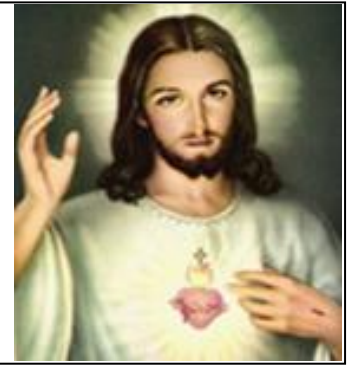

The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ (year C) Corpus Christi Sunday 19 June 2022

Through Him, With Him and In Him...

Each year different aspects of the Eucharist are emphasised by the readings for this feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. Today, as a Communion of persons in Christ, we renew our faith in the great sacrament - the 'source and summit of Christian Life' (Lumen Gentium), which gives life to the Church and unites it with Jesus' mission age after age.

The observance originated in Belgium in the 13th century, soon after, it was decreed to be a feast celebrated by the whole Western Church. From its beginning, through many centuries, Catholics have revered the Eucharist mainly as a sacred object, sacred elements on the altar or in the tabernacle. Without denying that aspect, since Vatican II, the Church leads to recapture the original meaning and reality of the Eucharist.

Today, the word of God focuses on the Eucharist as a meal that reveals God's saving work for us in Jesus. By our communion in the Body and Blood of Christ we enter into Jesus' giving of Himself to us and to all, in shared food and drink. The Eucharist is first and foremost an action that engages us personally and socially. It brings God and humanity together in a giving and receiving relationship.

It calls us to break the bread and pour out the wine of our lives for the sake of the world - going to the depth of the words of Jesus, 'Do this in memory of me'. Luke's Gospel today, of Jesus' miraculous feeding of the crowds with a small contribution of some loaves and fish is striking in its simplicity, but makes it clear the central place given to the Eucharist in the community. Jesus, after completing his Galilean ministry, turns his attention to the formation of the apostles who will continue His mission to bring the Good News of God's mercy to the poor, to heal the broken and free the oppressed.

The story also has overtones of the Last Supper, when it describes Jesus as raising His eyes to heaven giving thanks, praying over the crowds, breaking the food to be shared.

Then His words to the disciples, "Give them something to eat yourselves", could be understood as a commissioning of the Church to embrace Jesus' mission to feed the hungers of humanity.

Today's scripture reminds us that the Eucharist is more than an object of veneration. It is a divine action provoking us to human action in service of our brothers and sisters and thereby giving thanks to God.

"May we offer to our Father a solemn pledge of undivided love. May we offer our brothers and sisters a life poured out in loving service of that kingdom where you live, one God, Father, Son and Spirit. Amen"

All volunteers assisting in a parish within the Archdiocese are required to complete a Volunteer Induction Session to ensure awareness of their responsibilities. As such, the Sacred Heart Safeguarding Committee is hosting a Volunteer Induction Session for all Volunteers assisting in our Parish community. As a valued volunteer of our Sacred Heart Parish, you are invited and strongly encouraged to attend.

The Volunteer Induction presentation will provide all with an understanding of the new obligatory Safeguarding Standards and Practices required of volunteers in all parishes to ensure the safety, inclusion and wellbeing of children and vulnerable persons.

The presentation will include:

- Information regarding the obligatory Safeguarding Standards and Practices
- Information on our Parish's Code of Conduct and Statement of Commitment, which as volunteers, we are all required to sign. A copy can be viewed on the parish website.
- An opportunity to ask questions for clarification regarding a volunteer's responsibilities and obligations as outlined in the Standards.
- An opportunity to gain assistance with obtaining or renewing a Working With Children Check.
- Provision of an Induction Kit.

- gratitude and gratuitousness (recognition that the world is God's loving gift)
- generosity in self-sacrifice and good works
- a loving awareness of a universal communion with the rest of creation
- greater creativity and enthusiasm in resolving the world's problems
- a feeling of responsibility based on faith

17. Appreciate good civil and public officials

Write a thank you note online or in your local media to those who work every day, honestly in their jobs, to those people who take care of what belongs to all of us. Celebrate the Eucharist with them in the parish. Create a local award to encourage them.
