Our church was first called the Welcome Baptist Church, then Harrison Avenue Baptist Church, and eventually became Harrison Avenue Missionary Baptist Church. Our incorporation with the State of Missouri is as Harrison Avenue Missionary Baptist Church.

Through our research, we have found information which reports that Harrison Avenue Missionary Baptist Church was organized in 1880. Several historical documents, including the <u>African American</u> <u>Heritage Guide of St. Louis</u>; <u>Discovering African Americans</u>; and the <u>History of Kirkwood</u> reveal our early existence. It is also reported that members of Harrison Avenue Missionary Baptist Church helped the First Baptist Church of Elmwood Park to organize in 1900.

The earliest recorded history that we have begins in 1908 and was put together by the late Sis. Mamie Briggs. After receiving the history baton from Sis. Briggs, the late Sis. Rose Mary Clark instituted a "year in review" as a way of updating our history. The year in review of our history is now put together by Sis. Geneva Powell.

## **Our Beginning**

The "Welcome Baptist Church" was founded in 1908 by Rev. Samuel Tyler who was a long time resident of Kirkwood. The name was later changed to Harrison Avenue Baptist Church. The Berean District Association Executive Board met here. At that time, Pastor Tyler and his family resided here on Harrison Avenue a few houses from the church. He will long be remembered for his strength and encouragement in establishing this church, which still stands as a monument to God.

It has been said that some of the first to be baptized were Mrs. Elmer Bryant Dupree, Mrs. Effie Bryant, Mrs. Mollie Tyler, and Brother Hudgens who later became a Deacon.

<u>The History of St. Louis County</u> by William L. Thomas published in 1911 notes Harrison Avenue Baptist Church was a "colored" church in Kirkwood located at Harrison and Clinton. It also documents that Rev. Tyler was the Pastor in 1911. Pastors who were called and became shepherds of this flock after Rev. Tyler were Rev. Billups, Rev. Shields, Rev. W. Monroe, Rev. Leon Hannon, Rev. J.T. Smith, Rev. Samuel W. Jones, Rev. Daniel Jones, Rev. Covington, Rev. Louis Sykes, Rev. Bailey, Rev. Littles, Rev. Fred Wilson, Rev. Robert Johnson, Rev. Clarence L. Wells, Rev. James F. Cobb, and our present Pastor, Rev. Jeffery G. Croft.

<u>The Blue Book</u>, published by the Metropolitan Church Federation of St. Louis in 1926, lists Rev. F. E. Bailey as Pastor. The 1931-1932 edition lists Rev. Leon Hannon as Pastor.

On December 23, 1912, the land at 355 South Harrison Avenue where our existing structure stands was purchased from Samuel and Mollie Tyler by Harrison Avenue Baptist Church for the sum of \$1,700.00. Frank Standard, Edward Quisenberry, John Ewing, and Eli McDonald were Trustees.

Rev. William. F. Bailey, who's wife, Mrs. Ella Bailey was the blood sister of our own Sis. Mamie Briggs served Harrison Avenue for 24 years. Sis. Bailey was responsible for our first Annual Women's Day program.

Rev. Bailey was called to a church in California and Rev. Daniel Jones was our next Pastor, followed by Rev. Louis Sykes and Rev. Littles. Shortly after Rev. Littles became our Pastor, he resigned to accept a call to another church. We were then without a pastor.

At this time, there were three Baptist churches serving our community; First African Baptist (also known as Rose Hill Baptist), Second Baptist, and Harrison Avenue. The late Rev. Harris, who at this time was the Pastor at Rose Hill Baptist Church, thought it a good idea to have one church instead of three. After many meetings and discussions, the consolidation was set in motion, thus in 1929 forming Unity Baptist Church; but Harrison Avenue chose to remain a separate body. This took a large number of our members. About five of our older mothers stayed on.

Several ministers served for short periods of time, until in approximately 1942, when Rev. Fred Wilson became our minister. During his stewardship of approximately 14 years, many new members were added to the roll. Rev. Wilson resigned when his health began to fail following a serious operation. He was followed by Rev. Robert Johnson in 1956, who was called from labor to his reward on January 8, 1957. His time with the church was short, but the fruit of his labor was abundant. We were once again sheep without a shepherd. We were wandering from the fold. We had one pulpit guest after another. We were very sad indeed, but believed God would always send someone to lead us.

We had our own Rev. Abraham Byrd who was the Pastor of another church, but as a loyal member of this church he stepped in to help us. His advice to us was, "Get on your knees and ask God to send a pastor and we would not go wrong."

### **Rev. Clarence L. Wells**

God sent Rev. Clarence L. Wells and he accepted our call in April, 1957. He came to us with his loyal wife, Sis. Alleda Ward Wells, who was an excellent musician. A new piano was purchased in 1957.

The stationery with correspondence dated 1960 revealed the following officers:

We were reinstated in the Berean District Association of which we were proud. We were also represented at the National and State Congress of Christian Education as well as the National Baptist Convention.

With Pastor Wells as our shepherd, many souls were added to God's work by baptism and restoration.

With the help of Deacons Earl McCrary, Enoch Bryant, John Carr, and Samuel Clark, Trustees Joseph Moss and Stanton Smart, and a loyal membership, Pastor Wells brought new life and many improvements to the church. The physical structure was improved. The Sunday School was greatly increased in numbers and interest. For many summers, we enjoyed a well organized Vacation Bible School under the leadership of Sis. Emma Stanley.

The land adjacent to the church at 353 S. Harrison was donated to us in September, 1975 by Mrs. Janet Smallwood in memory of her parents, Bro. James and Sis. Frankie Campbell. In December, 1975, a telephone was installed. Memorial windows for Sis. Alfrieda Cannon and her mother, Sis. Emma Stanley, were added.

Bro. Samuel Clark was added to the Benevolent Committee. Any expenditure over \$100 had to be approved by the church body.

In the years 1977-78, under the guidance of Pastor Wells, based on the scripture Matthew 7:7, "Ask and it shall be given to you, seek and ye shall find, knock and it shall be opened unto you", we were able to complete the renovation of the church. This included a baptizing pool, purchasing new pews with book racks from the National Chair and Furniture Co. for \$3,164.40, and a parking lot adjacent to the church.

Rev. C. L. Wells served as pastor for 20 years and 11 months. The Lord called him from labor to reward on March 8, 1979. He will always be remembered.

### **Reverend James F. Cobb**

Through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, Rev. James F. Cobb was called as our pastor. He and his wife, Sis. Anna L. Cobb came to us in May, 1979. Under Pastor Cobb, more of our members became affiliated with our Berean District work, attended State and National Congress of Christian Education meetings, and the National Baptist Convention. Souls were added by Christian experience and by baptism. Pastor Cobb reinstituted Bible study and prayer meetings, which were enjoyed by all who attended.

The first business meeting under Pastor Cobb was held December 9, 1979. Business meetings were held after morning service. The auxiliaries reporting at this time were Sunday School, Senior Choir, Willing Workers, Women's Missionary Union, Baptist Training Union, Pastor's Aid, Junior and Senior Ushers, Youth Choir, Young Adult WMU, Benevolent, and Building Fund. The building fund balance was \$2,450.59 and the balance in the General Fund was \$3,212.61.

Under his ministry, we purchased a new organ at a price of \$5,706.84. The sanctuary was enhanced by a beautiful paramount set on the communion table with matching scarves on the pulpit.

#### The Year of 1980

Our Pastor's wife, Sis. Anna L. Cobb became our Director of Christian Education. One of her first projects was to organize the young women. Shortly after coming to us, Sis. Cobb became ill, but attended service whenever she could. In February, 1980, she passed on to her reward. The Anna L. Cobb Memorial Scholarship Fund was established in memory of the late Sis. Anna L. Cobb, whose dedicated service will always be remembered. Sis. Mamie Ross, Chairman and Sis. Marcella Newton, Co-Chairman were quite successful in this effort, assisting the young people who were attending college.

Pastor Cobb appointed Sis. Dorothy Aitch to the publicity committee.

#### The Year of 1981

Many improvements to our facility were done. The steps in the rear were completed. The Officers, Bro. Stanton Smart, Sis. Wyoma Smart, Sis. Alfreida Cannon, Sis. Marcella Newton, The Willing Workers, and other members worked hard to provide a study for our pastor. The upstairs was remodeled at a cost of \$1,098. A new PA system was installed. The church became insured with a policy valued at \$60,000.

At the December 13, 1981 business meeting there was talk of an extension of the church building.

#### The Year of 1982

The Theme for the year was "Keep God First In Our Lives".

Vacation Bible School took on new life, with a tremendous increase in attendance. The young adults under the guidance of our Superintendent, Sis. Ruby Carr was very faithful in this effort. Our school hours were changed from 9 am - 12 noon to evenings 6:30 - 8:30 pm. For some time, Sis. Sharron White and Sis. Geneva Powell worked with Sis. Carr in providing interesting new literature for the classes. Pastor Cobb invited interesting lecturers and adult teachers for our adults who attended. Rev. Calvin Jones and his wife, Sis. Lavonne Jones served in this capacity for many years.

Improvements of placing carpeting in the sanctuary and dining room areas along with linoleum in the kitchen and restroom floors were spearheaded by Sis. Rosemary Clark and Sis. Sharron White. This was completed at a cost of \$2,916. A room air conditioner was also purchased for the sanctuary.

#### The Year of 1983

Sidewalks in the front and side of the building were laid and the steeple was closed. The front of the church was painted, the parking lot was paved and a storage shed was purchased.

Bro. Herschel Newton was appointed to the Trustee Board. Sis. Dorothy Clark became head of the food committee to give food to needy people every month. This was possibly under the Willing Workers.

Business meetings began to be held quarterly. At the June business meeting, Bro. Stanton Smart stated that funds should be set aside with the intention of building a new church building.

#### The Year of 1984

Second Sunday was designated Pledge Sunday. Sis. Geneva Powell was Pledge President and Sis. Irene Farrar was the Recorder.

Bro. Joseph Moss became a Deacon. Sis. Wyoma Smart, Sis. Marcella Newton and Sis. Rose Clark became members of the Trustee Board. Sis. Alfreida Cannon was the Church Clerk, Sis. Aquilla Eady was the Assistant Clerk, and Sis. Alfreida Lipscomb was the third clerk. Bro. Melvin White became an Altar Person. The Scholarship Committee consisted of Sis. Wyoma Smart, Sis. Marcella Newton, Sis. Mamie Ross, Sis. Kathy Harris and Sis. Alice Davis.

#### The Year of 1985

Sis. Mamie Briggs, Sis. Aquilla Eady and Sis. Lena Brandon were appointed as Deaconess to assist with devotion. Sis. Wyoma Smart became Chairman of the Trustee Board.

#### The Year of 1986

The Trustees spending limit without church approval was increased to \$200.

#### The Year of 1987

Bibles began to be given to new members. The church directory was instituted.

Bro. James Sheets became a Trustee. A Budget Committee was set up with Sis. Dianne Nickerson (Chairperson), Sis. Ronnie Cobb and Sis. Dorothy Sheets. The Benevolent Committee consisted of Sis. Lillian Parker, Bro. Joseph Moss, Sis. Gladys Moss and Pastor Cobb.

Ceiling fans were placed in the sanctuary and central air conditioning was installed.

#### The Year of 1988

Bro. Melvin White was appointed by our Pastor as a Trustee. Bro. White took a great interest in seeing to the needs of the church and in taking care of necessary repairs. The Junior Matrons began with Sis. Teresa Lang as the president. The Kitchen Committee consisted of Sis. Dorothy Aitch, Sis. Frances Weber and Sis. Wyoma Smart. Sis. Sharron White was added to the budget committee.

Weekly Bible study was started. Business meetings were changed from Sunday to Thursday nights. We placed \$5,000 in a certificate of deposit.

A complete new kitchen was installed with much praise and gratitude to the Kitchen Remodeling Committee, Bro. James Sheets, Sis. Dorothy Sheets and Sis. Alfreida Lipscomb. The kitchen was remodeled at a cost of \$5,310. Financial assistance for this came from a loyal friend of Sis. Alfreida Cannon, Ms. Florence Freymouth. A new furnace was purchased. A new microphone was purchased for the piano. Lighting was added to the sign in front of the church at a cost of \$295.

HAMBC adopted a room at the Berean House, a homeless shelter owned and operated by the Berean Missionary Baptist District Association. Additionally, a \$50 monthly donation was sent to Berean House. Beginning June 19, 1988, the third Sunday was designated as Berean House pledge Sunday.

Bro. Jeffery Croft announced his call to the ministry on the second Sunday in August, 1988. He preached his first sermon and received his license on the fourth Sunday in August. Pastor Cobb asked Rev. Croft to bring the message on every second Sunday. This allowed Rev. Croft to gain continued experience as a preacher. Soon after, his wife, Sis. Roslyn Croft became a member of our church.

Pastor David Rice, Sr. and Holy Trinity Missionary Baptist Church held their dedication services and baptisms at Harrison Avenue on October 9, 10, 11, 13<sup>th</sup>.

#### The Year of 1989

Our pastor's salary was increased by 100%. We paid Pastor Cobb's total expenses to attend the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education.

In March, our Sunday School class time was lengthened. Class would last until 10 am allowing at least 45 minutes for the study of the lesson.

Pastor Cobb instituted pledges for the purchase of a new roof. In September of this year the roof was replaced by Reger Roofing. A new thermostat with clock and timer was installed.

As of June, 1989 our Benevolent Committee consisted of Bro. Joseph Moss, Sis. Gladys Moss, Bro. Oscar Harris, Sis. Ruby Carr and Sis. Lillian Parker. The position of financial secretary was established with Sis. Roslyn Croft and Sis. Sharron White working together in the position. Sis. Alfreida Cannon resigned from position of church clerk after serving many years. Sis. Kathy Harris became church clerk; Sis. Sandra Crenshaw became announcing clerk. Sis. Alleda Wells resigned from being the church organist. An Organist Search Committee was established consisting of Sis. Sandra Crenshaw, Sis. Sharron White, Bro. Gregory Carr, and Sis. Ruby Carr.

A voucher system for reimbursements was established.

#### The Year of 1990

In 1990, the youth group Harrison Avenue Youth (H.A.Y.) was formed. Pastor Cobb appointed Sis. Dianne Nickerson to serve as the Director. Bro. James Sheets resigned from the Trustee Board.

Four baptisms were performed, Bro. Richard Schoenbauer, Bro. Kenneth Schoenbauer, Bro. Quincy Austin, and Sis. Dena Roberts.

#### The Year of 1991

We received third place in attendance for the 1990-91 year, at the Berean District Congress of Christian Education sessions and classes held on the second Monday night at Galilee Baptist Church.

A copy machine was purchased for the office. New tables were purchased for the dining area.

On the third Sunday in April, 1991 with his family, church family and many friends present, Rev. Croft was ordained under the pastorate of Rev. Cobb. Bro. Gregory Carr announced his call to the ministry on July 21, 1991. He preached his first sermon and received his license on August 11, 1991.

In September, our Outreach Ministry began with Sis. Roslyn Croft serving as the Outreach Coordinator. She involved the membership in sending cards and care packages to our members out of town, sending cards to visitors inviting them to attend Sunday School and worship again, and inviting neighborhood families to join us in our Vacation Bible School.

Our acknowledgment of visitors was moved up as a part of the announcement period at the suggestion of Sis. Sandra Crenshaw.

On December 12, 1991, at our quarterly business meeting, Rev. Cobb announced his resignation as our Pastor effective December 31, 1991 due to his poor health. A banquet in recognition of his service to HAMBC was held at the Top of the Sevens Restaurant in Clayton.

During our New Year's Eve Watch Night service, Bro. Robert Austin united with our church.

# **Reverend Jeffery G. Croft**

#### The Year of 1992

Acting upon Pastor Cobb's recommendation, Rev. Jeffery Croft was voted by the members to serve as our Interim Pastor with Rev. Greg Carr assisting him until we called a Pastor. At this time, Sis. Roslyn Croft resigned from the position of Financial Secretary.

Our church fared well and progress continued under the guidance of Rev. Jeffery Croft and our governing Board of Trustees, who were Sis. Wyoma Smart, Sis. Rose Clark, Bro. Oscar Harris, Bro. Melvin White, and Sis. Marcella Newton. At this time, Bro. Oscar Harris became the Chairperson. A pulpit committee comprised of Deacon Joseph Moss, Trustees Bro. Oscar Harris and Sis. Rose Clark, Sunday School Superintendent, Sis. Ruby Carr and member Bro. Alvin Miller began the difficult task of reviewing the applicants desiring to be pastor of our church.

Members began receiving copies of Business Meeting minutes beginning in January.

For the first time, our Choir and Usher Annual Days were combined. This service was very successful. This had been a suggestion of Usher President Sis. Lillian Parker and Sis. Geneva Powell in our September, 1991 quarterly meeting.

On June 11, 1992, the Pulpit Committee presented Rev. Jeffery Croft to the membership as the candidate for Pastorship. Assisting the members of Harrison Avenue with the voting procedures were Berean District Moderator Rev. Adrian F. Jones and Vice Moderator Rev. Edward Chapple. By the end of the evening, we had a new Pastor, Rev. Jeffery G. Croft. The installation service followed on July 19, 1992 with a spirit filled service. We were honored to have Rev. Croft's father, Pastor Willie Croft and his choirs from Union Grove M.B. Church of Forest, Mississippi and Mt. Carmel M.B. Church of Morton, Mississippi join us in the service. Our former Pastor, Rev. James F. Cobb was the Minister in Charge, Rev. Gregory Carr Associate Minister at Harrison Avenue and Rev. Kenneth Lee read the scriptures, Rev. Willie L. Croft brought the message, Rev. M.R. Lemons of Pilgrim M. B. Church of East St. Louis, Illinois gave the Charge to the Pastor, Rev. Calvin Jones of Union Baptist Church gave the Installation Prayer. In his 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Address in July 1992, Berean District Moderator Rev. Dr. Adrian F. Jones mentioned our calling Rev. Croft as Pastor.

Sis. Marcella Newton spearheaded an effort to provide our Pastor with a ministerial robe. The effort was such a success our pastor was able to purchase two robes, one traditional black robe and a beautiful white one for our first Sunday services.

The first business meeting with Rev. Croft as our pastor was held September 10, 1992. The heads of auxiliaries at this time were:

A new disciple's class was held with Rev. Abraham Byrd as the instructor. As a part of Outreach, we worked in conjunction with "Operation Bright Light" by sending boxes of necessary items to the victims of Hurricane Andrew in Florida and Louisiana in September, 1992.

In December, 1992, the music department was enhanced with the combining of the Youth Choir, Gospel Chorus, and the Senior Choir to form a mass choir under the direction of Sis. Sharron White and Bro. David McCrary, who joined us as our organist this year. The Organist Search Committee was disbanded. The Sunbeam Choir continues to lend their voices to our services.

Sis. Marcella Newton became the President of the Usher Board. Rev. Abraham Byrd became the Parliamentarian. Sis. Dianne Nickerson resigned from the position of Youth Director. Sis. Geneva Powell resigned from the Usher Board, including the position of Jr. Usher Director. Sis. Sandra Crenshaw resigned from the position of Announcing Clerk. Sis. Roslyn Croft was reinstated as the Financial Secretary in charge of reporting and Sis. Sharron White was Financial Secretary in charge of disbursements. In September of 1992, the Budget Committee was formed with Bro. Oscar Harris as the Chairperson. The other committee members were Sis. Sharron White, Sis. Roslyn Croft, Sis. Diana Harris and Bro. David McCrary.

At our quarterly business meeting in December, 1992, Pastor Croft posed the question to the membership about building a new church. Permission was given to the Pastor at this meeting to form a Building Committee. This committee was later named the Land Acquisition Committee and consisted primarily of Pastor Croft and Sis. Dianne Nickerson.

Eight souls were added to or reunited with our church, Sis. Nicole White, Bro. Jerry Inman, Bro. Sterling Thompson, Sis. Stacey Thompson, Sis. Mary Thompson, Bro. James Austin, Bro. Titus Moore, and Bro. John Carr, Sr.

#### The Year of 1993

Our Mission and Outreach on behalf of Kirk Care began a food distribution project. Each Saturday, from May through September, produce items from the Kirkwood Farmer's Market were distributed free of charge. This project allowed us to provide food items to those in need in our community. In June, we participated for the first time in the Meacham Park Homecoming Parade. We had over 30 participants all proudly wearing our new red t-shirts while carrying our banner and signs. Our t-shirts displayed our Pastor's slogan, "The Lord Is Blessing Us - Right Now!!" Fliers were passed out inviting parade goers to our services and food distribution.

Our Pastor's 1<sup>st</sup> Anniversary was celebrated on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in July. His brother, Rev. Shawn Croft, Green Grove Missionary Baptist Church, Chunky, Mississippi was the speaker.

In September, 1993, Sis. Mamie Ross' name was added to become the Anna L. Cobb/Mamie Ross Memorial Scholarship Fund. The committee consisted of Sis. Marcella Newton, Sis. Dorine Miller and Sis. Gloria Nickerson.

Also in September of 1993, we traveled by Jim Wright & Sons charter bus to Jackson and Morton, Mississippi to attend the closing service of a week-long revival at Mt. Carmel Missionary Baptist Church.

A second telephone line was installed in the pastor's study. Bro. James Austin and Pastor Croft made repairs to the baptismal pool. This included repainting and repairing the steps. The inside swinging doors to the sanctuary were replaced.

Night Sunday School and the Harvest Home banquet were held for the last time.

Bro. Joseph Moss resigned from the position of Custodian. Bro. Melvin White bid on and was selected for the position.

Our average Sunday morning worship attendance for 1993 was 35 people. We received five new members, Bro. David McCrary, Bro. Charles Kennedy, Sis. Leslie Jones, Bro. Melvin Petty, and Sis. Adrian Drummond; the latter two were candidates for baptism.

#### The Year of 1994

Our Pastor announced our theme for the year to be "Continued Growth". This year we received twelve new members. Sis. Sandra Adams, Sis. Jerilyn Carr, Sis. Joy Smith, and Sis. Patsy McCrary were received on Christian Experience and and eight baptisms were performed - Bro. John Carr, Jr., Sis. Jasmine Harris, Sis. Kelly Schoenbauer, Sis. Karmen Parker, Sis. Michelle Smith, Sis. Lydia Washington, Bro. Trevor Thompson, and Bro. Charles Crenshaw were candidates for baptism. This increased our membership to 71 people. Although the Lord blessed us to grow, He also called home two of our members, Bro. David McCrary and Sis. LaVerne Harris.

In preparation for efforts for a new building, Pastor Croft instituted a new pledge program. Pastor Croft asked each member to give an additional \$25 per month. This would add \$54,000 to our building fund in just three years.

Pastor Clifton Graham, First Baptist Church of Valley Park, was the speaker for our Spring Revival.

In June of 1994, Deacon Joseph Moss and Sis. Gladys Moss moved to Kansas City, Missouri after 54 year of service at HAMBC. We were at this time without any Deacons. After attending Deacon Training classes with Rev. Adrian Jones, Bro. Darryl Carr, Bro. John Carr Sr., and Bro. Oscar Harris became Deacons as a part of our 1994 Church Anniversary service.

At the June quarterly business meeting the membership adopted the statement, "You Don't Have to Dress Up to Come to Harrison Avenue". This was done in order to make others feel comfortable coming to our church and to take the emphasis off of what you wear and place it more on what's in your heart.

Sis. Rose Clark became the Assistant Sunday School Superintendent. Sis. Tiffany White became the Announcing Clerk. A Church Historian committee was established consisting of Sis. Geneva Powell, Sis. Rose Clark, Sis. Nancy Schoenbauer and Sis. Ruby Carr.

Pastor Calvin Jones, Union Baptist Church of St. Louis was the speaker for our Pastor's 2<sup>nd</sup> Anniversary.

The retainer wall on the north side of the parking lot was repaired. Additional pew holders were installed and filled with new Bibles and hymnals.

In September, 1994, the landowner verbally agreed to sell the land behind the church to us.

Our average Sunday morning worship attendance for 1994 was 48 people.

#### The Year of 1995

This year we were blessed with four new members, Sis. Kim Ratliff, Sis. Amanda Parks, Bro. Martin Drummond, and Sis. Rayna Wilson. The latter three were candidates for baptism. The Lord also took from us this year our dear Bro. Louis Hinds, who throughout the years provided us with much wisdom and knowledge.

Because of our Pastor's belief in tithing, he instituted a program where we would give 10% of its intake back to the community thus beginning HAMBC's 10% fund. The distribution of these funds is handled by the Benevolent Committee, but other items such as donations to other churches and guest speakers are also distributed from this fund.

Bro. Darrell Carr accepted his call into the ministry. He speaks as the Lord guides and directs him.

As a part of our Outreach Ministry, we began our tape ministry. Cassette tapes of our services could be obtained from Sis. Kim Ratliff and given to the sick and shut-in or purchased for your own personal library. In late 1995 a tract ministry was started with Sis. Sandra Adams serving as chairperson.

Harrison Avenue's Outreach Ministry, with Sis. Roslyn Croft as the coordinator sponsored a Witnessing Seminar with very good attendance. Pastor Eugene Wright, Olive Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church was the instructor. Our Mission President, Sis. Dorothy Clark and Outreach Coordinator, Sis. Roslyn Croft also kept us informed of the needs of Kirk Care. Sis. Dorothy Clark is a member of the Kirk Care Board of Directors and Sis. Roslyn Croft serves on the Executive Board.

We again participated in the Meacham Park Homecoming Parade in 1995. We also shared a booth with the Mosley/Clayton Family and used the moment to sign up candidates for our Vacation Bible School. This effort was lead by Sis. Rose Clark, who spearheaded our VBS, which took on new life this year and was a huge success. A pictorial review of our 1995 VBS was made.

God continued to bless Harrison Avenue. As the praises went up, his bountiful blessings came down. We thank God for an inspired leader. Our leader boldly states that he walks and talks with the Father. Pastor Jeffery G. Croft, celebrated his 3rd Anniversary as leader of this flock on July 9, 1995. Pastor Mack R. Lemons, Pilgrim Baptist Church, East St. Louis, Illinois was the speaker for this service.

As a part of the historical committee Sis. Rose Clark and Sis. Geneva Powell, in September, 1995 presented three wall plaques to serve as a memorial for all of our deceased members. Our business meeting dates were changed from the Thursday before the second Sunday to the Thursday before the third Sunday. Our bank accounts were switched from United Missouri Bank to Commerce Bank.

Our theme has become "We've Come This Far By Faith - Catch On To The Vision - Faith!" Our Pastor had a vision of a new sanctuary. Sis. Wyoma Smart resigned from the Trustee Board. Our remaining Trustees were Bro. Oscar Harris, Sis. Rose Clark, Sis. Marcella Newton and Bro. Melvin White (also

Treasurer). Sis. Dianne Nickerson resigned from the Baptismal Committee and the soon to be disbanded Land Acquisition Committee.

After receiving authority from the church body the Pastor, Land Acquisition Committee, and Trustees proceeded to purchase property, primarily located behind us, 24,314<u>+</u> square feet as the first step in our building project. The property was deeded to us on October 31, 1995 at a price of \$24,000. To God be the Glory!! A loan was taken with Commerce Bank in the amount of \$11,000 in order to establish credit with the bank. The other \$13,000 was taken from the building fund. On December 12, 1995, we purchased the property at 351 S. Harrison from St. Louis County for \$1.00. With this completed, the Land Acquisition Committee was disbanded and a new Building Committee was formed. The Building Committee consisted of Pastor Croft, Bro. Oscar Harris, Bro. John Carr, Bro. Alvin Miller, and Sis. Sharron White.

In November, the window on the north side of the dining room was broken and our church was burglarized. We were blessed that the only thing taken were the pennies collected by our youth on Sunday mornings.

Two memorial gifts were dedicated at our Church Anniversary Service. A new framed church covenant was placed in the sanctuary. This covenant was donated as a memorial gift from the family of Sis. LaVerne Harris who passed away in November of 1994 after serving as our WMU President, Willing Workers President and a member of the Benevolent Committee. A musical keyboard was donated in memory of Bro. David McCrary, who had grown up at Harrison Avenue, returned as our Organist in 1992 and reunited as a member in 1993.

#### The Year of 1996

We were blessed to see three of our members, Sis. Annette Bridges, Bro. Rodney Carr, and Bro. Robert Carr return to us rededicating their lives to the work of the Lord!

During the summer of 1996, God called the following faithful and dedicated members home to eternal rest: Sis. Mamie Briggs, Usher, President of Pastor's Aid for over 30 years, Historian and member since 1924 - 72 years; Sis. Alfreida Cannon, Choir Member, Church Clerk and member since 1924 - 72 years; Sis. Ruby Carr, Choir Member, Sunday School Superintendent, Benevolent Committee, member since 1959 - 37 years, and very active member of Berean District; Sis. Rose Clark, Trustee, Assistant Sunday School Superintendent, Youth and Sunbeam Choir Director; Choir Member, Vacation Bible School Coordinator, and Historical committee; and Bro. Charles Jackson who had worshipped with us and had expressed an interest in being united with our church. All of these, our beloved sisters and brother in Christ will be greatly missed by our family. Their names have been placed on our wall plaques.

The scholarship fund grew so that we were able to reach out beyond Harrison Avenue to help a student, Greg Drummond, with college expenses along with our own Sis. Tiffany White and Sis. Dena Roberts. We put a lot of emphasis on education here. Sis. Diana Harris organized a back-to-school breakfast for our youth. We enjoyed good food, issued school supplies and helpful information, then

Bro. Alvin Miller gave a "pep" talk. He talked about choosing friends carefully, the importance of extra-curricular activities and most of all, doing the best you can to make good grades.

Vacation Bible School was held jointly with Unity Baptist Church. Staff was chosen from both church bodies. It was such a success that this partnership was tried again the next year at Harrison Avenue.

Several members including our Pastor are members of the Berean District Choir. Our Pastor also serves on the Berean House Board of Directors and is Assistant Recording Secretary of the District. We also faithfully support the Berean District Ushers and WMU. #### The Year of 1997

Rodney John Marshall Carr, by Christian experience-Sis. Sherry Cannon and Sis. Michelle Chapman. Sherry came in and immediately started working diligently. She became our Assistant Sunday School Superintendent. Several of our new members were youth. We prayed for all of our new members but especially for our youth. We prayed that those of us who are before them would set good examples for them to follow and help them in their Christian growth.

Through our research, this year we found information which reports that Harrison Avenue Missionary Baptist Church was organized in 1880. Although early records were not kept, several historical documents, including the <u>African American Heritage Guide of St. Louis</u>; <u>Discovering African Americans</u>; and the <u>History of Kirkwood</u> reveal our early existence.

The history that we have in existence at the present time was prepared by the late Sis. Mamie Briggs and has been updated as the years went by. Therefore, we are trying to keep accurate records so that in years to come we will be able to look back and see our heritage.

We continue our support of the Berean House, EduCare and Hope Unlimited. We added Kirk Care to our list of organizations we support financially. Our benevolent committee has had a very busy year reaching out to those who need our assistance both in our immediate community and beyond. We do indeed put the "missionary" part of our name in action.

All these projects were very successful.

Sis. Diane Carr became Chairperson of Ways & Means Committee. Sis. Sharron White and Sis. Diana Harris assisted her.

Bro. Quincy Austin joined Deacon Oscar Harris and Deacon Alvin Miller as a group leader of some of the young men in the Mission Youth Group.

The Outreach Ministry distributed survival bags to Youth in Action and Berean House. On Saturday evenings, May through September, we still did the food distribution for Kirk Care with produce from Kirkwood Farmer's Market.

# HISTORY OF HARRISON AVENUE MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH

#### Updated January 2018

In January, 2010, Pastor Croft preached at the Kirkwood Ministerial Alliance Service of Prayer for Unity held at Kirkwood Baptist Church. Minister Antonio Floyd was also a participant. A number of our members supported Sis. Croft at the Berean District Ministers' Wives and Widows Annual Prayer Breakfast in March, 2010. This is to benefit the J.E. Fiddmont Scholarship. Sis. Croft is the scholarship chairperson, thus chairman of the event.

Our faithful member, Sis. Mabel Roberts was called to receive her heavenly reward in 2010. She served as an Usher, Chairman of the Kitchen Committee, regularly attended Bible study, and was in charge of decorations for our events and services.

Our new Harrisonians for 2010 by Christian experience were Dana Hill and Theresa Fuller; by baptism Arrione Taylor (Desi) and Tonye Fuller. Jonathan Lowery rededicated his life to Christ. Our Deaconsin-Training are Bro. Johnny Thomas, Bro. Jeremy Jones and Bro. Carl Jones, Jr.

Through his participation in the Kirkwood Ministerial Alliance, our Pastor has also become friends with Pastor Ed Plant of Geyer Road Baptist Church. Pastor Croft was the speaker for one of their evening services. We are appreciative to Pastor Plant and the members of Geyer Road for sharing their facilities with us for multiple baptisms, funeral service, and our 2010 Candlelight Service.

We continue to worship with Kirkwood Baptist. In June, 2010, our Pastor preached at their morning worship and in August Harrison Avenue held service at Kirkwood Baptist with Kirkwood Baptist's ministry intern Robert Jackson bringing the message.

Our Trustee Board worked tirelessly to secure financing for our building project. The tough downturn in the nation's economy made this a difficult task. On March 7, 2010, we temporarily moved our Sunday morning worship to the Rose Hill House, a senior living facility located just a few blocks away. This move was made at the recommendation of the Trustees. Our office was moved into the annex. Bible study and auxiliary meetings are held in the annex.

Romans 8:25 reads – "But we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it." Like some other churches there have been times we have had doubt and discouragement but a still small voice said, "take courage – the Lord will make a way somehow". And so He has. Proverbs 3:5-6 reads, "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge Him and He shall direct thy path."

In June, 2010 our Pastor presented a funding proposal request to Eagle Bank, a locally owned bank. We are thankful to our friends at Kirkwood Baptist Church for connecting our Pastor with this institution. As God would have it, our initial contact at Eagle Bank was Mr. Jim Hall who had been the President of Pioneer Bank and worked with us when we purchased the annex. The Lord blessed him and his colleagues to again find favor with HAMBC.

Rev. Curtis Laster, our Pastor's son-in-law from Chunky, Mississippi, brought the message for our Pastor's 18<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. A cake and punch reception was held immediately following morning worship at the Rose Hill House.

On September 12, 2010, a meeting of the membership was held after service. It was announced that Eagle Bank had approved our loan. It was unanimously approved for our trustees to move forward with the loan and the building of our new church.

We thank God for His goodness down through the years – allowing us to stand for 130 years – saving souls, changing minds, fixing hearts and turning lives around and definitely teaching Jesus! On September 26, 2010, we celebrated our 130<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. It was celebrated as a casual Sunday and Bro. Cornell Newburn and Minister Floyd coordinated an afternoon of food and fellowship at the annex. That same evening our choir participated in Kirkwood United Methodist's Kirkwood Stock, a musical event held this time on their church parking lot.

On October 1, 2010, our Trustees, Sis. Gloria Nickerson (Chairperson), Bro. Rodney Carr, Bro. Oscar Harris, Bro. Carl Jones, Bro. Cornell Newburn, and Bro. Melvin White closed on the loan for our new building. On Tuesday afternoon, October 5, 2010 our old building was torn down. Many members, family, friends and community members joined us. This historic event in our history was featured on the front page of the October 22, 2010 issue of the Webster-Kirkwood Times.

Many are saddened by the thought of our building being torn down but remember the building is not the church – the building houses the church body. The ground breaking for our building was held that Friday, October 8, 2010. The event featured refreshments, members wearing yellow hard hats with the slogan, "We Pray, We Build", words from our Pastor, prayer by Pastor Scott Stearman, Kirkwood Baptist and the turning over of dirt by our Pastor, Dawn Videmschek of JC Custom Homes, Bro. Anthony Adkins Jr. (representing the young members), and Sis. Wyoma Smart (representing our long-time members). The event concluded with the releasing of balloons.

Isaiah 40:31 reads, "But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount upon wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk and not faint." We waited and trusted and prayed! The warriors who were strong building blocks for the foundation of this church are looking down on us to continue on as a beacon of light shining brightly to lead those who are lost and seeking the right path to God. Prayerfully as we enter the building of a new sanctuary we will have renewed strength and grow as committed Christians and Disciples for Christ.

In preparation for the dedication services, our Pastor formed a committee of all auxiliary heads to plan the celebration of the completion of our new building. The first meeting was held, November 7, 2010. The committee included the Sis. Kathy Harris (Mission), Sis. Renee Peeples (Ushers), Sis. Jackie Van Alstyne (Precious Pearls), Sis. Roslyn Croft (Benevolent), Sis. Geneva Powell (History Committee), Bro. Carl Jones (Sunday School), Sis. Joe Ann Gardner (Pastor's Aid) and Sis. Sharron White (Music and Youth).

#### Beginning February, 2011 – Our Super Sunday

#### OUR NEW BUILDING

On Sunday morning, February 6, 2011, our Pastor led 130 of our members and friends as we marched into our new building singing "We've Come This Far By Faith". That morning, our scripture was what we used the entire year, Psalms 100 – specifically verse 4 – Enter Into His Gates with Thanksgiving and Into His Courts with Praise and my subject was Great Is Our God.

Our Dedication Committee made up of Auxiliary heads did a wonderful job pulling together our three days of dedication services. The afternoon of February 6<sup>th</sup>, we were joined by over 200 guests. We were blessed to have Dr. Wendell Bonner of First Baptist Church of Webster Groves as our speaker. He brought the word from 2 Chronicles 7:12-14 and asked us, "If we were down with O.P.P. – Obedience, Praise and Power?" On Monday evening with 113 in attendance, we were joined by Pastor Ed Plant of Geyer Road Baptist Church who gave special remarks and Pastor Scott Stearman of Kirkwood Baptist talked about "An Uncontainable God" using Acts Chapter 8. On our final night of dedication we had 128 in attendance, our Berean District Family, including all District Auxiliary Presidents came and supported us. Our Moderator, Dr. Carlton Caldwell preached to us from Nehemiah 4:6 and talked to us about "Having a Mind to do the Lord's Work.

Our Building Demolition was a front page story of The Webster-Kirkwood Times and although not front page, they featured our dedication. In addition, in April they published a letter written on our behalf by Rodney J.M. Carr thanking the community for their support of our Church.

We thank God for blessing us with our new building. Our kitchen is dedicated in Memory of Sis. Mabel Roberts who served as Chairman of our Kitchen Committee until God called her. Our piano was dedicated in the honor of Sis. Alice Davis. She was able to witness our building demolition, but God called her home before she was able to worship in our new sanctuary. We now have a beautiful sanctuary, fellowship area, media area upstairs, Pastor's study, classrooms, library area, and five bathrooms in our Church.

Work soon began to beautify our grounds and we've continued to work on getting our Annex in good shape both upstairs and down. We made one large room upstairs in the annex and downstairs we've added drain tile, walls and shelving. These changes now allow us to all sit down and fellowship together in the same space.

We have made a commitment to share what God has given us with our community.

Bro. Jeremy Jones has been able to bless youngsters in our community by providing weekly tutoring sessions.

Our Pastor, Sis. Mattie McCrary, and Sis. Geneva Powell have been working hard with the Shepherd's Center of Kirkwood/Webster. Through their efforts, our facility is the home of the Shepherd's Center – Harrison Avenue Adventures in Learning program. This is a ministry for seniors in our community.

#### OUR DISCIPLESHIP

We are thankful to have been able to hold our regular annual events and even added some new activities to our calendar.

We began S.E.E.D.S. Bible Study (Spiritual Elements Essential for Discipleship) and have completed Series One – Discipleship and new Life and Series Two – Discipleship and Life Choices. We are now in Series Three – Discipleship and Family Life. It is a study series that helps us to do self examination and deals with life's everyday issues. On March 20<sup>th</sup>, we had a potluck fellowship in the annex. In May and August , our ladies had "lunch and a movie" outings. Sis. Jackie VanAlstyne was the chairperson for our Family and Friends Day May 22, 2011. The theme was Forgiven and Forgiving – Mathew 6:15. The speaker was Minister Donnell Alexander of Trinity Mt. Carmel and special music was provided by Rev. Bartlett Wilkerson and Baptist Church of the Holy Communion.

The Pastor's Aid Committee put together an excellent celebration for the Pastor's 19<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Our new generation of Diamonds in the Rough, Imani, Mavis and Treasure made their debut. Minister Floyd spoke in the morning and Pastor Kory Ellis and the Nazarene Baptist Church family were our special guests for the afternoon.
