Celebrating Harris Seidel's 100th Birthday!

Harris Seidel came to Iowa State in 1942. He earned a BS degree in Civil Engineering in 1944 and most significantly for us, he became involved in the Roger Williams Club, our church's campus ministry, where he met Kathryn Bell. Harris and Katy were married after graduating, and other than 6 years in the Twin Cities after graduation, Harris has been a part of our church for 80 years. In 1951 he returned to Ames to be superintendent of the Ames Water Treatment plant and served as Director of the Ames Water and Pollution Control Department until his retirement in 1994. Harris visited more than 20 countries consulting on water and pollution control for the World Bank. He has received a host of honors for his work, including induction last year into the ISU Civil, Construction, and Environmental Engineering Hall of Fame.

We all know Harris best through his involvement in our church and our community. He was a longtime trustee and Boiler Whisperer. He has a gift with children and worked for many years in our nursery. He was our church's ace softball pitcher back in the day and continues to play a mean game of ping pong. Harris was a CROP Walker par excellence and over the years literally walked hundreds of miles and raised thousands of dollars to feed hungry people. He delivered Meals on Wheels for 20 years and only gave that up in the last year. And we all appreciate his generous, humble, caring presence.
