Mayor's Letter

Hope this message finds you all well, and thoroughly enjoying the last fleeting moments of summer. We're gearing up for the Fall Arts & Crafts Show on September 23rd and 24th, and, as always, will be looking for volunteers to work alongside Town Council members and Town Staff to support this event. The Craft Show was once again voted "Best Community Event/Festival" by InsideNOVA's Best of Prince William competition, and continues to supplement our annual Town budget, allowing us to continue to invest in programs, services, and capital improvements. On September 5th, before the regularly scheduled Town Council meeting, we will be holding a joint public hearing with the Planning Commission and the Town Council to hear community response to the proposed comprehensive amendments to our Zoning and Subdivision ordinances (Chapters 54 and 66 of the Occoquan Town Code). This process is the next step in our continued effort to align the 2016 adopted Comprehensive Plan with existing Town Code. If you've missed any of the predecessor steps in the process, or would like to view the proposed code changes in advance of Tuesday's meeting, please visit www.OccoquanVA.gov to view the documents under consideration. You may also visit Town Hall during office hours.

Recently, the Town partnered with Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson, Inc. (JMT) to conduct a parking and traffic study in Occoquan. To reduce contract costs, some members of Town Staff and Council have volunteered considerable time in the Historic Business District collecting data related to parking inventory, occupancy, and turnover. The information collected has been provided to JMT, who will use the data, along with information obtained during the community meeting on September 27, to provide recommendations for both short and long-term solutions to our parking and traffic challenges. Please join us on September 27, to provide your observations, recommendations, and/or concerns.

Finally, a tremendous "thank you" to Laurie Holloway and Deanna Lankford who have adopted the Keep Prince William Beautiful/Town of Occoquan Adopt-a-Spot under the Route 123 Bridge. Laurie and Dee join existing Adopt-a-Spot volunteers, Earnie Porta and the Gaslight Landing community, in taking an active role in conservation and protection efforts in Occoquan. Thank you!

Parking and Traffic Study Community Meeting
Wednesday, September 27, at Town Hall

The Town of Occoquan is working with Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson, Inc. (JMT) to conduct a parking and traffic study and will host a community input session on **Wednesday, September 27, from 5 to 7 p.m.** at Town Hall. JMT will provide a presentation including a brief project overview at 5 p.m. and 6 p.m., followed by Q&A. Businesses, residents and visitors are invited to attend to learn about the study and provide input. Initial data from recent parking counts and surveys will be available for review. The final report is expected to be presented to Town Council during the October work session.
