

Pastor's Corner - Please read Ephesians 2:10-19 (read verse 14 several times)

Recently, I've been confronted more in my conversations regarding the racial issues going on in our country (by friends who come down on both sides of the issues). For example, I recently went to visit my dad for the first time since March, as he is struggling with neuropathy in his feet. As we watched the news, he said, "I just don't understand why they're protesting like that!" — which led to a long discussion (good, healthy and productive I think) ... Then, recently I read an article from a good friend from college (Daniel Jones) who works with CRU (a Christ-centered campus ministry). He writes in response to actual questions from the students he works with:

- Why don't our white Christian brothers and sisters believe our pain?
- Why is the Church so silent?
- Why is there more support from white people who aren't Christians?

Dan goes on to reference my favorite theologian – Dietrich Bonhoeffer – for something he may not be known as much for: "Bonhoeffer was able to recognize well before his German compatriots the atrocious forms of racism

against Jews. Bonhoeffer's year of study in the U.S. in 1929-30 gave him a front row seat to the systemic atrocities (e.g. Jim Crow laws, lynchings and subsequent postcards) against Black Americans. Through his involvement in Harlem's Abyssinian Baptist Church he got a picture of Jesus as a holy agent of liberation. Instead of the abstract and distant Jesus he discussed in his seminary studies, he encountered Jesus as 'the-God-who-suffers-with.' Regardless of his status as a white theologian, and University of Berlin faculty member, Bonhoeffer took a posture of humility allowing him to listen fully, learn freely, and empathize wholeheartedly with his Black friends and the Black community at large. Upon returning to Germany, he lived out the incarnation of Jesus by being with and fighting for the least of these, German Jews among others, for whom he was martyred."

I know this is an issue that immediately brings forth heated emotions (some may even wonder why I'm talking about it here), but I think it's an opportunity for all of us to be the church ... I think we are called continually to a posture of humility. My prayer is that I would not stop seeking to understand what it feels like to be on either side (whether as a minority that feels victimized, or, for example, police officers who are just trying to do their jobs but feel attacked, disrespected and unsupported). There is a chasm before us, one that is filling up with hate, but hate will never function as a bridge by which to get to the other side. We need the cross of Christ for that. I pray that the Holy Spirit will enable you and me to live life with eyes wide open, looking for ways to live out Jesus's costly grace. ~ Pastor Brian

Near East School of Theology

Some of our members are familiar with NEST — the Near East School of Theology (where Ellen Fisher worked for a time) in Lebanon. We wanted to include some correspondence from them in the wake of the Beirut explosion:

First letter - 8/06/20

"We thank God that no one was injured at NEST as a result of the huge explosion that devastated most of Beirut last night. There were not many people in the building, but those who were escaped unharmed. The damage to the building is extensive. All 8 eight floors above ground and two basements were hit. Glass windows, glass doors, glass panels inside the building, as well as many internal wooden doors were shattered. Never has NEST been hit so badly as yesterday, not even during the worst days of the 15-year war in Lebanon. Of course, we are not the only ones. The devastation in the rest of Beirut is vast.

Our wonderful team of employees and workers are cleaning the glass today, but we have no illusions; the cost of repairing the damage will be enormous. We do not have an estimate yet, but it will be in the thousands of dollars. We appeal for your help.

Second Letter 8/10/2020

"On the first morning after the explosion, our employees and staff started cleaning the debris. The cleaning process has been continuing for three days so far. The impact of the explosion on Lebanon far exceeds damage done to buildings and property. The Beirut Port which was almost totally annihilated by the explosion is the storage place for all the necessary imports that Lebanon needs at this difficult time in its severe economic and pandemic crisis: wheat, medications, medical equipment, foods ... All of these have been severely damaged, if not destroyed, by the explosion, and Beirut Port will not be able to resume its operations in full capacity anytime soon. The Lebanese people, and all who reside in this country, stand to suffer further due to this horrible event. So far, there are 135 confirmed fatalities and 5000 wounded, and many are still missing.



SO....they were looking at having IGNITION at several churches this year as a way to keep the crowds smaller with an "unplugged" version of it focused on worship and prayer for this school year.

Puckety's Session discussed the opportunity and, with consideration of safety precautions, voted unanimously to host the event.

The event will be Sunday, September 20th starting at 6:00 PM.

It is designed for all *middle school and high school students* in the area – both in the Burrell School District and other local areas. It will begin with lively worship in the sanctuary and a special "See You at the Pole" video presentation that encourages the student bodies to be in prayer for their campuses and nation. Afterward there will be a "socially distanced" refreshment time at Faith Hall. It promises to be an exciting and meaningful evening.

- Praying that God blesses the event, moves in the hearts of many to come, and works in the hearts of many more after the event.
- Spread the word to students in your family or those of neighbors and friends, making sure they know

It's a Plan!



the cross is secure and stable. Otherwise it "tips" over.


"Arms of the Cross" – Finally, just as the top and bottom are *vertical* (focusing on our relationship with God), the *horizontal* crossbeam reminds us to reach broader to <u>Improve our Community and World</u>. 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2.Sunday, November 1st


10:00 AM Worship — with focus on Scripture's teaching on spiritual gifts.
