THE ACLUD CORNER"

There are many beautiful sandstone brick structures in the Amana Colonies. However, many people

might not realize that this type of brickwork and mortar (from the nineteenth century) is much softer than typical (more modern) masonry.

Specifically, if you plan to tuckpoint your historic masonry, it is important that the proper formula of mortar is used. The ACLUD office has




