENT SALE REPORT

The annual Consignment Sale was held August 26, 2017. Years ago we had a profit in the range of \$12,000—\$15,000. That is no longer the case. This year our profit was around \$7,600. We had:

- 250 consigners
- 732 buyer numbers given out
- 115 household lots (1 was for nursery)
- 89 lawn & garden lots
- 46 field equipment consigners for 125 lots

Those numbers are definitely lower than in past years also.

We had 34 volunteers sign in for Thursday help; 35 volunteers for Friday's help; and 135 volunteers sign in for the day of sale to help. Even with those numbers, we were still short with helpers in the office and could have used a few more volunteers for other areas. So, please plan to help next year. For the Monday clean up and Monday evening work night, we had a total of 24 volunteers sign in and Tuesday work night, we had 13 volunteers sign in.

The Family Activities made approximately \$2300 in profit; the youth, around \$850 in profit from their stand; and the juniors around \$460 profit. Selling these food items are enjoyed by all in attendance and helps these various groups sponsor activities and support community service projects throughout the year. We want to THANK Thomas Bechtel for donating the eggs used by the Family Activities for their breakfast sandwiches. (The egg sandwiches were delicious!)

Pomona Grange relies on the sale profit for its donations, etc. throughout the year. Therefore, we need to tightened our belts and watch our spending for the 2018 year. We had 2 titled vehicles and sold both. We had 11 titled trailers and sold 7 of them. We were planning to have a tractor parade; however, we did not have enough participation to hold this event.

We will be holding an Appreciation Banquet on January 20, 2018. The volunteers, auctioneers and state grange first place winners will be treated to a FREE MEAL at the Fleetwood Grange hall. More details elsewhere in this ECHO newsletter.

We need to have people contact the committee ahead of time to have items advertised that they are planning to bring to sell. This is not limited to only Lawn & Garden or Farm Equipment, but also Household items. For example, if you are planning to bring Longaberger baskets, dining room table with chairs, china cabinet, etc., please let the committee know so that we can advertise. The more we can advertise, the better for you, the consignor, and for buyers to know what to look for.

There was a Post-Sale meeting on Monday, October 9. The next meeting will be held May 7, 2018. We are asking that EACH GRANGE have a representative at these meetings. We need input from EVERYONE to make this event better and to keep our membership informed. The committee should not be the only ones making these crucial decisions. The profits from the sale affect Pomona activities for the following year.

During the 2017 Consignment Sale, we held a 50/50 drawing to help raise monies. We raised \$474 for Pomona. Four (4) prizes of \$118.50 was awarded to the 4 winners: Mike Miller, Theodore Skoraszewski, Robert Himmelberger and Leslie Seidel. A big thank you to those of you who helped sell or buy tickets.

If anyone has any suggestions as to how to improve the Sale or have other suggestions as to fundraisers that Pomona could hold, we are open to ALL SUGGES-TIONS!

AGRICULTURE REPORT by Doug Sattazahn

2017 has brought about many changes to our dairy farm. We are nearly finished with building a new milking parlor and barn for 200 cows. The first ground was moved in April and we should be milking by early November.

Modernization is something our family has talked about for a few years. We have more cows than we can properly care for in the old barns. The new facility will feature sand bedding, which is very comfortable for cows to lay on, and a recovery system to separate the sand from the manure and reuse it. The parlor will allow many more cows to be milked per hour and will be much less labor intensive.

New technology on today's farms is pretty amazing. The barn's climate is controlled automatically with sidewall curtains, fans and misters that respond to changes in temperature, wind, and humidity. The cow's activity is monitored 24 hours a day to determine if they are in heat, need medical attention, or know if they're eating. Cows can be separated once they leave the milking parlor by ear tags that emit a radio frequency to automatically open gates.

The cost of upgrading is no doubt steep for agriculture today. However, when family farms can transition to the next generation and thrive, those costs are worth it.
