

He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life. (1 John 5:12)



"That is sad news, indeed, and just before Christmas," responded Pastor Mohr. "I'll have to write a simple Christmas hymn the people can sing without the organ. We don't want to disappoint them on Christmas Eve."

"Good idea, Pastor, I don't think the perfect Christmas hymn has been written. If anyone can write a hymn, you surely can. Perhaps I can compose a tune for it," said Franz Gruber.

Father Mohr went to his study and wrote the words to Silent Night. He took the copy to Franz Gruber and asked if he would write the melody for it.

After seeing the words, Franz Gruber exclaimed, "Friend Mohr, you have found it—the right song—God be praised." He then began writing a tune to match the words of the hymn. Little did they realize they had written the perfect Christmas song. They both sang the hymn to the accompaniment of Gruber's guitar for the Christmas Eve service.

Do you like this Christmas carol? Is it a favorite in your family? God be praised! It tells us the good news of God's Son. It presents three pictures or snapshots, as it were, from the Christmas Gospel, out of which those who are well acquainted with Scripture can construct the rest of the story.

The first picture from that silent, holy night is that of mother and child in the stable of Bethlehem. "All is calm, all is

bright, round yon virgin mother and Child, holy Infant, so tender and mild" as they "sleep in heavenly peace."

Jesus brings calm and brightness wherever He is. He is the one who calms your fears. He replaces anxiety, fright, and fear with a calm that only the Son of God can give. With His presence, He makes a gloomy day bright. Those who believe in Him as the Son of God know that He can turn sadness into happiness. He turns weariness and unhappiness into joy and brightness. When we know and realize the real reason for Christmas, and we have Jesus in our hearts, we can say with the hymn writer that for us as well, "All is calm! All is bright!" This Christmas, sing the carol with joy and let the Son of God turn your gloom, sadness, and fears into joy.

The second picture from this most holy night takes us out to the fields of Bethlehem where we see "shepherds quake at the sight" as they watch "glories stream from afar" and as they listen to those "heavenly hosts sing, 'Alleluia, Christ, the Savior is born! Christ, the Savior, is born!"

The third picture, however we interpret it, is the picture of salvation being extended to us and all men. To have life, our text for this devotion says, we must have the Son of God. "He who has the Son has life." The hymn writer calls the Son of God "love's pure light." Indeed, Jesus is the light of the world. He, the Son of God, became the Savior of the world. "With the dawn of redeeming grace," with "radiant beams from thy holy face," He brought light from darkness. Those who believe in Him as the Son of God and Savior have salvation.

Prayer: Dear Jesus, thank You for Christmas. Thank You for coming to earth to bring joy. Thanks for calming our troubled hearts and minds. Thanks for bringing the light of salvation to all who believe You are the Savior. Savior, bless our Christmas with Your great joy. In Your name we pray. Amen.

Background of the Hymn:

This hymn was written by Joseph Mohr in 1818. The tune was composed by Franz Gruber the same year. After these two writers sang the hymn in Oberndorf, the organ builder obtained a copy of it and soon it spread throughout the Tyrol region. It was first sung in the United States in 1839 by a family of Tyrolean singers called the Rainers. It is now sung in all the main languages of the world. Could it be the "perfect Christmas song" of which Joseph Mohr and Franz Gruber spoke?
