

Religious Education classes for students will begin on Sunday, September 15th.

Eucharistic Revival in the Catholic Church:

Weekly Bulletin Articles

The Catholic Church in the United States has been on a 3-year process of Eucharistic Revival, and we are now in the 2nd year and focusing on revival at the parish level (see this website for more, https://www.eucharisticrevival.org). In addition to trying our best to celebrate every single Mass reverently, attentively, and prayerfully, one effort we will be making is *to write a small bulletin article every week for a year* in order to help all people understand the Catholic Mass more fully. Not only can this help us understand how each prayer and symbol and movement has deep meaning and symbolism, but all the prayers, symbols, and movements should also lead us into the reality of Christ's love on the Cross and His grace poured out from the Resurrection and how we can encounter Him present to us today throughout the entirety of the Mass! Please consider reading along each week with these bulletin articles to help you better understand the history, meaning, beauty, and reality of what we celebrate every weekend as Catholics. This can help us to have a Eucharistic Revival at our parish, and to know, love, and serve Christ more fully every time we attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass here at OLV.

The Most Powerful Intercessory Prayer - Offering a Mass Intention for Someone

How can I best pray for this person? Whether it is someone who has passed away from this world, someone who is a friend or family member who is in need, or just someone we want to pray for in a special way because we care about them, what is the most powerful or best or highest form of prayer we can say on their behalf? The short answer is – <u>offer a Mass intention</u> for them because, objectively, that is highest form of prayer possible in the history of humanity on this earth.

We all want to pray for people who we love or people that we know are in need, but sometimes we might struggle with exactly how should I pray for them? Do I just say their name? Do I pray an Our Father? A Hail Mary? A Glory Be? Do I just talk to God for a while about their situation? What is the best way to pray for them, and how should I be approaching this type of intercessory prayer?

The answer to all of these questions above is – YES! There are many types of ways to pray for people, and whether it is saying just one Our Father, just saying someone's names, or just talking to God about someone who needs prayers, all of those methods are beautiful ways of asking God to pour out His grace in their lives in a special way. But in addition to these methods of praying from our hearts, we should also realize that prayer as a general rule is always moving through Jesus to God the Father on our behalf. Jesus is the one mediator between God and human beings (1 Timothy 2:5). In other words, Jesus presents and brings all our prayers to God the Father in order for them to become spiritually fruitful for our souls and for the spiritual good of the entire world.

With that understanding, now we can return to our original conclusion. Why is the Mass the most powerful form of intercessory prayer? When we intercede on behalf of others, why is the Catholic Mass considered the most powerful way to pray for them? The reason is very simple – Jesus becomes most fully present to us during the Mass. In fact, as we reflected on over these past few weeks, Jesus indeed becomes fully present, but it is truly Jesus' love (Because Jesus is the infinite God become man) and His one sacrifice on the Cross that transcends time and space to become fully present to us at every single Mass. Think about it like this: what if you could stand at the foot of Cross and prayer for people that you love? What if you could walk with Jesus on the way to Calvary and pray for others? What is you could sit with Jesus after He rises from the dead, and pray for people that are in need?! This is exactly what happens when you offer a Mass intention on behalf of someone here at our Church!

Practically speaking,

- all you need to do is to contact our parish office and ask to have a Mass said for a particular person (whether they are still alive or certainly even if they have passed away).
- You can request a specific date (or just the next date available), and if that is not already taken, then my main intention as the priest will be to offer a Mass for your intention on that day.
- We do ask for a \$10 donation for each Mass intention, but if there is some reason that this is too difficult for you, please let me know, and we can make something work in this regard.
- Finally, we also offer physical cards for each Mass intention that you can take with you (either to keep for yourself or to give as a gift to others for example, giving the card to a family that has lost someone they love).

There is much more that could be said, but suffice it to say, the Mass is the perfect prayer because it is Jesus who becomes present, Jesus who takes our prayers, and Jesus who makes them fruitful for others!

The Word of God Alive: Discussing the Readings with your children

Have you ever felt left out or treated unfairly? How has that affected how you treat others?

In the second reading, James is scolding his listeners for judging people based on their appearances. When he says that the poor are rich in faith, he is saying that the poor, who believe in and love God, should be treated with respect. We can agree that we all want to be treated with respect. But if we want to be treated with respect, we need to treat others with respect.

How do you show respect for others? Have you ever judged someone based on appearance without knowing them?

In the Gospel, some people brought a man who was deaf and could hardly speak to Jesus. They begged Jesus to touch him. Jesus touched the man's ears and his tongue. Looking toward heaven, Jesus said, "Ephphatha!" which means "Be opened!" Immediately, the man could hear and speak. Jesus commands all of us to be open! Jesus calls us to be open to God's Word and to be open to sharing God's love with others.

We need to reach out to the poor, the hungry, the ignored, and the lonely. No matter how old we are, with the help of the Holy Spirit we can do something.
