In light of the recent antisemitic tropes that are being replayed in such horrible fashion as to have LA Jews feeling fearful going to the synagogue, it is important for us to realize what this freedom means to us.

that we must be more vigilant than ever to protect what we have and our belief system from being destroyed by those who are ignorant and racist. We cannot rest on our laurels and feel that someone else will protect us. As we have learned from recent tragic events, we cannot stand idly by and let others do our work for us.

So, as we remember what our ancestors did for us to have us now be a free people, we must pay this forward, so that the next generation will have the enjoyment of freedom we have.



To bring you up to date, the Whittier Area Interfaith Council has focused on providing emergency shelter in motels for homeless families with minor children. The existing services through the city and county are not meeting their needs, so we have stepped up. Most of our referrals come from the local school districts.
