

#### Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome to the 2016-2017 school year. This handbook has been prepared to inform you about our school's policies, regulations and expectations. We are committed to working and helping every student succeed and excel during their time with us. In order for us to meet our goal, we need your help, and commitment.

To support our students academically, in and out of school, we need to have a shared understanding of our children's learning and work as partners to meet their academic and social/emotional needs.

In order to maximize our students' potential and continue to improve their progress in school, the Department of Education has implemented the following changes:

This year we will hold four (4) Parent-Teacher Conferences. Our first conference, "Meet the Staff" night will be held on Thursday, September 22, 2016 from 5:00-8:00 PM. 

- Our second Parent/Teacher Conference will be held on Thursday, November 3, 2017 from1:00-3:00 PM and 5:00-8:00 PM. At this time, you will receive your child's first report card for this school year. This year we plan to schedule appointments so that every parent has a specific time to meet with their child's teacher.
- Our Spring Parent/Teacher Conference will be held on, Thursday, March 9, 2017 from 1:00-3:00 PM and 5:00-8:00 PM. At this time, you will receive your child's second report card for this school year. This will be a half day of school. During this conference the teachers will share a sample of exemplary student performance (what your child is expected to be doing compared to what your child is

presently doing) to help you understand the expectations for higher quality student work.

Our May Conference will be held on Thursday, May 17, 2017 from 5:00-8:00 PM. This recently added conference will be used to review promotional concerns as well as other aspects of your child's progress or lack of.

Every Tuesday teachers will be available from 2:30 pm to 3:00 pm to meet and discuss your child's progress and or concerns.

### Important information

All families are required to complete the Blue Emergency Card with updated information. Additionally, every family must complete and submit a lunch form. The lunch forms can now be done online to reduce our paperwork.

#### Attendance

Regular attendance will ensure your child's success at PS 397. Please make every effort to bring your child to school every day. Please try to schedule doctor's appointments after 2:20 PM whenever possible. We have implemented the **Automated School Messenger** system. You will receive phone calls if your child is absent, late and will also receive information about upcoming events and/or meetings.

### **School Hours**

School hours are from 8:00AM-2:20PM Monday through Friday. The students can report to school as early as 7:30 AM. The students will sit in the lunchroom and wait for the teachers to pick them up. Students will begin their classes at 8:00 AM. Teachers pick up their students promptly at 8:00 AM. If your child arrives to school after 8:10 AM he/she will be marked late. It is imperative that students be in their rooms to assure that they receive the instruction to succeed.

## Line-Up

All students will sit with their class at their designated tables. Teachers will meet the students at 8:00 am in the lunchroom and take them to their classrooms. Students will line up and walk quietly out of the lunchroom with their class room teachers.

Students in grades Pre-K through 2 will use Exit 1 near the main office.

Students in grades 3 through 5 will use stair C to exit the lunchroom.

Children will continue to eat breakfast in the classroom from 8:05 am-8:25 am. Students may not be brought up to the class before 8:00 am for any reason. Do not tell a parent that their child can meet you before 8:00 am unless you have already advised administration, school safety,

#### School Curriculum

Beginning this school year 2016-2017, PS 397 will be implementing its new ELA Wonders and My Math curricula across all grades.

### **Common Core Learning Standards Overview**

## Homework Policy

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Homework reinforces, learning, develops the habit of independent study, enriches the curriculum and helps your child to budget their leisure time.

Twenty to thirty minutes conscientiously complete their homework. As part of every night's homework, your child must be complete a reading assignment. Grades K and 1 should read for a minimum of 15 minutes. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> graders should read for a minimum of 20 minutes and 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders should read for more than 30 minutes.

## AfterSchool Programs

PS 397 has received funding from grants for this school year. As such, we will be hosting our afterschool programs for grades 2 – 5 (information will be forthcoming in the October newsletter).

#### Saturday Academy

There will be a Saturday Academy for grades 3 – 5 that focuses on test preparation geared to prepare our students for the NYS ELA and math exams next year.

#### Uniforms

Our school's uniform is navy blue pants/skirts and yellow blouse/shirt. Uniforms are intended to help schools promote a more effective learning climate, foster school unity and pride, improve student performance, foster self-esteem, minimize costs to parents and help improve student conduct and discipline.

### **Cell Phones and Games**

Students will follow the Chancellor's new cell phone regulation. All cell phones and electronic devices must be turned off during school hours, if not they will be confiscated. Please place all cell phones in a labelled envelope and give it to Mrs. Monteau or Ms. Kellman. Parents will be contacted to pick up the cell phone.

#### Illnesses

If your child is ill and is absent for 1 to 2 days, please notify the school and have him/her bring a note when he/she returns. If the illness lasts longer, notify the school as to when your child is expected to return. If the absences exceed 3 days, a doctor's note is required.
