Our shelter

- High-quality ventilation
- In-floor heating
- "Meet" room
- Large dog exercise yards
- Rooms for
 - Quarantine, treatment
 - Maternity, kittens
 - Pet food preparation
 - Laundry and grooming
 - Storage/utilities



Our animals and property are protected 24/7 by a security system. We have life safety measures in place to monitor room and kennel temperatures and we receive alarms if temperatures rise or drop rapidly.





We have been growing!

- Programs to reduce animal intake
- Programs to promote adoption
- Partnerships with kill shelters to rescue animals
- Training for volunteers and shelter staff
 - Animal safety
 - Animal first aid
 - Emergency response





We're at the leading edge

- We practice humane capacity of care (intake limited to ability to provide humane care and housing)
- We follow guidelines of the Association of Shelter Veterinarians
- We provide enrichment for our animals
 - Music designed to calm
 - Toys designed to stimulate
 - Lots of volunteer interaction

- Developed by ASPCA
- Matches adopters with pets based on preferences and lifestyle
- Adopters can take brief survey; available online







Paw It Forward

Donor pays the adoption fee for an animal.
When the animal is adopted, the adopter can choose to "paw it forward" and donate the adoption fee to another animal waiting for a home.








SAFER® Aggression Assessment

 ASPCA's SAFER[®] is a predictive, consistent method for evaluating the probability of canine aggression in individual dogs.








Pets for Life Community Outreach


- Microchip database (no cost)

Adoptions continue to increase




Rehomed without coming to the shelter	21

- Found abused in small cage at a garage sale
- Volunteer brought her to shelter, thin and scared
- Safe and secure, she gained weight and was no longer traumatized or stressed
- Now in a loving forever home







Charlie

- Came to us clinging to life
- Veterinary care and TLC from a special volunteer brought him back
- He thrived and was adopted







Tyson

Found running loose
Skin and bones, scared
Special diet, volunteer TLC
Now with his loving new family









Daniel

- Came to us at age 6 weeks with broken leg from dog attack
- Volunteers took him to a veterinary specialist
- His leg was saved and he was adopted, along with his kitten friend Roxie







Humane Education

- Visit schools and talk with students
 K-12 about pets, pet care, and animal shelters
- Host field trips to the shelter
- *Read to the Cats* program


What we see in our future
